

What is a Life in the Spirit Seminar Series?

The teaching content of a seminar focuses on the fourpart Gospel message of:

- God's loving plan for us and for the whole world,
- our need for His intervention in our lives and in the world.
- the essential roles of Jesus as our Lord and Savior, and the Holy Spirit, and
- our "yes" to the Holy Spirit to empower our conversion into witnesses of Jesus.

The Gospel is presented over the first four weeks of a seminar. After presentations the participants gather into small groups to "break apart" the message and to share in the power and insight promised whenever two or more gather in the name of Jesus.

The fifth week of a seminar is for praying, waiting, and asking for the gift of the Holy Spirit, just as Mary and the disciples did at the command of Jesus after his Ascension. You are my witnesses. And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high. (Luke 24:48-49)



They help participants make the Holy Spirit's gifts and graces part of their lives, their communities, their places in the Church, and their witness to the world. 

This weekend we will gather the group who were baptized and received into full communion with us on Holy Saturday evening. The baptized will now be called neophytes. We will explore the meaning of Mystagogy, the fourth stage in our RCIA process. The main focus today however is to lead them into a deeper understanding of the sacraments they have received.

The Church's vision of the Easter season, expressed in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is that the whole community should grow in faith during this time, together with the elect, now called neophytes, and candidates. The community is called to walk with the neophytes and deepen their own faith in the paschal mystery – the death and resurrection of Jesus – along with the neophytes.

The main setting for Mystagogy is the Sunday Masses of the Easter season. Through the Word, proclaimed and preached, and the Eucharist, celebrated and shared, we come to a better grasp of what new life in Christ is all about. The visible presence of the neophytes in the midst of the assembly (wearing of white robes) and the renewal of their baptismal promises at Easter remind the faithful of the new life of baptism that they themselves possess.

We will share what the Easter Vigil means and their long journey towards it.

Life, Peace, and Restorative Justice

Second Sunday of Easter: John 20:19-29



In these two resurrection appearances to his disciples, the nonviolent Jesus shows us how to live as people of peace, nonviolence, and resurrection from now on.

The first thing the risen Jesus says to his disciples is, "Peace be with you." Then he repeats it to them again as he shows him his wounds, "Peace be with you." That is the gift of the risen Jesus to us – the gift of peace, and it comes with the wounds from our participation in the non-violent struggle for justice.

As his followers, as people of resurrection life, we welcome his peace and rejoice in his risen presence. Despite the devastation of the world's wars and violence, we pledge to work for a new world of peace every day for the rest of our lives – and accept the possibility that we, too, will be wounded from the struggle.

"I send you," the risen Jesus says to us. We go forth to live as he did, to practice nonviolence, to resist injustice, and to proclaim God's kingdom of peace and justice here on earth. From now on, we are his apostles of nonviolence, justice, and peace.

Then, he breathes on them and gives them the Holy Spirit. So we breathe in his Holy Spirit of peace and "conspire" with Jesus in this new life of love. From now on, too, we try to live and breathe in the peace of the risen Christ.

And we return regularly to our breath throughout our day to center ourselves in the present moment of resurrection peace. By living and breathing in his Holy Spirit, we live mindfully in the present moment, and go through life fully alert, peaceful and nonviolent. Jesus commands forgiveness and community.

In the next appearance, he tells Thomas to put his finger in his wounds and believe. Thomas answers, "My Lord and my God!" But what you may not know is that at the end of the first century, the Roman emperor announced that he was to be addressed as "My Lord and my God." If you refused, or called someone else by this phrase, you were to be immediately executed. When Thomas addresses Jesus as "My Lord and my God," he also resists the Roman Empire and can expect immediate martyrdom. By the time of John's Gospel, many thousands of Christians were being killed by the Roman Empire. In this resurrection account, Jesus affirms their faith and encourages them and us to live in the same faith, even to give our lives nonviolently in faith.

Reflection: Do I exhale a Spirit of peace when I speak and in how I act?

Prayer: God of Peace, thank you for the risen Jesus' gift of peace. Give us the grace to live as holy peacemakers. **Action**: Decide whom or what you address as "my Lord and my God," and unpack the political implications of your discipleship to the risen Jesus.




