Epiphany is the 12th day after Christmas, this year it falls on January 6. It celebrates the visit of the three kings or wise men to the Christ Child, signifying a manifestation of Christ, of the Divine, and the extension of salvation to the Gentiles.

Many people have this notion, or maybe it's a hope, that their calling will just come to them one day, as an epiphany, and it'll be clear. We wait for that clarity. When our notions are muddled or vague, we often don't pursue them, assuming the lack of clarity is a sign it's not our true course. If we really wanted to do a certain thing, or were really listening to the Divine within ourselves, the feeling would be strong, right?

Does it make sense to wait for that overpowering clarity?

Probably not. For most people it seems, very little was clear when they began their journey. It had to unravel, slowly, over time. Powerful epiphanies are actually very rare, and some of the most amazing ones didn't bring clarity at all.

O God of light and peace, whose glory, shining in the child of Bethlehem, still draws the nations to yourself: dispel the darkness that shrouds our movement, that we may come to kneel before Christ in true worship, and return from his presence to live as he has taught.

Guide us on this path of salvation, O God, that we may trust in the radiance and power of your Holy Spirit working in the world; that we may rest in the un-clarity and in the journey; that we may be wise instruments, gathering together all peoples and nations in one community.

May you find Christ here... may you bring Christ to the world.



Life, Peace and Justice: Living the Gospel of Joy

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton – A Woman of Firsts

Every saint has a story. Since January 4th is the feast day of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, it seems fitting to spend some time with her story... to remember the awesome power one life can have on the world. Among many firsts attributed to her, Elizabeth is also the first Roman Catholic saint of the calendar year (St. Gregory of Nazianzus (Jan. 2) is from the Byzantine Catholic rite).

Seton is the first native born American to be canonized a saint. She also founded the first community of religious women in the U.S., in addition to starting the first ever Catholic school – which jump started what would become the parochial education system throughout the nation. Seton was born, raised, and married in the Episcopal faith. She was first introduced to the Catholic faith after the death of her husband. Within a couple of years of his death, Elizabeth converted to Catholicism and was received into the church at a time when there was only 1 Catholic bishop in the entire country (Bishop John Carroll).

Elizabeth always had great love for the Eucharist and a heart for the poor, especially for underprivileged children. Like other widows of the day, she sustained an income for her family by starting a small academy for young women. Because the anti-Catholic attitudes of the day, many of her students were withdraw from her academy when parents found out that Seton was Catholic.

Through Bishop Dubourg, she connected with a group of priests called the Sulpician Fathers and eventually moved near to one of their monasteries in Emmitsburg, Maryland. Underwritten by a wealthy patron, she was able to start a free school, dedicated to educating girls in the small but growing community of Catholics. In July of 1810, Elizabeth started a religious community of sisters, called the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, whose mission was focused on caring for and educating poor children. Mother Seton shaped her vision for this religious community around the teachings of St. Vincent de Paul.

Seton died at the age of 46 and is buried at her shrine in Emmitsburg, Maryland. Nearly 10 years after her death, the Sisters of Charity were ministering to poor women and children in places as far away as New Orleans and had established the first hospital west of the Mississippi in a little city called St. Louis!

Pope Francis I declared a Year of Consecrated Life from Nov. 30, 2014 through World Day of Consecrated Life, February 2, 2016. While no institution is ever without struggle, fault, or limitation, perhaps this feast of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton can direct our hearts with gratitude toward those in consecrated life – those who choose each day to live their vows – who have dedicated their lives to prayer, ministry, outreach, education, and the dignity of others. Like Seton, may women and men religious communities remind us of our call to holiness, service – to faith, life, and peace in God's love.


