

Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLW) is an ageappropriate Liturgy of the Word offered for ages 3 - 1st grade at the 5:00pm Mass. No pre-registration is necessary. All children are welcome and encouraged to attend.

Just before the Liturgy of the Word begins for the assembly, the children are invited to come up to the front of church by the presiding priest. Father will then formally dismiss them to go with the weekly leaders from the church to Hall C. During this special time, our leaders will share with the children through prayers, songs and readings that are simplified for children.

The children learn about the same Scripture readings as the rest of the assembly. They are taught a simplified main message of the readings and are encouraged to share that message with their parents after Mass.

We have some wonderful volunteer leaders and would love for a few more to join our team so that the leader would be available to teach every 4-6 weeks; depending your "YES!" We will also have youth volunteers to assist our adult leaders.

This is a great opportunity for adults and middle school/ high school youth to help these eager youngsters learn the Word of the Lord.

Life, Peace, and Restorative Justice "Overcome Indifference and Win Peace

God is not indifferent!

"God cares about mankind! God does not abandon us!" This is how Pope Francis began his New Year's Day address. Throughout scriptures, we hear of God's intervention again and again.

Cain's refusal to acknowledge Abel as his brother became the first rupture in the family relations of fraternity, solidarity and mutual respect. God then intervened to remind man of his responsibility towards his fellows. God's interventions remind us that God sees, hears, knows, comes down and delivers. God does not remain indifferent. He is attentive and he acts. In the same way, in Jesus his Son, God has come down among us. He took flesh and showed his solidarity with humanity in all things but sin. He was concerned not only for men and women, but also for the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, plants and trees, all things great and small. He saw and embraced all of creation. Jesus touched people's lives, he spoke to them, helped them and showed kindness to those in need. Not only this, but He felt strong emotions and he wept (cf. Jn 11:33-44). And He worked to put an end to suffering, sorrow, misery and death. God is not indifferent!

Maintaining our reasons for hope...

"Sadly, war and terrorism, accompanied by kidnapping, ethnic or religious persecution and the misuse of power, marked the past year from start to finish. In many parts of the world, these have become so common as to constitute a real "third world war fought piecemeal". Yet some events of the year now ending inspire me, in looking ahead to the New Year, to encourage everyone not to lose hope in our human ability to conquer evil and to combat resignation and indifference. They demonstrate our capacity to show solidarity and to rise above selfinterest, apathy and indifference in the face of critical situations." "There are many good reasons to believe in mankind's capacity to act together in solidarity and, on the basis of our interconnection and interdependence, to demonstrate concern for the more vulnerable of our brothers and sisters and for the protection of the common good. This attitude of mutual responsibility is rooted in our fundamental vocation to fraternity and a life in common. Personal dignity and interpersonal relationships are what constitute us as human beings whom God willed to create in his own image and likeness. As creatures endowed with inalienable dignity, we are related to all our brothers and sisters, for whom we are responsible and with whom we act in solidarity. Lacking this relationship, we would be less human. We see, then, how indifference represents a menace to the human family. As we approach a new year, I would ask everyone to take stock of this reality, in order to overcome indifference and to win peace." - Message of his Holiness Pope Francis for the celebration of the XLIX World Day of Peace January 1, 2016.


This then is why "it is absolutely essential for the Church and for the credibility of her message that she herself live and testify to mercy.


