

# Amen

Today, with Peter, James and John, we are invited to witness resurrection life. The Transfiguration of Jesus is a coming together of heaven and earth. What we experience in the Eucharist is what the disciples experienced on the mountain; a light which shatters the darkness, the voice of God winding its way through all the chaos and confusion of this world: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." This is the Son of the living God who has taught us about his suffering and death, promised to send His Spirit and asked us to wait until His resurrection on the third day before we proclaim this message of resurrection life.



We gather at Eucharist to proclaim the death and resurrection of the Lord, to claim our victory, in Christ, over sin and death. And it is important that we celebrate often. As we will see in the unfolding of the Gospel, even after this powerful vision of resurrection life, Peter will deny Jesus; James and John will seek the first places in the Kingdom; only John will remain present at the foot of the cross. We, even after witnessing God's glory, still tend to wander. Somehow after we return from the mountain, the valleys take hold of us. The children we held in our arms run away from us; the tender mercies of God which welled up as an ocean of tears are nowhere in sight as we find ourselves in the desert. All the promises we made on the mountain seem to be slipping through our fingertips.

And so, during this Lenten journey the question rises loud and clear in our hearts: "Can we trust what we have seen and heard?" The answer is "YES," "AMEN," we do believe. One thing we can do to bring the vision fully present is to share our stories. When we gather for Eucharist we can bring each other's stories as living witnesses of what it is we celebrate. I am so, so richly blessed by your stories. From the anguish of grief to the joy of the sacrament of marriage to the excitement of children learning about Jesus to one more day of freedom from an addiction to real healing miracles...evidence of Jesus' death and resurrection is all around us. Let us be awake to the vision, let us listen more carefully to the voice from heaven, to the voice within: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him."

### Our Work Is Loving the World: A Lenten Stewardship Reflection

Insightful stewardship expressions can be found in any number of poems we read reflectively. In the poem "Messenger" for instance, the poet Mary Oliver writes: "My work is loving the world."

What does the poet mean by her use of the word "work" in relationship to "loving." How can Christian stewards make prayerful use of this reflection during the season of Lent?

The forty days of Lent provide stewards with a marvelous opportunity to evaluate the nature of our life's "work." Being reminded to take a meaningful and substantive spiritual "pause" in our lives for forty days is a gift in itself. Sometimes, we have good intentions to improve our spiritual lives. But we tend to put it off. The season of Lent begins by reminding us of the brevity of our lives, and then presents us with the immediacy of forty days to focus more intensely on our life in Christ. This is the first step toward embracing Christian stewardship as a way of life.

It's a good number, forty days; good enough to provide structure to help us open our hearts to conversion as we examine just what our "work" in this world should genuinely be about. As we imagine that Jesus must have done in the desert for forty days, we have the opportunity to examine our lives and vocation, as well as our strengths, weaknesses and temptations.

Oliver probably realizes that if most of us are asked what our "work" is, we would reply with a description of how we earn our paycheck or take care of our family. In a sense, this is correct. We all have to support ourselves and provide for our families. Oliver would hardly reject that necessity. But her poem also suggests that,

no matter how we spend our lives, there must be a deeper dimension to our life's purpose; a way of engaging the world with our loving presence. Indeed, there is a Catholic worldview that encourages us to pray for and to act in ways that make a difference in a world that is hungry for Christ's love.

For Christian stewards, bringing Christ's loving presence into our work and our workplace is necessary in order to live in the world as disciples of the Lord. It is key to living the Christian life in our world today.

The very word "work" connotes a certain dedication and commitment, indeed a certain obligation. This rings true in Oliver's simple line. As Christian stewards, we have a fundamental obligation to love and embrace the world as *ambassadors of Christ*. The season of Lent provides us with a singular opportunity to examine how well we're doing and to make an even greater commitment to exercising good stewardship of all the Lord has entrusted to us.

The Rite of Sending and The Rite of Election that was celebrated last Sunday formally brings to an end the catechumenate period, the time that these individuals have spent exploring church teachings and reflecting on the Word of God. The Rite of Election is the time when the Church invites or "elects" the catechumens and candidates to the sacraments of initiation.

"Awesome. Excited. Could feel the Holy Spirit, Honored, Community made me feel so welcome, Such a gift I am receiving, My sponsor is truly supporting me on my journey" were some of the comments expressed after these rites. We now enter into the next period which is Purification and Enlightenment. This is the time of prayer, inner reflection, penance and spiritual renewal. We look within ourselves to determine how we can have a better relationship with God in our lives.

The RCIA tells us that the community "should surround the elect with prayer, so that the entire Church will accompany and lead them to encounter Christ." These next few weeks of preparation will be intense as the Assumption community gets ready to initiate our new members. Next weekend at the 8:00am Mass we will have the first of 3 scrutinies. The scrutinies are meant to uncover, and then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect (non-baptized); to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good.

Prayer cards for the elect are available in the back of church. **Each person** should take a card. There are two types of cards, one for Catechumens (The Elect) who are preparing for Baptism and Candidates who were baptized in other faiths and are preparing for full communion with the Church through the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. Please remember to take one home and keep them in your prayers throughout the season of Lent.

The most important reason for reviving the practice of making the Stations of the Cross is that it is a powerful way to contemplate, and enter into, the mystery of Jesus' gift of himself to us. It takes the reflection on the passion out of our heads, and makes it an imaginative exercise. It can involve our senses, our own experiences and our emotions... to the extent that - we come to experience the love of Jesus for us.

Please join us either at 2:30pm (where indicated with our school children) or 7:00pm in Church.

### Stations of the Cross – Schedule during Lent

**Friday, March 17**, at 2:30pm – Church or 7:00pm our Assumption Youth Group will lead a special way of experiencing the Stations of the Cross called – “Walk the Walk” With these stations, you have an opportunity to experience them in a sense “physically”. You have a choice to either walk through them in the way we describe here or follow along as individuals experience them this way. Either way, these Stations are powerful to witness.

Have the participants remove their shoes outside of the doors. Blindfold the participants.

Drape the garment (bed sheet) over their shoulder.

Keep your hand on the shoulder of the participant at all times. Stand behind them in case they need help with the cross.

Walk in the door and make sure you are all spaced 2 to 3 pews apart.


