Alleluia! He is risen as he said. Our hearts long for this Easter joy. We can trust it. We believe deeply that Christ's resurrection life will be our eternal life. Yet we, too, are afraid. We have many questions: Who will roll the stone away from our broken hearts? Where have they taken the Lord? What does all this mean?

Each person we encounter in the scenes of the empty tomb brings a different energy. Peter and John are racing; John is faster, but then he hesitates; Peter rushes in, but then he hesitates; John leans in, sees and believes, but still does not understand. Mary Magdalene, Mary, the mother of James and Salome enter the empty tomb and are utterly amazed. And what of Mary, the mother of Jesus and our mother? She may have been among the "others who saw Jesus", but we do not meet her again until Pentecost.

These 50 days of Easter are not one extended party. Just as for our Catechumens and newly Confirmed, so, too, for us, these 50 days are an opportunity to understand "that he had to rise from the dead." Each alleluia is a proclamation of the whole mystery. Each singing of praise to God connects ever more deeply with the longing in our hearts to know resurrection life. And even as our faith in the resurrection deepens, we are continually reminded that Jesus is the crucified one who is raised from the dead. Our confidence in resurrection life is connected to the crucified one who also dwells in our hearts.

Mary remains for us the best example of a true disciple. She has experienced more intimately than anyone the life, death and resurrection of her son. In every moment of her journey she stands as witness to the paschal mystery. Her face in Michelangelo's "Pieta" reveals the depths of sorrow and the greatest hope for resurrection life. She looks upon us with the same faith, hope and love as she has for her son, our Christ and Savior. Let us walk these 50 days with Mary, learning more and more each day about her Risen Son.



This is the foundation of the universal destination of the earth’s goods’ (n. 171).

Assumption's Growing Project helps us to look upon the flesh of Jesus embodied in our brothers and sisters in starving parts of Africa, as well as the unjust social structures than lend to perpetual cycles of poverty.

As we were preparing for the dedication of Assumption church in February, 2005, we knew that even as we were building a home for all who would come here to worship, it was important that we find a way to reach out generously to the poor on a global level.

The Growing Project works like this...Catholic Relief Services and Foods Resource Bank identify some of the poorest communities in the world and work with them to decide what would be needed for them to grow their own food. Individuals donate financially to the project and it is then sent to our farming partners. The farmers use this money to purchase seed, fuel, fertilizer, etc. Farmers also donate their land, time, and hard work. They then sell their crops and send the money to CRS/FRB for implementation of a project that we help to choose. We maintain this urban and rural community partnership because after crops are sold, our money has typically quadrupled! And 100% of all the proceeds you donate go directly to the project.

It is important that we give a hand up, not a hand out. It is important that the poor are given education to grow the crops that will flourish on their land, and that it meet the nutritional needs of their communities. We pray this will ultimately lead to a sense of dignity in providing for their families.
