Welcome to Assumption Parish Religious Education! Our program is a comprehensive, grades 1-8 program. Each year builds on knowledge and experience from the previous year; therefore, it is important for students to attend every year until Confirmation. That is the expectation set forth through St. Louis Archdiocese. Confirmation is normally celebrated in the 8th grade.

There is a \$20.00 Sacramental fee for students in grades 2 or 8.


Students must fulfill a two year commitment to PSR prior to receiving sacraments.

The Cry of the Earth

The Cry of the Earth - Intergenerational Justice

Climate change points to the ethical issues involved in intergenerational justice. 'Projects for integral development,' Pope Benedict XVI reminds us, 'cannot ignore coming generations, but need to be marked by solidarity and intergenerational justice, while taking into account a variety of contexts: ecological, juridical, economic, political and cultural' (CV, n. 48).

For Personal Reflection: When you, your parents, or grandparents look into the eyes of your children, grandchildren or great grandchildren, will you – or they – be able to tell them that we have managed the precious resources of the planet in sustainable ways? Is there anything you could do differently now to benefit them later?

Failure to act now could cause immense suffering for future generations. This principle is closely connected to the precautionary principle and the virtue of prudence. We need to take action now to ensure the viability of the earth for future generations. It is 'incumbent upon the competent authorities to make every effort to ensure that the economic and social costs of using up shared environmental resources are recognized with transparency and fully borne by those who incur them, not by other peoples or future generations' (CV, n. 50).

For Personal Prayer: Oh God of All Creation, through Your Goodness, You have Created... and I am grateful. I am grateful for the years that I have had use of the resources of the earth, the air, and the sea; I am grateful for the years that I have had necessities and conveniences; I am grateful for the years that others have made this possible for me. Oh God of All Creation, help me to show restraint in my use of Your beautiful earth, Your refreshing air, and Your bountiful sea, so as to be a good example to all generations that follow me.
