Our Own Fab Four

This Divine Mercy Sunday is Easter Sunday. For eight days we have proclaimed the Resurrection of the Lord and expressed our own longing for resurrection life. The faith and the longing run so deep in us, all the prayers today are uttered just as they were when we first encountered the empty tomb; indeed it is one moment of prayer which is truly eternal. Not even eight days are enough... we will continue for 50 days, then Pentecost will leave us on fire for the Lord forever.

John, Paul, George and Ringo gave us "Eight days a week I love you; eight days a week is not enough to show I care..." I believe our fascination with the Beatles is born out of a similar place as our faith in our own Fab Four: Father, Son, Spirit and Mary. Contemporary culture most often comes up empty, never providing the answers to the longings of our hearts. But we are nonetheless tempted, over and over again, to seek satisfaction in the things which cannot last. The love songs of the Beatles hint at the eternal; eight days in a week speaks of creation, hope and fidelity. But to run with the Beatles' tunes without being grounded in faith is to place our trust in the things of this world without properly gathering them up into the things of heaven. We cannot heal our culture by running away from it. We cannot heal our souls by embracing our culture. We must bring healing to our souls from the Grace of God poured out in Christ Jesus, our Risen Lord. Then we bring healing to our culture through the outpouring of God's Mercy from within us.

Mary is a beautiful witness of God's Grace and Mercy; she is the first to be called "full of Grace." And she stands at the foot of the cross as the first witness to God's Mercy and Resurrection Life. I am so glad the Archbishop has chosen Mary to be our model of God's tender Mercy for this year's Annual Catholic Appeal. Mary shows us how to love Christ with our whole heart, to trust the spirit of the Risen Christ already at work in us and to share Christ with the whole world. As disciples of Mary we can transform our world from a top 40 hit into the New, the Heavenly Jerusalem. Eight days a week are not enough to express our joy in the Risen Christ.

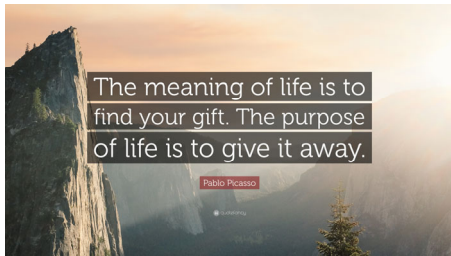

***Becoming Stewards
of the Easter Season***

Christ is risen! Indeed, He is risen. If you're thinking this greeting comes a little late, since

Easter Sunday was April 16, think again. As Catholic Christians, we celebrate the Easter season for seven weeks, until the fires of Pentecost once again inflame our hearts at the beginning of June.

Indeed, how could we not continue to celebrate this event that has changed everything for us?

It's easy to slip into a cultural way of thinking about our great feasts. Many people have the Christmas tree taken down at the end of New Year's Day, rather than waiting for Epiphany. Likewise, most of us have long ago put the Easter decorations away.

But the Christian steward is aware of the beauty and meaning of the seasons in the liturgical calendar.

The Easter season remains a special time for recommitment to the Lord. One word for this period is "mystagogia," and those who were newly baptized at the Great Easter Vigil are especially familiar with this term. It literally means that we delve more deeply into the mystery of our faith. But exploring this mystery is not just an endeavor for new Christians. As we prepare for Pentecost, we prayerfully examine what the Resurrection means in our

For Christian stewards, it's a time to reevaluate how faith in the Risen Lord informs every aspect of our lives – how we labor, how we play, the way we pray, how we allocate our resources, where we spend our time, how we love, how we extend our compassion to others. If Christ is truly risen – an astounding and life-altering belief – then this Easter time brings immense joy and a continuing desire to know the Risen Lord.

The Scripture readings of the season are especially helpful. We hear once again the stories of the appearances of Jesus to his friends; how often they failed, initially, to recognize him in his glory. The Acts of the Apostles tell us of the struggles and the excitement of the new community of believers.

We spent forty days in the penitential season of Lent. Now, we are embarked on fifty days of joyous celebration. Let us experience this joy throughout the Easter season, so that when we celebrate Pentecost on June 4, we may truly find our hearts on fire with the Spirit.

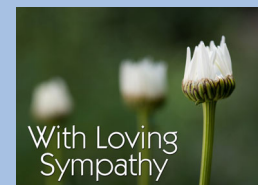

RCIA

This weekend we will gather the group who were baptized and received into full communion with us on Holy Saturday evening. The baptized are now called neophytes. We will explore the meaning of Mystagogy, the fourth stage in our RCIA process. Mystagogia typically stops at Pentecost, truth, mystagogia is a life-long process for a Catholic, our ever growing in the infinitely deep mysteries of life in the Spirit. The main focus today, however, is to lead them into a deeper understanding of the sacraments they have received. The Church's vision of the Easter Season, expressed in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is that the whole community should grow in faith during this time, together with the elect, now called neophytes, and candidates. The community is called to walk with the neophytes and deepen their own faith in the paschal mystery – the death and resurrection of Jesus – along with the neophytes. The main setting for Mystagogy is at the 8:00AM Sunday Masses of the Easter season. Through the Word, proclaimed and preached, and the Eucharist, celebrated and shared, we come to better grasp of what new life in Christ is all about. We will share what the Easter Vigil means and their long journey towards it.

We cannot say enough about our wonderful parish community who supported our group through prayer during Lent. The prayer cards were returned to the individuals on our Palm Sunday retreat. "Awesome" would be the one word we heard so many times during the day. They shared of individuals in our church introducing themselves and wished them well on their journey. A BIG Thank You to all of you... You are truly "AWESOME!!!"
