





Body and Blood of Christ

On this beautiful Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, we celebrate the gift of the Eucharist in our lives. We will conclude our noon mass with a solemn procession in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament to the Shrine of Mary, Queen of Peace. Whenever we celebrate the Eucharist we remember God's desire to be human in the person of Jesus and Jesus desire to be in communion with us through the eating of His body and drinking of His blood. This radical testimony to our faith in Jesus Christ is a bold sign in our world in great need of healing. While we walk from the Church of the Assumption to the Shrine of Mary, Queen of Peace, let us be mindful of the significance of our faith.

We believe in God who desired to be in relationship with us; God who fashioned us in the Divine Image. We believe in God who sent His only son to become like us that we might become like Him. We believe in God whose deepest desire is communion with us. The presence of Christ in the host in the monstrance which is carried in procession is only possible because of the presence of Christ in each one of us who believe. Together we make up the body of Christ which is broken and shared. Together we are the blood of Christ which is poured out for the life of the world. Our solemn procession brings more healing and peace to our troubled world than any other action known to man. This is what it means to bring Christ to the world. *Fr Mitch*

You might remember that this year's theme for Earth Day was, "Let's Get Planting!" One of our Parishioners created his Eagle Scout Project to ensure Assumption would benefit from the planting of trees. Upon hearing that the Missouri Department of Conservation recommended that trees be planted along a piece of our property where erosion was making its mark, this Eagle Scout acquired free trees through Forest ReLeaf of Missouri's Community-tree program (<http://www.moreleaf.org/>). He will now ensure the integrity of the landscape while helping the environment.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Today, we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi! At the 12:00pm Mass, after Communion, immediately after the prayer, a procession – with the consecrated Host placed in the Monstrance – will take place to the “Mary, Queen of Peace Shrine”.

We will begin walking through the front doors of church, pass in front of the chapel, turn right (staying on the sidewalk) on W 3rd street continuing and turning left on Lincoln St. We will then turn right onto Civic Park Dr and continue to the shrine. We will offer a prayer at the shrine and process back to church following the same path. (The procession is less than a mile one way.) When we return to church, we will offer Eucharistic Adoration until 6:00pm.


Matching Gifts

Jubilee Year of Mercy

"There is an aspect of mercy that goes beyond the confines of the Church. It relates us to Judaism and Islam, both of which consider mercy to be one of God's most important attributes. Israel was the first to receive this revelation which continues in history as the source of an inexhaustible richness meant to be shared with all mankind. 
Attention!!! Update Membership Information

Weather Emergency Plan




