Even Jesus wanted a small church community. It began in his home, with his mom and dad, Mary and Joseph, who nurtured him and gave him his foundation, and it didn't stop there. To realize his Father's will, Jesus invited a small group (his apostles) to grow with him as he shared the most intimate feelings of his Love for his Father. On Pentecost, his disciples' need to belong to a small church community was reaffirmed. Together with Mary, they participated in prayers and shared their understanding of Jesus' rising. It was a beautiful, safe place which intensified their connection to God and to each other.

This weekend after every Mass, you will have the opportunity to get connected in this way. A Small Church Community is simply a small group of people who gather regularly to read bits of Scripture, express their faith and grow in friendship. We are here to give you information or even help you get started. It seems too simple to assert that connecting with a few others to share our faith, our fears and our love is life-changing, but that is how Church works. God never meant for us to do this alone; together, we can inspire each other!

Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone."

- 1 Corinthians 12:4-6

By giving each of us different gifts, God made sure that the Church would have the right combination of time, talent and treasure that was needed to do His work. However, if one of us does not utilize our gifts, God's plan goes unfulfilled. Some important work is left undone.

A Note From Fr Mitch . . .

"They were all in one place together...(Acts 2:1)"
The gathering of disciples who were present at Jesus'
Ascension are now witnesses to the descent of the Holy
Spirit at Pentecost. These include Mary, our Mother,
the apostles and some other disciples (Acts 1:14).
From Mary's role at Cana in Galilee, to her standing at
the foot of the Cross, to her presence at the Ascension
and at Pentecost, we know that we are being invited to
follow her

When the Jews say, "how does each of us hear them in his own native language?; what does this mean?; and they have had too much new wine?," I believe Mary was the only one able to provide the answer. It was Mary who received the message of the Angel. Gabriel: "You are full of grace, the Holy Spirit will come upon you (Lk 1:26-38)." It was Mary who proclaimed, "My soul magnifies the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God, my savior (Lk 1:46-47)." At Pentecost Mary witnesses what had been promised to her, she recognizes the gift given to her from the beginning is now being poured out in all of creation. She knows that just as the Holy Spirit enabled the disciples to speak, so too the Holy Spirit enabled all present to hear. All the languages of the world are gathered into the one language of the Holy Spirit which now dwells in each of us and in the community.

Just as Jesus has shown us the path to the Father, so too, Mary has shown us the path to her Son. Our "amen" must echo Mary's "yes" to the Spirit of God dwelling within her. Mary's constant prayer for us is that we come to know her Son dwelling in our hearts; that we summon the confidence and the courage to witness to her Son in the world. The best way we can do this is by first following Mary, by sharing in her mission to bring Christ to the world.

Soon you will see an opportunity to participate in a 33 day long prayer walk with Mary, leading up to our Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary which is celebrated on August 15th. I encourage all of us to walk with Mary, whether for the first time, for the first time in a long time or simply in a deeper way than we have known. Mary, the Mother of Jesus and our Mother, will sustain us in our mission as a parish family. I commend you to Mary and Jesus. God bless you.

Earthquake Devastation in Nepal

Catholic Relief Services (CRS) and Caritas are on the ground responding to the earthquake in Nepal that has left nearly 5,000 dead and thousands more injured. CRS's initial goal is to help 10,000 families with emergency shelter, blankets, water treatment kits, and hygiene kits. Given the scale of the disaster, the number receiving help is expected to rise as our staff and partners are able to better assess the situation, coordinate our response with other agencies and procure additional supplies. CRS has made an initial commitment of \$825,000 to relief efforts in Ne-

pal, a figure that is expected to rise as the needs become clearer.


