



Life Peace and Restorative Justice

What Works? Read the Statistics...

In his own time, rampant with structural violence, Jesus proclaimed a new, nonviolent order rooted in the unconditional love of God. Jesus called his disciples to love their enemy (Mt 5:44), which includes respecting the image of God in all persons; to offer no violent resistance to one who does you evil (Mt 5:39); to become peacemakers; to forgive and repent; and to be abundantly merciful (Mt 5-7). Jesus embodied nonviolence by actively resisting systematic dehumanization, as when he defied the Sabbath laws to heal the man with the withered hand (Mk 3:1-6); when he confronted the powerful at the Temple and purified it (Jn 2:13-22); when he peacefully but determinedly challenged the men accusing a woman of adultery (Jn 8:1-11); when on the night before he died he asked Peter to put down his sword (Mt 26:52).

Neither passive nor weak, Jesus' nonviolence was the power of love in action. In vision and deed, he is the revelation and embodiment of the Non-violent God, a truth especially illuminated in the Cross and Resurrection. He calls us to develop the virtue of nonviolent peacemaking.

Not only is nonviolent resistance over two times more successful than violent revolution, it is also much more likely than armed resistance (10 times or higher) to cultivate a society that can form a durable democracy.



In every age, the Holy Spirit graces the Church with the wisdom to respond to the challenges of its time. In response to what is a global epidemic of violence, which Pope Francis has labeled a "world war in installments", we are being called to pray over, teach and invoke civil resistance, peaceful protest, and other mass non-cooperation. With our communities and organizations, we must continue collaborating with the Holy Spirit and the global Church to advance Gospel nonviolence.

Here are some amazing facts about the prayer teams:


- Prayer teams are parishioners who bring Christ to the world through prayer.


New Policy Regarding Church and Chapel

You may recall when our new church was dedicated in 2005, we made it clear that our church constructed in 1931 would remain a vital part of our parish mission. We now refer to the 1931 church as our chapel. It is indeed important to our mission; a beautiful place to pray, home to our 24 hour prayer room, and site for our adoration of the Eucharist and devotions on Tuesdays. In 2005 we wanted to make it clear that the new church is now the center of our worship life and our beloved chapel is available for prayer and devotions. While this remains true, we have learned over the last eleven years that the chapel is indeed suitable for worship and our new church is also a beautiful place to pray and practice devotions.

Our new policy regarding the use of the church and chapel reflects more opportunities for worship in the chapel (e.g. Christmas and Easter, some weddings and funerals and retreats) and some opportunities for devotional prayer in the new church (e.g. stations of the cross, praying the rosary before 5:00 mass and 8:00 mass and the praying of the rosary on Thursday mornings).

We are indeed blessed to have two beautiful places to pray at Assumption Parish. Spending a few minutes of prayer in the chapel and the church can be a way to connect with our rich history as a vibrant parish, bringing Christ to the world in all that we do. 


