In 1869 a group of lay people were determined to provide quality Catholic Education to their children. Thus the mission of Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish was born. Likewise, it was the Archdiocese of St. Louis' commitment to Catholic Education which contributed to our being known as "The Rome of the West." We have been richly blessed with the presence of many religious communities, the greatest of which has been the Sisters of the Most Precious Blood, who arrived here in O'Fallon soon after our founding as a parish. These religious communities built and led many schools; they staffed most of our parochial schools for over 100 years, they provided the deep root system which has made our Archdiocese strong in faith and excellent in education.

Since his arrival in 2009, Archbishop Robert Carlson has made Catholic education his first priority in his leadership of our local Church. He knows well that Catholic Education, especially Catholic elementary education, remains the strongest indicator of lifelong commitment to the faith. And he understands that our greatest obligation is the faith formation of our children. Nothing is more important than our elementary schools and our parish schools of religion. In order to honor the legacy of the pioneers who established the first schools, including our own St. Rose Philippine Duchesne right here in St. Charles, Archbishop Carlson has asked everyone in the Archdiocese to participate in the Beyond Sunday Campaign for Catholic Education. Next to the establishment of our parish in 1871, this marks the most significant opportunity we have had to make a difference in the life of the Church. Assumption Parish has always been a leader in our community; now we are being asked to lead again.

The primary purpose of the campaign is to provide scholarships for middle class families to assist them in affording Catholic education. This year, as the first proceeds of the campaign are becoming available, families from Assumption will receive \$27,000 in scholarships to attend our elementary school and \$4,000 to attend St. Dominic High School. As the campaign grows it will provide even more assistance for our parishioners to afford Catholic education.

The second purpose of the campaign is to directly assist Assumption Parish in our local mission. 40% of all contributions will go directly to Assumption to assist us with completing our payment for the beautiful school expansion which our students have enjoyed since 2013. We still owe 2 million dollars on our construction loan. We have so much to be proud of here at Assumption. In the last 15 years we have built a new \$11,000,000 church and a new \$5,000,000 school expansion. Your generosity and commitment to our mission are living testimony to our vibrant parish. Now God is inviting us to stretch yet again to make a bold statement in behalf of our children, children throughout the Archdiocese and the needs of future generations. Please prayerfully consider a significant sacrificial gift to our Beyond Sunday Campaign. I commend you and our mission to our mother, Mary. God bless you. *Fr. Mitch*

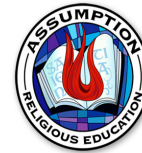
Guided Scripture Silent Repeat

Is Your Marriage Tearing You Apart?

The Challenge of Relationships

Without attention and care, marriages wither. Couples slowly and quietly drift apart or are being torn apart by terrible words and actions.

Retrouvaille is helping couples put the pieces back together and rebuild loving relationships. Retrouvaille, pronounced re-trō-vi', is a French word meaning "rediscovery."

If your marriage is tearing the two of you apart, if there is little or no meaningful communication, if you are considering separation or divorce, we believe Retrouvaille can help you.

All ages of couples come to Retrouvaille from many walks of life and ethnic backgrounds. Some have already separated or divorced, but want to try again.

Retrouvaille Weekend

Retrouvaille begins with a weekend experience in which husbands and wives are helped to re-establish communication and to gain new insights into themselves as individuals and as a couple. This part of the program is presented by three married couples and a priest. The weekend is not a spiritual retreat, not a sensitivity group, nor is it counseling.

You will not be asked to share your problems with anyone else. However you will be encouraged to put the past behind you, to look beyond the hurt and pain, in order to rediscover each other in a new and positive way.

Post Weekend

A follow-up series of presentations, which provide a time and place to work on your relationship, is an important phase of the Retrouvaille healing process. The hurt and the pain of falling out of love cannot be healed in a single weekend experience. A variety of topics will be explored during the follow up presentations.

On the weekend, you will be asked to make a donation. One donation will cover the expenses of lodging, food and materials for both the weekend and post weekend phase. A non-refundable registration fee is required to confirm your reservation, food and lodging.

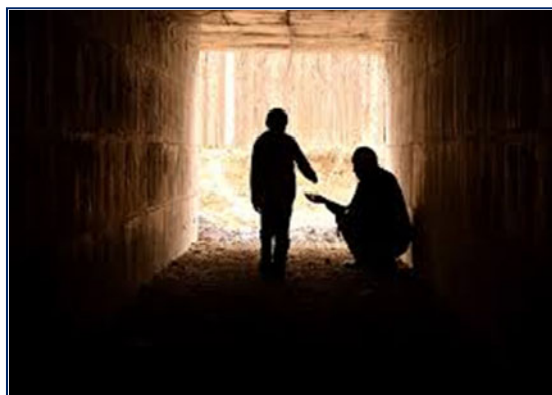
Jubilee Year of Mercy

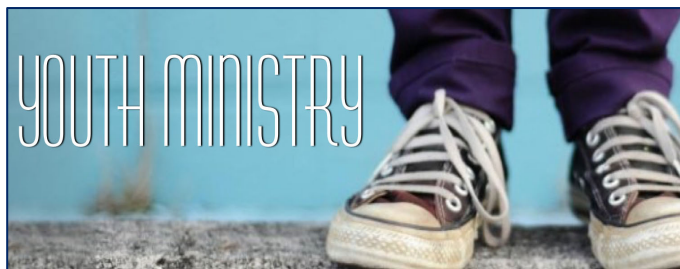

Stewardship as a Way of Life

"As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace." 1 Peter 4:10

Stewardship is the response of each individual's call to discipleship, a lifelong "way of Life," whereby one responds to the mission and ministry of the local and universal Church, sharing the Gospel of the life, death and the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Stewardship recognizes that we, as individuals, are not the owners of our lives, our time, our talent, nor our treasure, but stewards or managers of these God-given gifts. Stewardship is our time, talent and treasure given to God in thanksgiving and with increase for all that he has given us.

Stewardship invites you to prayerfully consider your relationship with Jesus Christ. Do you set aside time to commit to Him alone? Stewardship invites you to prayerfully consider how you are called to share your talents within various ministries of our parish. How do you serve him by serving others? Stewardship invites you to prayerfully consider how you are called to share your treasure in proportion to what you have received. Do you tithe by definition which is "a 10th part of one's income consecrated to God?" In general terms, these guidelines should be followed:

5% to the parish offertory for ongoing expenses;

1% to the Archdiocese;

4% to the charity of your choice

Recycle Right

Recycling Equity is the investment already paid to mine, refine the ores and manufacture containers; that equity is lost in a landfill. **Cans, glass and aluminum have infinite recycle capacity.**



Environmental Facts

Recycling Saves Energy / Resources

Steel/Tin

Recycled cans take 75% less energy to make than cans which are made from raw material (Iron ore).

90% of recycled steel cans are used for food packaging.

Aluminum Cans

Recycled cans require 95% less energy to make than cans that are made from raw material. Bauxite ore comes from mainly Australia, Brazil, Guinea, and Jamaica.

20 recycled cans = 1 new can

Plastics

Recycling one ton of Plastic Containers saves 3.85 barrels of oil.

Single Stream Preparation

Paper, plastic, steel/tin, aluminum, and glass containers can now be placed together

Do not remove labels or lids. A quick rinse is all that is needed to prepare your recycling.



The following cannot be recycled:

- Styro-foam, ceramics, window glass
- Pill containers smaller than 3" in diameter
- #6 Plastics
- Paper products with a plastic coating
- Plastic grocery bags, Baggies, wrap
- Food wrappers (candy, chip, bars, etc.)



Accepted Containers List:

Aluminum Cans, Trays & Foil (Trays and foil must be fairly clean)

Aseptic Packaging & Gable Top Containers (milk and juice cartons)

Steel Cans and Tins (including aerosol cans)

Glass Bottles and Jars (clear, brown, and green)

Plastics:

#1 PET Soda, Water, & Flavored Beverage Bottles

#2 HDPE Milk & Juice Jugs (clear)

#2 HDPE (Detergent & Fabric Softener colored)

#3 PVC Narrow Neck Containers Only

(health & beauty aid products, household cleaners)

#4 LDPE Grocery Containers

(margarine tubs, frozen dessert cups, six and twelve pack rings.)

#5 PP Grocery Containers (yogurt cups and narrow neck syrup and ketchup bottles)

#7 Plastic Narrow Neck Containers Only

Plastic buckets, such as kitty litter buckets (5 gallon maximum size)

Accepted Residential Paper Fiber List:

Newspaper, including inserts (remove plastic sleeves)
 Cardboard, Kraft (brown paper) bags, Pizza boxes,
 Receipts, Message Notes, Instruction Manuals, Magazines, Catalogs, & Telephone Books, Office & Computer Paper, Carbonless Forms, Brochures, File Folders, Notebook, School Papers (no metal clips, spirals, ring binders), Food Boxes, Gift Boxes, Cereal Boxes, Carrier Stock (soda, beer can carrying cases), Mail and Junk Mail with Envelopes, Paperback Books (no hard cover books), Gift wrapping paper, etc, etc, etc.
