

"For if I cause you pain, who can make me happy again but the ones I grieved? I know you all well enough to be convinced that my happiness is yours. That is why I write to you in great sorrow and anguish...to help you realize the great love I have for you. (2Cor 1: 2-4)"

I want to extend to all of you, our faithful parishioners, my deepest apology for the inappropriate article which appeared in the bulletin last week. I imagined the many ways I could have prevented it from happening (living in the past); I spent no small amount of time imagining how people will continue to respond, what effect this may have on our mission (living in the future); and then I made a conscious decision to be fully awake to this present moment. It is only in the present that God's Grace can pour into our hearts, that God's Mercy can flow through us into the world.

Then I set about returning all the phone calls I had received from police officers throughout the region. Without fail, every call was an opportunity to receive God's Mercy from them; men and women who risk their lives for me every day, the same men and women who were needlessly disparaged in the article; these same men and women were still disappointed, but they were kind, even compassionate toward me. Their hearts seek only peace, and I began to experience the peace of Christ in my heart. I also learned more what life is like for them on a daily basis. They humbly invited me to see the vulnerability of their lives and the lives of those they love. I cannot thank them enough for their service, their sacrifice and their forgiveness.

It is disappointing that this divisive article appeared in our bulletin. Our bulletin is a vehicle of communication; at its heart it must remain aligned with our mission to bring Christ to the world. The healing which is most needed in our culture must take place at the level of soul. Rather than contributing to our capacity to heal, this article has served only to separate us one from another. My pledge to you is that this bulletin will indeed be wholly dedicated to that deeper purpose of inviting us more meaningfully into relationship with each other, with our neighbors, with Mary and with God.

Many have asked, "how could this happen?" While there can be no excuse for it happening as it did, I can assure you that protocols are in place to make sure it never happens again. This particular article first appeared on a blog site, "Care2." It was then reprinted with minor edits by a local organization, Metropolitan Congregations United (MCU). This local organization is comprised of many churches throughout the St. Louis area, including Catholic Parishes. I have actually been affiliated with them over the years *(continued on next page)*



as several of the parishes I have served are member congregations. While I deplore the article and did not see it in MCU's publications, this does answer the question how it could ever even be considered for our bulletin.

What is next? One blessing which has already flowed from this experience is a renewed commitment to redesign our bulletin and realign our ministries. During our prayer day in June the Pastoral Team explored again the possibility of aligning our ministries with our Patron Saints, Mary, the Holy Family, St. Vincent de Paul, St. Francis of Assisi and St. Monica. This was also our theme for Leadership Day last September. It makes sense that our bulletin should mirror our worship space; our statues reflect saints whose lives have shown us how we can bring Christ to the world.

I have often preached that our magnificent growth as a parish is not just a growth in numbers; it is also a deepening of faith, a communion which binds us together as a parish family, as children of God, as followers of Mary and as the Body of Christ. As your pastor, I have not taken enough steps to align our practices with our deeper purpose. This has been a wake-up call for me. Assumption Parish is a beautiful, holy people. You all love each other so well; you bring Christ to the world in so many powerful ways. Yet even as we experience an incredibly vibrant and joyful parish, we all know that God has much more in mind for us. We are yet a gathering of embers; the waves of this misplaced bulletin article seemed, for a brief moment, to take our flame away. We have rallied in love for each other; you have shown your great love for your parish. We have also rallied for our men and women who serve to protect us every day; we will continue to pray for them and honor them in more specific ways. And I want us to evermore align our hearts with Mary and to conform our hearts to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Thank you again for your faithful commitment to the mission of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish. I am proud to be your pastor. God bless you. **Fr. Mitch**

Jubilee Year of Mercy

Pope: Mercy is "The Beating Heart of the Gospel"

"Many question in their hearts Why a Jubilee of Mercy today? Simply because the church, in this time of great historical change, is called to offer more evident signs of God's presence and closeness. This is not the time to be distracted; on the contrary, we need to be vigilant and to reawaken in ourselves the capacity to see what is essential. This is a time for the church to rediscover the meaning of the mission entrusted to her by the Lord on the day of Easter To be a sign and an instrument of the Father's mercy (cf. Jn 20:21-23).



For this reason, the Holy Year must keep alive the desire to know how to welcome the numerous signs of the tenderness which God offers to the whole world and, above all, to those who suffer, who are alone and

abandoned, without hope of being pardoned or feeling the Father's love. A Holy Year to experience strongly within ourselves the joy of having been found by Jesus, the Good Shepherd who has come in search of us because we were lost.

A Jubilee to receive the warmth of his love when he bears us upon his shoulders and brings us back to the Father's house. A year in which to be touched by the Lord Jesus and to be transformed by his mercy, so that we may become witnesses to mercy. Here, then, is the reason for the Jubilee: because this is the time for mercy. It is the favorable time to heal wounds, a time not to be weary of meeting all those who are waiting to see and to touch with their hands the signs of the closeness of God, a time to offer everyone the way of forgiveness and reconciliation.

May the Mother of God open our eyes, so that we may

comprehend the task to which we have been called; and may she obtain for us the grace to experience this Jubilee of Mercy as faithful and fruitful witnesses of Christ." *Pope Francis*

The Holy Eucharist is the most precious gift which God has entrusted to His Church. In His great love for us, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ gives us His very Body and Blood to be received under the appearances of ordinary bread and wine at Holy Mass.

Our Lord also invites us to spend time in silent, personal prayer with Him in the ancient practice of Eucharistic adoration. "In the most blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist, the Body and Blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ, and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained. Therefore, to visit the Blessed Sacrament is a proof of gratitude, an expression of love, and a duty of adoration toward Christ our Lord. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1374 & 1418)"

It is the practice of the Church that at least two people should be present whenever the Eucharist is exposed for adoration. Please prayerfully consider whether you may be able to take some time during your week to visit with our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament to "keep watch for but one hour" and offer your personal prayers of praise, thanksgiving and petition. Check any of the boxes below which apply to you and please return the lower half of this sheet to the baskets that will be in the narthex next week. We would like to extend the time during which Eucharistic Adoration is available in our chapel, but first, we would like to hear from you.

What IS Stewardship, exactly...

It is difficult to teach or practice stewardship, unless we have a clear understanding of exactly what stewardship is. If we wish to embrace stewardship, we must gradually learn to embrace every definition or aspect of what stewardship really is.

Scripture Based: All of the teachings of stewardship come directly from the Gospels, the Old Testament and the letters of the New Testament. Stewardship is not a new fad, or environmental word. Stewardship is the way God has expected His people to live since the beginning of time.

Dependence on God: Stewardship is recognizing that everything we have is a gift from God. We can take credit for nothing. Everything we have and everything we do is a result of some gift that God has placed into our hands.

Gratitude: Stewardship is living a life of gratitude taking the time every day to recognize the gifts that God has given and to be grateful for them.

Giving Back: Stewardship is returning a portion of our gifts to God. The gifts we return are our time (Prayer), our talent (Participation) and our treasure (Generosity). We return these gifts not because God or our Church needs them but because we feel an overwhelming need to show our love and gratitude to God.

Transformative: Stewardship is transformative. Once we embrace the stewardship message it changes the way we look at every decision we make. Stewardship becomes a total way of life.

A Love Response: Once we allow God to truly take up residence in our hearts we become so overwhelmed by His abundant love for us that we just naturally feel the need to join our lives with Him and dedicate our time, talent and treasure to carrying out God's work here on earth. Our generosity comes from within and not from any external pressure or reward.

Proportionate Giving: Stewardship calls us to realize that each of us is called to give as God has given to us. We no longer base our giving on what others are giving. We no longer excuse ourselves from giving because we do not see others giving. Rather we give in proportion to all that God has given to us. **Prayer:** Spending Time with God: Stewardship involves spending time with God. Recognizing that every day is a gift from God, we strive to spend some of each day with God, through prayer, Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, scripture reading, quiet, meditation and other spiritual activities. During this time we ask God how He wants us to use the gifts He has given to us.

Participation: Sharing Talent: Stewardship involves sharing talent. Recognizing that God has given each individual unique skills and talents so that together we can do the work of Our Lord, we strive to share our own talents and to encourage and welcome others to also use their talents to participate in the mission and ministry of the Church.

Generosity: Giving Treasure: Stewardship involves giving treasure. Giving time and talent does not excuse us from giving treasure. Throughout the Gospels, Jesus challenged us to give as it has been given to us. Aware of our tremendous financial blessings, we strive to give generously to support the building up of God's kingdom. We recognize the 10% tithe as an important sacrificial goal. Although this level of giving may not be immediately possible, we are aware of what percentage we are giving back. We regularly strive to increase our generosity, taking small incremental steps toward giving a full tithe.

Trust in God: Stewardship is trusting God. We believe that our generous God will always provide for us. None of us will ever have all that we want, but we will always have all that we need.

Accountability: Stewardship calls us to recognize that just as in the Parable of the Talents, each of us will someday be asked by God to give an accounting of all that we have done with the gifts that have been given to us. Likewise, parish communities that embrace stewardship must be accountable to the community for the way in which the parish uses the gifts entrusted to it.

Thankfulness: Stewardship calls us to be ever grateful for the gifts that God has given. Not only are we called to be grateful to God, but we also must be grateful to one another. Just as we thank God every day, a stewardship parish must also show gratitude, recognition and appreciation to those who have given generously to the support of the parish.

Counter-Cultural: Stewardship is counter-cultural. While society encourages us to continually strive for more and more, stewardship helps us to recognize that we already have more than enough. In fact, we have enough to share. Discipleship: Stewardship is discipleship. We strive to put God first in all things and to follow where Our Lord might lead.

All participants will receive a dri-fit shirt, food, beverages, and beer after the race, plus your runner bag with goodies. **Sign up early and save!** Sign up at:


