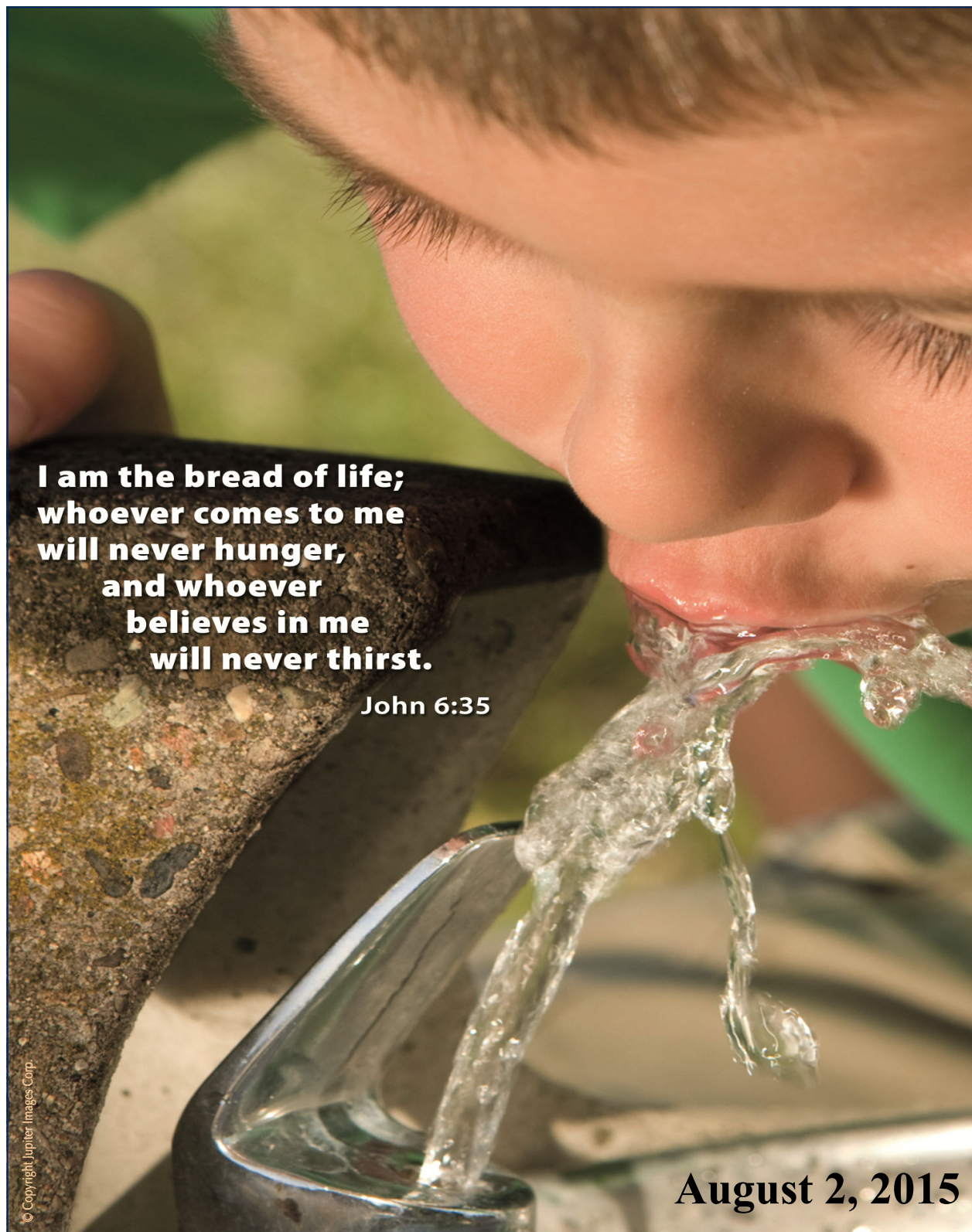

Assumption's Growing Project

In the gospel story today, the people search for Jesus and finally find him on the other side of the lake. Jesus points out their desire for food and calls them to something more than just free food. God desires to satisfy our need for essential things like food, but also desires to give us “a bread that gives life to the world.” God wants to empower people. God wants people to create a world where all people have enough to eat and all share their food with others in dignity and respect. God calls us to act as if our world is a “common home.” God wants us to be a communion or community. Creating a world of justice and of healthy social structures and relationships is essential to Catholic Social Teaching. Pope Francis toward the end of his recent encyclical, *Laudato Si* 240, wrote,

... the world, created according to the divine model, is a web of relationships. ... The human person grows more, matures more and is sanctified more to the extent that he or she enters into relationships, going out from themselves to live in communion with God, with others and with all creatures. ... Everything is interconnected, and this invites us to develop a spirituality of that global solidarity which flows from the mystery of the Trinity.

Assumption's Growing Project has been embraced by this community as a way that we can affect these social structures from a place so very far away from such devastation. Thank you.

Q: What are *a few* practices that make FRB and its Growing Projects unique?

- ✓ FRB is focused on asking questions... How can we support you? What are your needs? What can we do to help you be more successful with food security? How can we strengthen our relationship with you, each other, and with God?
- ✓ FRB is grass roots... linking communities in the US (rural and urban) with communities overseas. Then they create avenues by which farmers learn from farmers.
- ✓ Since 70% of the world's hungry are farmers, FRB looks at the mechanisms or causes of those who are hungry and meets them where they are... then seeks to collaborate in finding solutions.
- ✓ FRB creates direct connections on the donation side of the equation... the money donated by Growing Projects is used where they request it be used.
- ✓ FRB creates programs where those who are food insecure become independent through their own hard work and desire to learn.
- ✓ Program adjustments can be made quickly as the need arises and circumstances change.
- ✓ FRB is not shy about talking about God and interfaith dialogue.

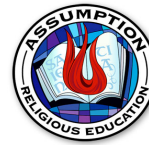

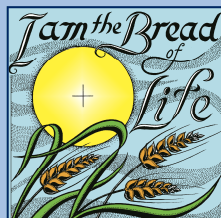

Important Announcement from Father Mark

All Parishes in our Archdiocese are presently undergoing a Pastoral Planning Process to determine the future staffing of priests and how this may look in serving the needs of the Faithful. The role of the laity is vitally important, as well as the role of Permanent Deacons, taking on administrative responsibilities once reserved for Pastors only, to oversee the temporalities of the day to day running of a parish.

Archbishop Carlson has asked me to be Part-time Senior Associate Pastor of St. Robert Bellarmine Parish in St. Charles AND Part-time Senior Associate Pastor of Assumption Parish, O'Fallon, with residence continuing at Assumption. Deacon John Schiffer, serving at St. Peter Parish in St. Charles, has been appointed Parish Life Coordinator of St. Robert Bellarmine Parish. Father Pat Ryan, Pastor of St. Robert's is retiring.

A Parish Life Coordinator has the responsibility of administering and overseeing the temporalities of a designated parish, as well as participating in and giving pastoral direction to the spiritual and sacramental life of the parish. My role as Senior Associate Pastor in both parishes is to fulfill my obligation to the sacramental and pastoral needs of the faithful, with emphasis being placed on St. Robert's. **THIS ASSIGNMENT BEGINS AUGUST 17TH.**

THIS IS ONE OF THE FIRST ASSIGNMENTS OF ITS KIND EVER INITIATED BY THE ARCHDIOCESE.

This assignment is to be implemented for one year and it is up to Deacon John and myself to basically "write the book" for future assignments in our Archdiocese. I am honored and excited being asked to engage in "cutting edge" pastoral ministry that will become a viable and mainstream component to staffing parishes.

What this means is that I will be responsible for the scheduling of all weekday and weekend Masses and Holy Days at St. Robert's, as well as Confessions, Anointing of the Sick, Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals, etc. with Deacon John and myself working as a team. Deacon John is the Administrator and I am supporting and assisting him.

My obligation to Assumption Parish will change in that I will celebrate two weekday Masses and one weekend Mass. My prime responsibility here will be to our young people in the school, PSR and Youth Group, through teaching and formation in the faith.

My goal is to be working Tuesdays and Thursdays at St. Robert's and Wednesdays and Fridays at Assumption. I will celebrate the 8:00am Mass at St. Robert's Tuesday-Thursday and two weekend Masses there as well.

I am excited about this new assignment and I ask for your prayers and support as I serve both parishes, asking God to lead me and guide me in the way that best serves his people.

**Life, Peace, Justice****Interfaith Dialogue**

"To dialogue does not mean giving up one's own identity, but rather to be open to understand the reasons of the other, capable of respectful human relations, convinced that the encounter with someone who is different from us can be an occasion of growth in fraternity, of enrichment and of witness. It is for this reason that interreligious dialogue and evangelization do not exclude one another, but nourish one another mutually."

Pope Francis, "Evangelii Gaudium"

Pope Francis has made many efforts to continue a legacy of interfaith dialogue spanning the past half century. Francis' efforts reflect the spirit of "Nostra Aetate," the Second Vatican Council's declaration on the relation of the church with non-Christian religions. "Nostra Aetate" begins by describing the unity of the origin of all people as made in the image and likeness of God. As they all return to God, their final goal is also unified. The declaration acknowledges the positive aspects of Hinduism, Islam and Buddhism, and the Jewish tradition. In addition, the Pope urges us to continue to seek mutual understanding, respect and collaboration between Catholics, and the followers of others religious traditions. It encourages the study of religions and promotes the formation of persons dedicated to dialogue between the Catholic Church and other bodies of faith.

Compassionate Lord, who created all members of the human family with equal dignity, we pray that we may recognize you in our sisters and brothers who profess a diversity of faiths. 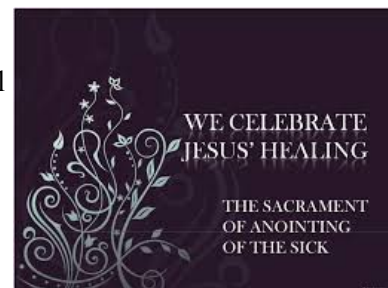
Anointing of the Sick

We will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at all the Masses on the weekend of August 8/9.

"Is any among you suffering? He should pray. Is anyone in good spirits? He should sing praise. Is any among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven." James 5:13-15

Through the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, Christ strengthens those who are afflicted by illness, whether in body, soul or spirit, providing them with the strongest means of support. Jesus showed great concern for the bodily and spiritual welfare of the sick and commanded his followers to do the same. God did not promise that we would be cured of our illnesses, but God always provides a healing and forgiveness of sins. The celebration of this sacrament also provides an opportunity for the deepening of faith in the community – through the faith witnessed and devotion of those being anointed.

Symbols of this sacrament include the laying on of hands and the anointing with oil to the forehead and palms of both hands. The laying on of hands symbolizes the Spirit of God being called down – the very presence of the Lord putting his hands on our head. The oil is a sign that God 'has put his seal upon us and given the Spirit in our hearts'. Through the anointing, we are strengthened for what lies ahead.

Our campus wide single stream recycling has been operating several months and is going well. Most questions coming in to the parish office are about newspaper recycling. What happened to the green and yellow newspaper bins? Is it ok to put newspaper in the new green recycling bin?

For many years Assumption received a modest payment per ton for old newspapers, but due to a drop in the price of recycled paper products, those payments stopped. There is no longer any benefit for the parish to have separate receptacles just for paper. As we introduced single stream recycling we also decided to simplify the process and have only one recycling dumpster. Yes, you can put newspapers in our green recycling dumpster. Since we are no longer receiving payment for newspapers, feel free to put them in any recycling container that is closer to your house. Thank you for your interest in recycling.
