



On Human Work


One of the first things St. Pope John Paul II did during his papacy is publish the encyclical "Laborem Exercens". On the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross and the eve of the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, September 14, 1981, Pope John Paul II invited us to see more deeply into the dignity of the human person and the importance of meaningful work, revealed on the cross of Christ. He says,

The Church considers it her task always to call attention to the dignity and rights of those who work, to condemn situations in which that dignity and those rights are violated, and to help...ensure authentic progress by man and society.

We have set aside this special holiday to honor the rights of all peoples to meaningful work. Much of our energy, and rightly so, is given to the concept of a just wage. This is likely the beginning of our efforts to respect the dignity of every human person and each one's capacity to contribute to the development of our work on earth to bring heaven fully present. In this country we are blessed to have been forged from a truly blessed vision of our founders to create a nation which is more "for the people and by the people" than any other nation on earth. We are in a privileged place to continue this creation of the world until all God's children experience the freedom and access to meaningful work which is inherent in the human person.

Especially in John's Gospel we witness Jesus' clear knowledge of his work on earth: to carry the cross and to surrender his life freely so that God's glory may be revealed. As we search for meaningful work for ourselves and all people it is important for us to follow Jesus' example of surrendering love. Work is really, honestly-in no way, measured by money. The terms "value" and "price" have sometimes gotten mixed up in our culture. For example, there is no more valuable work than raising children, teaching children and sitting at the bedside of the dying; or finding homes for the homeless children, counseling young pregnant women and mentoring troubled youth. And yet we pay nothing for these most valuable services. The people who do all that work do it because God has revealed His glory through them in that work. Our true purpose is to reveal God's glory by becoming the holy people that God has called us to be. Whatever work we seek must be tied to this larger purpose. Let us love one another well in our journey together, seeking meaningful work for all God's children and revealing God's glory every step of the journey.

It is like we heard in the Gospel today:


"He ordered them not to tell anyone. But the more he ordered them not to, the more they proclaimed it."


Raffle Tickets

Life, Peace, Justice

Over the next several weeks, we will together attempt to break open Pope Francis' ENCYCLICAL: LAUDA-

TO SI' ON CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME. As described by the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops in a Hill Briefing on June 19, we will begin with it's Wide Ranging Vision, move through our Integral Ecology, the Challenges for Everyone, and finish with a Time to Act.

Wide Ranging Vision:

An encyclical is a teaching letter. This letter is addressed to “every person living on the planet.” It aims “to enter into dialogue with all people about our common home” (3).

The Pope is speaking as a moral and spiritual guide, not as a scientist or a politician.

* “On many concrete questions, the Church has no reason to offer a definitive opinion; she knows that honest debate must be encouraged among experts, while respecting divergent views. But we need only take a frank look at the facts to see that our common home is falling into serious disrepair” (61).

* “Our immense technological development has not been accompanied by a development in human responsibility, values and conscience” (105).

The encyclical is not primarily about public policy. It calls all persons to conversion : . “There can be no renewal of our relationship with nature without a renewal of humanity itself” (118).

Reflect: Where do you see disrepair in our common home? How does that affect the unborn, the poor, those in third world countries?

Action: Reuse something you would normally throw away.

National Collection for the Catholic University of America




