

Eucharist

Heaven meets Earth every time we gather for Eucharist, indeed whenever we breathe with an awareness of God's Spirit alive in all of creation. The Eucharist is the highpoint of our life together in Christ and the truth of the Eucharist remains in us and all around us wherever we go. This is why it makes perfect sense to spend "time" in the presence of the Lord fully present in the Eucharist. That investment of time yields a harvest of eternity. We actually surrender our time bound experience to the truth of our eternal life in Christ. Whether we use words like, "the light went on", "the weight was lifted", "my heart opened to life again", or "hope returned..." we are participating in the promise of eternal life right here, right now.

This glimpse of glory we receive when God's grace enters our lives, in the Eucharist or in a moment of outpouring love from us or to us, lifts us up. It also challenges us. In today's Gospel, Jesus is challenging us to trust the eternal, the divine life which is ours in Christ Jesus. He says, "You cannot serve both God and mammon." We cannot serve God and money. We cannot be slaves to wealth, to possessions, to power, to the things which are only of this world.

If we trust God's power to save; if we trust God's love which is revealed to us in our love for one another; if we recognize these glimpses of glory as true revelations of Christ; then we know that all the things of this world are from God. All the things of this world belong to God. All the things of this world are returning to God. That is what it means to be sacred. All of creation is sacred. The things of this world become profane only when we take them, only when we use them for ourselves and not for God, only when we act as though we own them. We can make all things holy simply by surrendering them to God who owns our life breath already.

Practically, what this means in the spiritual life is that we have to surrender something of ourselves every day until we have nothing. Then we will have only Christ and we will be given all these things besides.

Mary is the first and best example for us. She emptied herself completely and was full of Grace. Now she reigns as Queen of Heaven and Earth. Let's follow her in her mission to bring Christ to the world.

Assumption's Growing Project

For those of you who do not know much about Assumption's Growing Project, this is a brief summary:

The Growing Project is a Christian response to chronic global hunger. Assumption Parish raises money and donates it to farmers in Kansas. The farmers use the money to purchase what they need to plant various crops. When these crops are sold, our investment is usually quadrupled. The money is then used by Foods Resource Bank, Catholic Relief Services and other ecumenical organizations, for a project that will help starving people world-wide learn to grow their own nutritious food with enough to feed themselves and enough to share with other vulnerable individuals or to sell to provide funds to buy needed items, such as basic medicines, staples and to send their children to school.

The weekend of October 1-2 we will be handing out corn bags and there will be a display downstairs with much information about the Growing Project over the years. Throughout October we ask that you return the corn bags with a donation to help hungry people help themselves. You can also donate online.



We will meet this week on Thursday September 22 at 7:00pm. The school has asked for our help. We will be building 5 human-size Jenga games for the school children to use at recess. We will have all the supplies, we just need your manpower. We will provide snacks and drinks. Should be a lot of fun. We'll gather on the Assumption parking lot by the Sofia House. Hope to see you then.

Flood Relief

In response to the recent historic flooding, which has affected Louisiana, in union with the USCCB a special collection will be taken up in all parishes in the Archdiocese of St Louis this weekend. These funds will be used to assist flood victims now in the wake of the worst flooding since Hurricane Katrina. As many as 60,000 homes have been damaged and nearly 20,000 people have been rescued from the flood waters. More than 106, 000 individuals and families have sought federal disaster aid.

The funds collected will be used to support the efforts of Catholic Charities as they respond to immediate emergency needs. Checks should be made out to Assumption Parish with Flood Relief in the memo line. Cash donations can be put in an envelope with your name or envelope number on the outside.


