In addition to prayers and a liturgical calendar, you have access to the Mass readings for every day of the year. They are recorded, so you can choose to read them or listen to them. Anyone can enrich their lives just by reading the Scriptures. You don't have to be a theologian or scholar -- no previous experience is necessary. When you begin to read God's Word, the Holy Spirit moves and your heart begins to open to all that God has to say. Soon, you will develop a thirst. Give it a try!

Our farm partners in Kansas sent a note telling us about a trip some of them took to Kenya. . .

Our family wanted to send the supporters of the FEB WEA Growing Project a short note to let you know your funds are being used in amazing ways. We had the opportunity to join FRB on a learning visit to Kenya this summer. During the visit we interacted with Kenyan farmers who have benefited from the programs that FRB supports. The programs ranged from water management, dairy cooperative start-ups, conservation tillage education and tree seedling nursery.

Going into the trip we had no idea how much we would have in common with these farmers. But a farmer shares the same joys (family, good yields) and fears (drought, low prices) no matter what side of the world they live on! They were the most hospitable and gracious people we have ever met.

On behalf of the Kenyan's we visited, thank you for your support. The old Chinese Proverb, "Give a man a fish and you feed him for a day. Teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime." could truly be used to describe the programs that FRB supports. These farmers are gaining knowledge that will help ensure their food security for years to come!

God Showers His Mercy on Us

December 8, 2015 marked the start of the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy, as declared by Pope Francis. This past year has been a historic one for our Church, but even more importantly, it has been a calling to each of us for deeper and further conversion. “Mercy,” as Pope Francis defines it, is “the bridge that connects God and man, opening our hearts to the hope of being loved forever despite our sinfulness.” Each and every one of us is in need of God’s mercy. He forgives us despite our failures and selfishness, and we are called to show that same mercy to those we encounter in our daily lives. Although this Year of Mercy is coming to a close, our mission to live it out never ends.

A life of stewardship can only flow from the awareness that God is love and that His love is merciful. We, as sinners, do not deserve any of the gifts He has given us, but, “God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ” (Ephesians 2:4).
