Everything we are and everything we have belongs to God. We aren't "owners" of anything, we are merely "stewards" of the gifts God has given each of us. All God is asking is that we give back a portion of what He gave us. This is the essence of Stewardship. God should be our first priority in everything. All else comes second.

Respect Life Month – Self Care

We hear in our gospel this weekend: “Give to God what belongs to God.” **Respect Life Month** is an opportunity to reflect on that one line, to slow down and consider all that belongs to God: the life of all that is living, the lives of those waiting to be born, the beauty and bounty of creation, our labor, our recreation, our relationships, our solitude, our death, our resurrection... all these belong to God and have been given to us as gift. They have been entrusted to us through a covenant of ineffable love. Perhaps the Psalmist who wrote the lyrics for psalm 116 was contemplating this when writing “How can I make a return to the Lord?” How do we give to God what belongs to God?

Throughout the Bible (Psalms, Hebrews, Hosea, Matthew, etc.) it is made clear that God does not desire or ask for burnt offerings, self-desecration, or empty gestures. Instead, God desires our mercy, our humility, our gentleness, our love, our sacrifices made in faith. We give to God when we forgive others, and when we allow ourselves to be forgiven. We give to God when we reach out to the world through our support of projects like the St. Vincent de Paul Society, the Growing Project, the Fair Trade market. We give to God when we stand in the cold and the rain, amid jeers and anger, as we promote the life and sacred dignity of the unborn and their parents. We give to God when we teach our children to love and pray for others, even those who wish us harm. We give to God when we pause in thanksgiving to love our own lives and the life of the creation pulsing around us.

Giving back to God will be a tremendous challenge if we do not care for ourselves. In recent months, our eyes, ears, and hearts have been inundated with stories of misery and terror: the growing scourge of Ebola, atrocities in the Holy Land and at the hands of groups like ISIS, more than 200 school girls still missing in Nigeria since April, monsoons in India, devastating droughts in California, violence in streets of our own metro community, etc. While trying to do the daily, holy work of remaining faithful to a job and/or vocation, keeping up with bills and the laundry, tending to children, maintaining the lawn, nurturing relationships, and on and on and on – it is easy to lose oneself. While giving to God what is God’s may require a self-emptying, it does not require us to be self-nullifying or self-destructive.

Self-Care is an essential component to respecting life around us. What we put into our bodies, how we care for and nourish our bodies, how we balance our work with rest, what we do for recreation, how we pray... all of these are a part of our self-care. Coming out of our Stewardship renewal, we reflected on tithing 10% of our income as an investment in the life of this community. Our time is an equally valuable asset (perhaps more so). When we receive a 24-hour day, how often do we tithe 10%... 2.4 hours daily... for prayer, for the work of centering and grounding ourselves? Have we ever made going on an annual retreat a priority? Are we getting enough movement in our day? How much of our precious life is handed over to computer screen, TV screens, phone screens? Much like looking into the eyes of someone we love, we give to God when we look into God – really see the faces of those around us, really see creation, really see our own reflection in a mirror – really see all these things of God and love them... love them for their beauty, as well as their imperfections.

We will free ourselves to respect life when we learn to respect the life we have been given. The Fall Festival is a wonderful opportunity for us to step out and enjoy life with others. Consider giving yourself that gift this weekend. Let’s support each other in caring for ourselves and reawakening to the life around us and within us... respecting the life of God flowing through us and all creation.

Prayer throughout October: God of LIFE, mold us, fashion us into Your image and help us to see Your likeness in all LIFE around us, that we may reverence life in all its forms—at every stage of its existence. Amen.



RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

For several weeks the RCIA team and our sponsors have been meeting with inquirers into the Catholic faith. We have talked about "Who is God?", "Where do you find God?", and "What brought you to Assumption?" Our inquirers have shared their stories, and all have said they want to know more about the Catholic faith and want to build a closer relationship with Jesus Christ.

Next Sunday at all of our masses, we will celebrate a combined Rite of Welcome and Acceptance. For those who have not been baptized, they are being Accepted into the order of Catechumens and will no longer be inquirers, but Catechumens. (The word "catechumen" means, "one who is being taught". In the early Church, catechumens were those who had not been initiated into the sacred mysteries, but were undergoing a course of preparation.)

For those who have already been baptized in another faith tradition, they will be Welcomed to our faith community and will no longer be inquirers, but Candidates. This combined Rite marks the end of the Period of Inquiry and the beginning of the Period of the Catechumenate.

As part of the Rite of Welcome and Acceptance next Sunday, our faith community of Assumption will be asked if we are ready to accept these Candidates and Catechumens into our midst and aid them along their way by our example and encouragement. Please answer with a loud, "We are!" and continue to pray for and welcome these newest members of our faith community as they continue their journey.



Assumption St. Vincent DePaul Christmas Sponsorship Program
