## Say Yes To God's Call

Malachi teaches us today, "But for you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays (3:20)." Malachi is voicing God's frustration with his chosen people. The community has continually withdrawn from God's love and mercy, choosing instead to make their own way in the world. God pleads with us, "Return to me, that I may return to you (3:7)...bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house; put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts, and see if I do not open the flood gates of heaven for you and pour down upon you blessing without measure (3:10)."

We are encouraged to fear God's name and to trust in an abundance of God's blessings which will make us witnesses to eternal life. God's deep desire to bless us cannot be satisfied until our hearts are open to receive it; our hearts cannot be open to receive God's blessings until we let go of everything else. So long as we hedge our bets we will remain only on the edge, glimpsing God's glory while clinging to this world. The tithe is a concrete way to step out in faith. The tithe of 10% of our household income represents everything to which we are tempted to cling. If I have surrendered my will and my life to God, then 10% of all my possessions is nothing compared to the grace of God poured out into my heart through Christ Jesus, our Lord.

I want to make a pledge to you: **If you give 10% of your household income to the Lord in the form of a 5% tithe to Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish and a 5% tithe to other charities, I promise God will bless you. Try this for one month at a time; if at any time you believe God's blessings have not flooded your house, then I will return every penny of your Sunday offering to you.**

God has called our parish community to eternal life, to full participation in the death and resurrection of Christ. Let us join Mary in her full and unconditional "yes" to God's call. Once we step out of our comfort zone, we will fall into God's loving embrace and become full of grace.

## Thanksgiving 2016 - Let's Celebrate Thanksgiving Day

Join us on Thursday, November 24, and we will once again have a special Eucharistic celebration at 9:00am. It is special in several ways. First let this day be a reminder that "Eucharist" means "thanksgiving". It seems then that taking part in the Eucharist on Thanksgiving Day is a most appropriate way of celebrating this holiday. We hope that you will join us.

Secondly, you are invited to bring gifts for the poor. These can be money or the usual items you bring for the St. Vincent de Paul Society. On this day DO NOT leave them at the St. Vincent de Paul Society Depository but bring them to your pews with you. At the time of the Presentation of the Gifts, instead of the ushers/greeters passing the baskets, you will be asked to bring your own gifts forward into the sanctuary so they might serve as a sign for us to see. The ushers/greeters will be there to assist you.

Finally, you are invited to also bring something that you will be using at your own Thanksgiving Dinner or taking to someone else's. Let it be anything, cooked or uncooked, that you are able to handle easily. Again bring this to your pew with you. At some point in the Eucharist, you will be asked to hold up these items to be blessed. After Mass take them home with you to be used for your meal. The idea behind this is to help make a connection between the Lord's Table and your own feasting table. In this way you are bringing God's blessing to your own table and might even use this item to focus your meal prayer that day. We do hope that you will join us as one family at the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish to give Thanks to God for all that He has done for us!

Please Note: There will not be a 6:30am Mass on Thanksgiving Day.



**Build My Church - God Showers His Mercy on Us  
Renewal 2016**

If someone gave you the most magnificent gift you have ever received, what would your reaction be? Most people would give a hug, write a thank you note, or at least say, "Thank you!" If this is our reaction to a material gift, how much more should we rejoice over the gifts God has given us?

"Then the LORD God formed the man out of the dust of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being" (Genesis 2:7). One might argue that the second greatest gift that God gave man — second only to the gift of His Son — is the gift of life. There was no need for God to create man on the sixth day, but out of pure love, God created a being in His image. And even when we fall and choose to turn away from Him, God continues to invite us back into union with Him through the sacraments, specifically that of Reconciliation, through which our soul is wiped clean and we are given the grace to start anew.

"In order to be capable of mercy, therefore, we must first of all dispose ourselves to listen to the Word of God. This means rediscovering the value of silence in order to meditate on the Word that comes to us. In this way, it will be possible to contemplate God's mercy and adopt it as our lifestyle." — Pope Francis



As a Christian people, we should put the needs of others before the needs of our own, recognizing that if we are to love as Christ loves, our actions should be full of humility and service.

Throughout the history of the Church, countless Saints gave their all for Christ — many of them willingly handed over their lives because of their love for Jesus. While God continues to call some of the faithful to martyrdom, He calls all of us to give back in thankful response to the gifts we have been given. As this Jubilee Year comes to a close, prayerfully discern how God is asking you to give to Him through our parish offertory. Our parish asks each family to tithe - giving 10% of our household income to our church, the archdiocese and to other charities. Our parish breaks down the scriptural tithe into 5% to Assumption, 1% to the archdiocese, and 4% to other charities. Ask God where He wants your financial giving to be and take a step increasing your giving by 1% or 2% this year.
