

Life, Peace and Justice: Living the Gospel of Joy

¡Presente! –Remembering 25 years since the U.C.A. Martyrs

November 16, 1989, at the University of Central America (UCA): Six Jesuit priests, their housekeeper, and her daughter were brutally murdered by 19 members of a death squad in El Salvador. During this period in history, political corruption and division in Latin America were volatile, complicated, and rampant. Volumes have been written about the numerous large-scale massacres, countless individuals being kidnapped and "disappeared", excessive use of torture, and other atrocities that took place throughout Central America at the hands of these death squads.

These squads were sent out by powerful government leaders, and most often targeted priests and religious, teachers, scholars, students, union organizers, and those who worked to promote the rights of the poor. Many of these death squads, including the 19 members who committed the November 16 assassinations, were trained in the United States at the Western Hemisphere Institute for Security Cooperation-WHINSEC (formerly the School of the Americas) in Fort Benning, GA.

There's a tradition in Latin American movements for peace and justice of invoking the memory of those who have lost their lives in the struggle. When the name of the deceased is said aloud, those gathered respond ":Presente!". This literally means "here" or "present" in Spanish. When it is used at gatherings for peace, **Presente!** is a way of saying that those who have died for the struggle of justice are here with us, are not forgotten, and that we continue the struggle in their name. It is not unlike the Amen we proclaim when we receive Christ in the Eucharist – Amen; Yes; Presente! Christ is truly present in our struggle to bring forth God's reign of Love. Jesus' radical commitment to nonviolence and unconditional love set a lofty goal for followers. As Christians, as much as we have a spiritual responsibility to learn

how to love God with all our mind-soul-heart-strength and our neighbor as ourselves, we are also responsible for teaching love. The 8 names listed above are just a tear drop in the sea of names of those who have been martyred because of their beliefs, who have lost their lives to violence. It seems that we daily hear news of an ISIS execution, or a humanitarian worker gone missing, etc. What are we to do?


This weekend, the gospel gives us the answer: If we see people who are hungry or thirsty, we should take care of them; if we see people who have been stripped of everything, we should help clothe them; if we see people who are lonely or trapped or sick, we should make time to be with them. We cannot bring back to life those massacred by violence, but we can make sure their death was not in vain. *¡Presente!* We can be kinder. *¡Presente!* We can be more compassionate. *¡Presente!* We can choose to live our life without violence. *¡Presente!* Christ is present here because we are here and we are the Body of Christ – whatever we do to ourselves or to others, we do to Christ.

Prayer: God of Peace, bless those who are still trying to heal from their memories of violence, of torture, of having loved ones taken or killed. Remembering the 8 UCA martyrs, help us to choose the path of peace and life. Amen.

What can I do? *LEARN*: Visit the Oxford Hub and learn what's being done to help Syrian survivors of torture (http://ohrh.law.ox.ac.uk/providing-syrian-survivors-of-torture-access-to-rehabilitation-services/) or learn about the Center for Victims of Torture (http://www.cvt.org/) *GIVE*: reconciliation is key to peace, so consider offering forgiveness to someone who has been the object of a grudge, jealousy, or anger and *PRAY*: sometime in our personal prayer this week, we can just say the names 8 UCA martyrs, and any other names of people who have lost their lives to violence, and end with the word: *¡Presente!*



Thanksgiving 2014 Let's Celebrate Thanksgiving Day

Join us on Thursday, November 27, and we will once again have a special Eucharistic celebration at 9:00am. It is special in several ways.

First let this day be a reminder that "Eucharist" means "thanksgiving". It seems then that taking part in the Eucharist on Thanksgiving Day is a most appropriate way of celebrating this holiday. We hope that you will join us.

Secondly, you are invited to bring gifts for the poor. These can be money or the usual items you bring for the St. Vincent de Paul Society. On this day don't leave them at the St. Vincent de Paul Society Depository but bring them to your pews with you. At the time of the Presentation of the Gifts, instead of the ushers/greeters passing the baskets, you will be asked to bring your own gifts forward into the sanctuary so they might serve as a sign for us to see. The ushers/greeters will be there to assist you.

Finally, you are invited to also bring something that you will be using at your own Thanksgiving Dinner or taking to someone else's. Let it be anything, cooked or uncooked, that you are able to handle easily. Again bring this to your pew with you. At some point in the Eucharist, you will be asked to hold up these items to be blessed. After Mass take them home with you to be used for your meal. The idea behind this is to help make a connection between the Lord's Table and your own feasting table. In this way you are bringing God's blessing to your own table. If you are particularly creative, you might even use this item to focus your meal prayer that day.
