

## Children's Liturgy of the Word

**Coming to our parish on November 28!**

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLW) is an age-appropriate Liturgy of the Word offered for ages 3 – 1st grade at the 5:00pm Mass. No pre-registration is necessary. All children are welcome and encouraged to attend.

Just before the Liturgy of the Word begins for the assembly, the children are invited to come up to the front of church by the presiding priest. Father will then formally dismiss them to go with the weekly leaders from the church to Hall C. During this special time, our leaders will share with the children through prayers, songs and readings that are simplified for children.

The children learn about the same Scripture readings as the rest of the assembly. They are taught a simplified main message of the readings and are encouraged to share that message with their parents after Mass.

We have some wonderful volunteer leaders and would love for a few more to join our team so that the leader would be available to teach every 4-6 weeks; depending your "YES!" We will also have youth volunteers to assist our adult leaders.

This is a great opportunity for adults and middle school/high school youth to help these eager youngsters learn the Word of the Lord.

**Feast of the Immaculate Conception****Holy Day of Obligation**

December 8 is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception and a holy day of obligation. The Immaculate Conception means that the Blessed Virgin Mary, whose conception was brought about the normal way, was conceived without original sin or its stain—that's what "immaculate" means: without stain. The essence of original sin consists in the deprivation of sanctifying grace, and its stain is a corrupt nature. Mary was preserved from these defects by God's grace; from the first instant of her existence she was in the state of sanctifying grace and was free from the corrupt nature original sin brings. 

Pope Francis recently announced that from December 8 this year right through to November 20, 2016 the Vatican will be celebrating a special jubilee in the form of a global holy year of mercy.

The pope has symbolically called on the entire global Roman Catholic Church to reflect his message of compassion and pardon.

Pope Francis said that mercy is "The beating heart of the Gospel".

The letter, published by the Vatican in seven languages, is striking for the global scope the pontiff envisions the Jubilee year taking, with availability for pardon and mercy seemingly available to all.

Archbishop Carlson stated, "As we journey together and prepare for the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy, may we recognize that we are strangers no longer and seek to bring to light God's mercy: "It is time to return to the basics and to bear the weaknesses and struggles of our brothers and sisters. Mercy is the force that reawakens us to new life and instills in us the courage to look to the future with hope" (Misericordiae Vultus, 10).

## 16 days to “Orange The World”

From November 25 through December 10, Human Rights Day, the 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence aim to raise public awareness and mobilizing people everywhere to bring about change. All are asked to **wear something orange from November 25 to December 10** as a reminder to themselves and others they meet to end violence against women and girls.


This year, the UN Secretary-General’s UNiTE to End Violence against Women campaign invites you to “Orange the world,” using the color designated by the UNiTE campaign to symbolize a brighter future without violence. Organize events to range streets, schools and landmarks!

A staggering one in three women have experienced physical or sexual violence in their lifetime—a pandemic of global proportions. Unlike an illness, however, perpetrators and even entire societies choose to commit violence—and can choose to stop. Violence is not inevitable – it can be prevented. But it’s not as straightforward as eradicating a virus. There is no vaccine, medication or cure. And there is no one single reason for why it happens

As such, prevention strategies should be holistic, with multiple interventions undertaken in parallel in order to have long-lasting and permanent effects. Many sectors, actors and stakeholders need to be engaged. More evidence is emerging on what interventions work to prevent violence—from community mobilization to change social norms, to comprehensive school interventions targeting staff and pupils, to economic empowerment and income supplements coupled with gender equality training.

Prevention is the 2015 theme of the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women on November 25 and of the UNiTE to End Violence against Women Campaign’s 16 days call for action. This year, at the official commemoration at UN Headquarters in New York, the first UN Framework on Preventing Violence against Women will be launched and discussed (ECOSOC Chamber; 10am–12 noon). This document stems from the collaboration of seven UN entities: UN Women, ILO, OHCHR, UNDP, UNESCO, UNFPA and WHO. The framework develops a common understanding for the UN System, policymakers and other stakeholders on preventing violence against women and provides a theory of change to underpin action.

## Let’s Celebrate Thanksgiving Day


Join us on Thursday, November 26, and we will once again have a special Eucharistic celebration at 9:00am.

It is special in several ways. First let this day be a reminder that “Eucharist” means “thanksgiving”. It seems then that taking part in the Eucharist on Thanksgiving Day is a most appropriate way of celebrating this holiday. We hope that you will join us.

Secondly, you are invited to bring gifts for the poor. These can be money or the usual items you bring for the St. Vincent de Paul Society. On this day don’t leave them at the St. Vincent de Paul Society Depository but bring them to your pews with you. At the time of the Presentation of the Gifts, instead of the ushers/greeters passing the baskets, you will be asked to bring your own gifts forward into the sanctuary so they might serve as a sign for us to see. The ushers/greeters will be there to assist you.

Finally, you are invited to also bring something that you will be using at your own Thanksgiving Dinner or taking to someone else’s. Let it be anything, cooked or uncooked, that you are able to handle easily. Again bring this to your pew with you. At some point in the Eucharist, you will be asked to hold up these items to be blessed. After Mass take them home with you to be used for your meal. The idea behind this is to help make a connection between the Lord’s Table and your own feasting table. In this way you are bringing God’s blessing to your own table. If you are particularly creative, you might even use this item to focus your meal prayer that day.

Please Note: There will be no 6:30am Mass on Thanksgiving Day.
