Amen

Mary is the mother of God and our mother. We who are members of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish have a special connection with Mary. We know that our ancestors, who built this parish, literally carrying the stones from miles around, have left us a legacy of devotion to Mary. This is a beautiful gift, to be cherished and to be shared with the world. While we follow centuries of tradition and stand solidly on Church teaching, from the earliest councils until the Dogma of the Assumption in 1950, we ought never take Mary for granted.

We can see in the Gospels a growing understanding of Mary's role in our salvation. She says, "yes," in response to the Annunciation of Angel Gabriel; she offers her beautiful Magnificat to Elizabeth and to us; she wraps our savior in swaddling clothes in a manger; she travels with Joseph to Egypt to keep her son safe; she invites her son to save us at the Wedding Feast of Cana; she accepts us as her sons and daughters while standing at the foot of the cross; she stands with the apostles as they witness the Ascension of Christ and at Pentecost when the Holy Spirit descends upon the Church. Mary is present everywhere in the Gospels, full of grace and ready to bring Christ to the world.

And yet many have struggled to accept her. Just as "(Jesus) was in the world, and the world came to be through him, but the world did not know him (Jn 1:10)," so the world has struggled to proclaim Mary as Theotokos, the one who gives birth to God. During the Council of Ephesus in 431 our early teachers of the faith struggled with declaring the truth of Mary as Mother of God. I am glad they did; the struggle itself reveals the importance of this truth. It is not a matter of us exalting Mary with a profoundly beautiful title; God has already exalted her. It is more a matter of humbly exalting all of humanity as children of God. Our hesitance to proclaim Mary as Mother of God and our Mother is grounded in that still small voice in the depths of our soul which cries, "God cannot really love you that much." But God does love you more than any human heart can ask for or imagine; God loves you enough to send his only Son into the world, born of the Virgin Mary, to bring salvation to you and the whole world; God loves you enough to give you Mary as your mother. Let us be humble enough to let God exalt us as children of God. Let us join Mary in her "yes" to God's love. Let our "amen" to God's love be our New Year's Resolution.

The Feast of the Epiphany Home Blessing – January 8, 2017

One interesting custom for Epiphany is for families to ask God's blessing on our own homes. The ritual calls for parents to mark, with blessed chalk, the main entrance door with the initials of the Magi and a code of the current year. This year's mark will be: 20 + C + M + B + 17

The numbers stand for the year in which the blessing is inscribed (2017). The letters stand for the names traditionally given the Magi who found the Christ Child: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They are also an abbreviation for the Latin blessing: Christus mansionem benedicat, or "Christ bless this dwelling." Blessed chalk and holy water will be available after Masses the weekend of January 7/8.

The Blessing: Gather your family at the main entrance to your home.

All make the sign of the cross.

Parent: "Let us praise God, who fills our hearts and homes with peace. Blessed be God forever."

Family: "Blessed be God forever"

Parent or reader: (reading from Sacred Scripture) "And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage." Matt 2:10-11

Parent or guardian imparts the blessing: "Lord God of heaven and earth, You revealed Your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill them with the light of Christ, that their concern for others may reflect Your love. We ask this through Christ, our Lord."

Family: "Amen"

Then the parent sprinkles holy water on those gathered and sprinkles it about the home.

THE FOUR PILLARS OF PARISH STEWARDSHIP

The four pillars of *hospitality, prayer, formation and service* invite parishioners to experience, witness and live the stewardship way of life in response to their baptismal call to discipleship. Individually, each baptized person is called to give of time, talent and treasure to strengthen these four pillars that support the parish community. Conversely, by making our parish a place of *hospitality, prayer, formation and service*, we provide greater opportunities for the sharing of time, talent and treasure.

This week we want to focus on the importance of **FORMATION**: As the steward grows in the life of prayer, God reveals Himself more intimately in this personal relationship. The steward also sees that the gifts received from God are to be shared and not buried. The steward remains deeply rooted in humility, recognizing that the gifts one has been given come not from self, but from God. Those gifts are to be shared with others. Here lies the heart of the steward's personal response as a disciple – to share what one has received and to share with a generous, grateful and loving heart. This formation of each individual becomes part of the formation of the parish community. As members of the Body of Christ, the parish recognizes that it has a call from God to give. Inherent within each individual is the need to give – to move from selfishness to selflessness. This formation is a life-long journey of conversion.

The stewardship parish journeys constantly in this formation of conversion. As one grows more deeply in this formation to a life of stewardship, the more deeply one loves as God loves us. This is true for the individual steward and for the stewardship parish. Such formation is a formidable task, involving education of the mind and conversion of the heart. To know the "stewardship way of life", does not make one live a "stewardship way of life." Formation includes quality education, but the knowledge itself is not enough. Ongoing Catholic education, (for children and adults), is important if we are to grow in our lives as stewards. This formation should include a proper knowledge and understanding of stewardship since it is a primary means to lead the faithful to holiness. Catholic schools, Parish Schools of Religion, youth ministry programs, adult education offerings and parish stewardship committees are wonderful and essential places where this faith formation begins. Yet, it is foolish to think that these are the only parish organizations responsible for this faith formation of parishioners to grow. Every parish organization has a role to play in nurturing the faith formation of our parishioners. It is in this collective parish effort and the grace of God at work through our sincere efforts that faith formation thrives. The meaning of faithful stewardship and how to live this way of life is at the core of the disciple's response to the gift of faith we freely receive from our loving God. *Excerpts taken from the Diocese of Wichita*


