

Lent 2015 – Awakening to our Impact on the World Operation: RICE BOWL

For 40 years, Catholic Relief Services' Rice Bowl initiative has connected communities, like our parish, with the dire, pressing needs of people throughout the earth. Catholic Relief Services (CRS) is a presence of hope and life in areas ravaged by poverty, war, disease, famine, and natural disasters.

There is an old adage: "Some people give by going. Some people go by giving." Lent is a time for us to look at our own hearts, to examine how we our living – how we are in relationship to God, to others, to the earth. The CRS Rice Bowl project is a tremendous opportunity for us to visit those suffering in other lands...to visit them with our prayer, to visit them with our willingness to become more aware about the needs of the most vulnerable in the global community, to visit them with financial resources. For those of us with young people in our lives (children, nieces, nephews, grandkids, etc.) the CRS Rice Bowl is a teaching tool – a way to show the next generations how to bring to Christ to the world... how to love the stranger, feed the hungry, clothe the naked... how to bring the light of the gospel of joy to even the darkest places.

Prayer: Renew my heart, O God, that I may be Your Love for all the earth. Amen.

Action: This week, let's take time to: LEARN: The young girl on the front of all of the Rice Bowls this year is from the village of Tourbey in Niger. Take some time this week to do some research on her village.

GIVE: Grab a rice bowl and start collecting, and **PRAY:** we see many images of people in need (newspapers, magazines, online, etc.). Find an image and put it somewhere you will see it regularly this Lent. Walk with that image in prayer and let the person in that image walk with you.



Have you ever wondered: *Why do we do Lent every year*? or thought *How can I possibly get something new out of Lent*?

Come down to Hall C after 7pm Mass on Tuesday, February 24. Our pastoral associate, Amanda Suchara, will offer a brief reflection on how to make the most of these special 40 days, tackling topics, such as: *How to make a Lenten resolution without making yourself and those around you crazy... How to engage resources and opportunities... How to become awake to joy, even in a season of penance and privation.*

This is the first in a series of special Lenten talks focused

While it is one process, please note that each institution has its own due date: March 15 for the Archdiocese and St. Dominic, May 15 for Assumption.

Synod on the Family

As Pope Francis and bishops from around the world prepare for the Synod on the Family in Rome this October, they have asked you to provide feedback to inform their efforts to speak a word of hope to all families.

They are especially mindful of the varied circumstances of families in different cultures throughout the world, including separated, divorced and remarried couples: including non-traditional families comprised of mothers and fathers who live together without being married; and including families of same-sex unions. While upholding the value and the centrality of the sacrament of marriage as vital to the life of the Church and central to God's revelation of Christ to the world, the bishops are searching for ways to meaningfully invite and love all who are yet struggling to find their way into full communion. In our heart of hearts, and in the heart of the Church, we know that Jesus' prayer for us is that "we all be one..." Jesus has already found a way to welcome all God's children, no matter their circumstance in life, into His Sacred Heart. Christ has chosen to make His dwelling in the very heart of every person, and indeed, in all of creation. It is our responsibility, then, to celebrate and honor that unity which is ours in Christ.

In seeking feedback the bishops have made available to us a survey of 46 questions. The link to the survey is posted also in this bulletin. While the language of the questions may seem complex, it is an effort on the part of the bishops to learn what you think and how you feel. I encourage you to answer as many of the questions as you can, expressing yourself to them. To help prepare for the survey, the full text of the bishops' summary document from their preparatory meeting last fall is also available. I want to highlight two excerpts from that document to provide a context for the larger conversation which needs to unfold throughout the coming months.

In the introduction we find Pope Francis' prayer for all families: "Evening falls on our assembly. It is the hour at which one willingly returns home to meet at the same table, in the depth of affection, of the good that has been done and received, of the encounters which warm the heart and make it grow, good wine which anticipates the unending feast in the days of man. It is also the weightiest hour for one who finds himself face to face with his own loneliness, in the bitter twilight of shattered dreams and broken plans; how many people trudge through the day in the blind alley of resignation, of abandonment, even resentment: in how many homes the wine of joy has been less plentiful, and therefore, also the zest-the very wisdom-for life...Let us make our prayer heard for one another this evening, a prayer for all."

In paragraph 45, the bishops seek a way to truly accompany ALL families as they grow in holiness, even though their circumstances vary from country to country, from city to city, from neighborhood to neighborhood, from house to house. "All families should, above all, be treated with respect and love and accompanied on their journey as Christ accompanied the disciples on the road to Emmaus. In a particular way, the words of Pope Francis apply in these situations: 'The Church will have to initiate everyone-priests, religious, laity-into this 'art of accompaniment', which teaches us to remove our sandals before the sacred ground of the other (Ex. 3:5). The pace of this accompaniment must be steady and reassuring, reflecting a closeness and compassion which, at the same time, heals, liberates and encourages growth in the Christian life."

Please prayerfully consider completing the survey and having your voice included in the work of the Synod on the Family this October.

Synod on the Family – XIV Ordinary General Assembly

In October, the Church's next Ordinary Synod of Bishops, "The Vocation and Mission of the Family in the Church and the Contemporary World," will resume the work begun at last year's Extraordinary Synod. The bishops have created a preparatory document containing 46 questions on family life from the faithful. If you would like to view the document and answer the questions to be submitted to the Vatican, please visit <u>www.archstl.org/family-synod-2015</u>. If you do not have internet access, but would like to submit answers, contact the parish office and we will provide you with a document and instructions for submission. All answers must be submitted before March 1.

1 Minute Meditation

Each day during Lent – at 12:00 Noon and/or 6:00pm - we invite you to join us for a "one minute meditation". This sixty seconds of silence is an invitation to simply sit in the presence of God without words (out loud – or in our heads). Whatever your posture, it may be helpful to take a few deep breaths as you begin. The key is to try to be aware of the fact that you are not alone. There is no "one right way" to do this. Even our trying to do this is itself prayer.

Learning to just be with God in the present moment is one of the most important spiritual disciplines of all! Certainly, all we ever have is the present moment, and God is always there waiting for us. And this one minute may just be the doorway into deeper and more frequent encounters with The Other.

The RCIA Journey The Rite of Sending

Last weekend the RCIA team met with each individual to explore the direction in which their faith journey is leading them. Starting with Ash Wednesday, we begin our Lenten journey and the period of Purification and Enlightenment. In the RCIA process, there are four distinct periods: Pre-Catechumenate, Catechumenate, Purification and Enlightenment, and Mystagogy. During the period of Purification and Enlightenment, the focus becomes a stronger emphasis on the spiritual and mystical life, through reflection and meditation, in preparation for the Sacraments.

This weekend at all the Masses, we will celebrate the Rite of Sending with the men and women in the RCIA process. We will ask them if they are ready to begin their final period of preparation for Sacraments; we'll ask their sponsors if their candidates and catechumens are ready for Sacraments, and finally, we will ask you, the congregation, if you are willing to support them through your prayers and example.

Today, prayer cards will be passed out with the name and picture of each of our candidates and catechumens on them. We are asking each one of you - every man, woman and child - to take a prayer card and pray for that person throughout all of Lent. Then we'd like to ask you to write a note of support on each card and turn them in by **March 22**, and we will give them to our candidates and catechumens that weekend during their Retreat Day.
