Today we celebrate The Feast of *The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph*



A teacher was teaching his Sunday school kids about the importance of the family and things that money cannot buy. "Money can't buy laughter and it can't buy love" he told them. To illustrate his point he said, "What would you do if I offered you \$1,000 not to love your mother and father?" The whole class fell silent. Finally a small voice queried, "How much would you give me not to love my big sister?" Evidently it is easier to love vertically than to love horizontally. The love between parents and children or grand-parents and grand-children comes more easily to us than the love between siblings, or between peers, or between those who do not think like us or look like us. We are family, ONE family. But we still have the choice to be true or false members of the family of God. True children of God are

those who strive to live by the twofold commandment of love of God and love of neighbor. Here again we see the two dimensions, vertical and horizontal. Today, let us re-commit ourselves to both vertical and horizontal loving.

January 1st, *The Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God*

Today we again proclaim Mary as the Mother of God, not just Jesus, but God. When asked, "What do you admire about Mary?" here are just a few responses:

- Her willingness to play her part in God's plan.
- Her contemplative nature: Mary pondered these things in her heart.
- She gave us the best advice in all the Bible: His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he (Jesus) tells you."
- Her courage and trust in God: she could have been stoned to death for becoming pregnant with our Savior out of wedlock, but she put her trust in God and said "Yes" to His plan.
- Her compassion and faith: she stepped out of her "comfort zone" to ask Jesus to help the young newlywed couple at Cana who were about to be humiliated by running out of wine.
- Her humility: she was the Mother of God, and yet she lived a quiet life as a housewife, never trying to draw attention to herself.
- Her love and loyalty: when all of Jesus' disciples except one had deserted Him, she stayed by Him until the end when He hung on the Cross.
- Her prayerful openness to God: she was among those who received the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

How about us? What do we admire? What would we be willing to imitate?

Our St. Vincent De Paul Society and some of our Advent Giving Tree Volunteers worked countless hours over the past several weeks. They managed all the requests for help and then created tags and a system for coordination. From that, the SVDP collected 90 Turkeys and hams; 2 gifts for **each** person in 107 families (we had an average of 5 persons per family)... so doing the math, that was over 850 packages! In addition, 65 presents were donated for families in Fr. Steve's Parish; 44 gifts for Our Lady's Inn; 30 multi-gift packs for Mary Queen of Angels; and 30 multi-gift packs for Birthright. The O'Fallon Fire Department joined with us to haul all the food from our pantry to the parish center to be sorted into baskets of food for each family.

One Family – a New Year

Our faith teaches us of a God that defies all separation... all division. In the scandalous, radical incarnation of Jesus we are given a glimpse of how we are to be connected... interconnected with one another. We call Jesus The Word Made Flesh. At Christmas, we heard that the Word was God. Our faith teaches us that God is love. Therefore, The Word is Love. In this Word, God learns to speak the language of being human. God-the Trinity-is a family of relationships: God, the Speaker – Jesus, the Spoken Word – Holy Spirit, the active Speaking that holds the relationship together in one indivisible instant; moment after moment after moment...

Among the native Lakota tribes, they use a phrase: *Mitakuye oyasin*, which means “we are all connected.” Brother... sister... mother... father... cousin... we are part of a divine web of life. None of us is the whole web, yet each person, each creature, each sprout of vegetation has an essential part in the web.

Our efforts to reverence life, however insignificant they may seem, have a deep and lasting impact on the whole web: our work to support the rights and dignity of the unborn, our outreach to the immigrant, resolving conflict without violence, when we involve ourselves in the work to end human trafficking, racism, child abuse, when we teach our children a gentler way of being in the world, our efforts to recycle and sustain the precious resources of creation... all of this has profound impact on life around us.

As we begin a New Year, we have a fresh start. As we heard during the Advent Penance service, “No one can go back and make a new beginning but anyone can start now and make a new ending.” (Maria Robinson) This is true of all of our relationships, as well as the process of bringing about the Reign of Heaven on earth. Continuing Christ’s work of establishing peace among all nations begins with a commitment to establishing peace as the guiding force of our hearts.

What is you want to see in your immediate family? your parish family? our global family? What gifts, skills, ideas do you have to offer the family of God? Jesus – the Love made flesh – is our reminder, our truth that WE ARE ONE – regardless of our skin color, hair color, eye color, tone of voice, height, weight, occupation, orientation,

language, creed, goodness, brokenness, joy, sorrow, age, ability, animal, vegetable, mineral – WE ARE ONE FAMILY. We have a lot of work to do to restore our unity, to heal the places broken by division, fear, misunderstanding, corruption, or resentment...

We have a whole new year to reclaim the wholeness of the family of God’s Love... We have a whole new year to reconcile our relationship with our God, ourselves, our sisters & brothers, and all creation... *mitakuye oyasin!*

Prayer: In name of God-Who is Love, the Son-Who is the Beloved, and the Holy Spirit-Who is the Infinite Loving that holds the relationship in perfect unity: ignite in us new dreams for Oneness; help us to choose life, make peace, and humbly walk in the way of Your justice in mercy that 2015 may bring us closer to our original unity in Your Love. Amen.

Life, Peace, and Justice in 2015: If we could choose 1 thing... just 1 thing that we are willing to care about this year. It may be the homeless, prison inmates, immigration reform, water conservation, clean energy, child abuse/neglect, dignity of the unborn and healing for those who have had an abortion, Fair Trade/Equal Exchange, racism, systemic issues faced by communities like Ferguson, rainforest preservation, human trafficking, poverty, famine in Africa, The Growing Project, rights of women & girls in developing nations, access to quality healthcare, rights of migrant farmers, recycling, Belize or mission projects in another country, ethical treatment of animals, the Millennium Development Goals, mining practices, worker rights, ethical research practices, education issues, just to name a few.

That's how we could start to make a new ending – by just choosing 1 thing and find a way to care about this year – study it, take time to think about it/pray about it each day, learn all we can about it, find out ways to become involved with it. Perhaps we could even choose an issue that makes us uneasy, something outside of our comfort zone. What is 1 thing we could focus on this year to restore the unity of global family of God?




