

Surrender


Jesus challenges us today to “*hate* our father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters and even our own life...” if we want to be his disciples. He says also, “In the same way, anyone of you who does not *renounce* all his possessions cannot be my disciple.”

This is a hard lesson. How can this be good news? We worship a God who died for us; must we also die for him? In the last few weeks as we have moved through Luke’s Gospel, we could feel this moment coming. And now we are invited to decide. Jesus has shown us the way which leads to freedom, to peace, to love, to eternal life. It is the way of the cross, the path of letting go, the surrender of our will, the falling into grace.

Let us recall, too, that Jesus promises Peter, “Amen I say to you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age...(Mk 10:29-30).” We trust God’s promise to us; we remain confident that God’s grace and mercy will sustain us into eternal life. And if we wish to know Jesus, we must deny our very selves, pick up our cross and follow him.

Our cross is not a burden thrown on our shoulders by this world. Our cross is not a difficulty we face. The cross which we pick up is our participation in the suffering of Jesus. We cannot pick it up unless and until we have first laid down our lives, our possessions, our burdens. Jesus invites us today to a deeper “yes” in faith. During our lives we have practiced a way of seeing, a way of being, which is too small. This way of being in the world has served us well; but now we must lay aside our former way of life and become a new creation. We can, literally, turn our backs on mother and father, wife and children and possessions. Then when we turn around again with the eyes of faith, with hearts on fire, with a wisdom which is born of sacrifice, with a life grounded in God’s Spirit; we can embrace father and mother, wife and children as pure gift from God, as blessing. This can be as simple as taking a breath when we are preparing to scold one of our children; in that moment of breathing in God’s Spirit we can choose to bless instead of scold.

There is no easy way to do this. We can only surrender and trust God’s power to save. We can follow Mary in her “yes.” She emptied herself and became full of grace. *Fr Mitch*



Mary, Pro-Life Inspiration

"Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia."

Mary's example is especially important to remember in pro-life efforts. She can be a tremendous source of inspiration and hope for women in today's society, where there is so much woundedness resulting from the culture of death. Modern culture encourages a self-centered, materialistic and utilitarian view of the person, promising instant satisfaction, but ultimately leading to emptiness. The Christian view of the human person offers a very different way of life that is at once challenging and rewarding. Mary's example of authentic Christian living speaks especially to a model of womanhood that is life-giving and love-affirming, and therefore very relevant to the pro-life message.

In addition to praying the Rosary, there are many ways to remember Mary's example as we reach out to others with the pro-life message. We have a beautiful message to share, a message of life, love and true freedom.


The Will to Share

RCIA

The RCIA is primarily intended for those who are unbaptized (called catechumenes) and preparing to receive the sacraments of initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. Here at Assumption we also include those who have been baptized (candidates) in other faiths - those will prepare for Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.

There are four major periods in the initiation process, separated by various liturgical rituals, which express and celebrate what is occurring at each stage in the process.

RCIA stage 1: Just Looking

In the inquiry stage, you're just finding out about Jesus, Christianity, and the Catholic Church.

Your main task here is to explore and develop your faith enough so you can make an informed initial decision about entering the Catholic Church. The final decision won't come for a long time, when you actually enter the Church at Easter and receive the sacraments of initiation. You focus on catechesis in this stage: learning about the faith, how to live as a Christian, and developing your interior life.
