Hello,

As we enter Holy Week, I thought I would inform you about some practices that come with Holy Week to give you a reminder of what we will be doing at different services. Last week, I went over Palm Sunday, but I did get a question about something I hadn't mentioned yet, about covering statues. There used to be the tradition of covering all the statues in a church throughout all of Lent, this was meant to build a greater anticipation for Easter. In the United States, this tradition is no longer allowed for all of Lent, but can be done for the last two weeks, with the crucifix being uncovered after the Good Friday service and all of them being uncovered before the Easter Vigil. The following are some other specific practices we have for Holy Week.



Limited sacraments during Holy Week:

- With the anticipation of Easter so soon, Baptisms and Confirmations are not to be celebrated from Monday until the Easter Vigil, unless there is a danger of death.
- On Holy Thursday, the Chrism Mass is to be celebrated (at the Cathedral in St. Louis), but no other Masses are to be celebrated that day except for the Mass of the Lord's Supper.
- No funeral Masses may be celebrated on Holy Thursday, Good Friday or Holy Saturday.
- On Holy Saturday, the celebration of marriage and other sacraments are forbidden, except for the sacrament of Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick. Holy Communion can only be given as Viaticum (for one who is dying).

Special practices during the Triduum and its Services:

- The tabernacle is to be completely empty before the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper.
- Holy Water should be removed from all fonts prior to the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper and refilled with the water blessed at the Easter Vigil.
- The group whose feet are washed should represent a cross-section of the local community (this used to be restricted to only men). The number is tradition. The number is traditionally 12, but there is no exact requirement.
- The Gloria is sung during the Mass of the Lord's Supper and bells can be rung during it, but all bells are to remain silent until the Glorias at the Easter Vigil.
- After the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the altar is stripped and lamps should not be lit before the images of saints.
- A fast should be observed by everyone from the ages of 18-59 on Good Friday.
- The Good Friday Celebration of the Passion of the Lord begins in silence with the priests and deacons kneeling or laying prostrate in silence, while others kneel.
- During the Celebration of the Passion of the Lord, the faithful approach the Cross in procession and show reverence to the cross by a simple genuflection or by some sign, such as, by kissing the Cross.
- The Good Friday Celebration of the Passion of the Lord ends in silence.
- After the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, the altar should be stripped again.
- The Easter Vigil is not to start before nightfall and begins with the lighting of the Easter Fire and the blessing of the Easter Candle.

And if anyone asks, Lent officially ends before Evening Prayer on Holy Thursday and the Easter Triduum begins with the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. The Triduum ends with Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday. I hope to see you at the services during Holy Week.

ASSUMPTION PRAYER CHAPEL

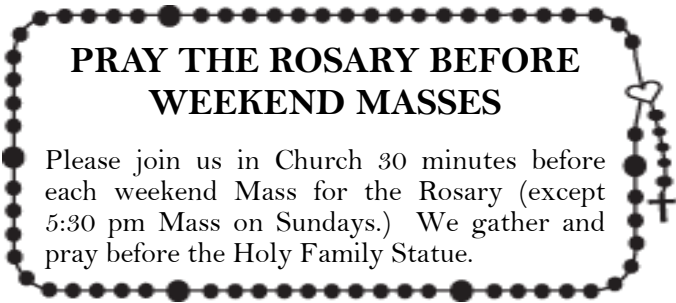

HOLY WEEK BEGINS PALM SUNDAY, APRIL 13



Holy Week happens on the last week of the season of Lent and is the most important week of the year. It begins with Palm Sunday and continues through [the Triduum](#) of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. It is a time for prayer and marks the final stretch before Easter Sunday on April 20, the celebration of Jesus' Resurrection. Join us as we commemorate and remember the last week of Jesus' life on this earth.

This evening we renew our baptismal promises and celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation with those who have been preparing as we witness their Baptisms, entry into the Church, Confirmations and their First Communions.

April 20: Easter Sunday
Mass at 8am, 10am, and noon, Church; Mass 8:15am and 10:15am, Chapel
The season of Easter is the most important of all liturgical times, which Catholics celebrate as the Lord's resurrection from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church.

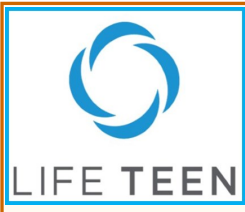

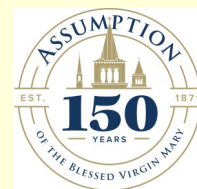
