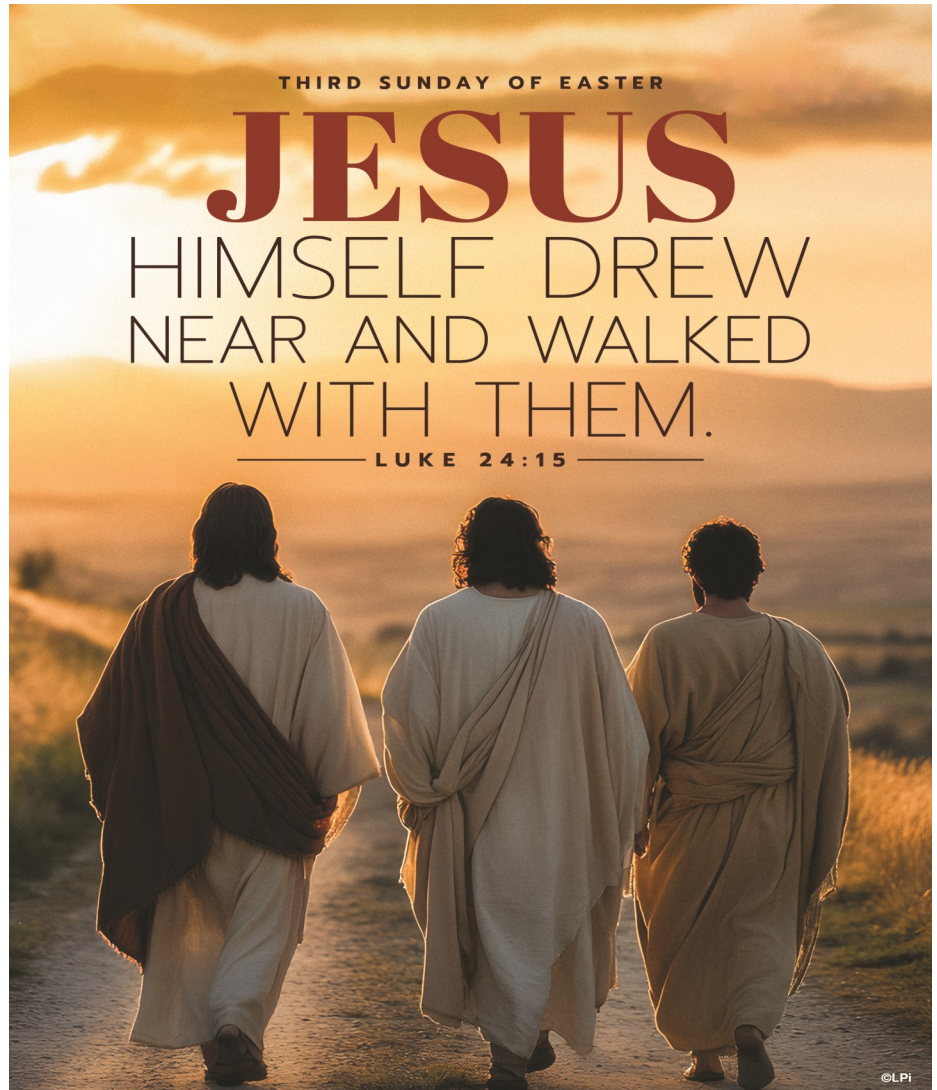

Hello,

Last week, we were in the church with our 2<sup>nd</sup> graders practicing coming out of their pews, walking forward, and receiving Communion. This week, we will have their parents with them and practice it in the way they will come forward to receive their First Communion this Sunday. Practicing how they pause and bow before going forward to receive Communion, and having their hands placed correctly and responding “Amen” when they are offered the Body of Christ; we hope this practice will help them participate in the celebration. But if it doesn’t go perfect, it will still be great if we stay focused on the reason we are there—for them to receive the Eucharist.

Only two weeks ago, we had the First Communion of the adults who were baptized and others who were received into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. While that was happening, I was particularly aware of how this sacrament does not just unite us to Christ, but also to one another. This unity with each other, particularly stood out during the Easter Vigil, as many of these people had been baptized before in other Christian denominations, but we do not ask them to receive the Eucharist with us until they become Catholic.

I mention this because sometimes this can be forgotten in our thoughts and then reflected in our actions. How we receive the Eucharist, coming forward as a community, and then returning to our pews can be conducted in a manner where this unity with one another is further demonstrated, or our actions can seem to separate us from one another. If we are singing together the Communion hymn, the words and action can be a definite sign of how we are not only being united to Christ in this action, but also uniting ourselves with each other – or it can seem as merely something we are listening to that is meant to help us focus on Christ. How we practice and teach the children to hold their hands and approach the minister to receive the Eucharist not only tells them a proper means of respect and honor, but also in a common manor that does not draw attention to the individual but also expresses our unity with each other.

As we will hear of the beginnings of the Church in this Easter Season, from Jesus’ rising from the dead through Pentecost, differences of the apostles, and the communities they are ministering to will become obvious and even a challenge at times, but we will also see how they will be united through Christ. As the 2<sup>nd</sup> graders receive their First Communion may it not only inspire us in the great gift we receive from Christ, but also remind us of an aspect of that gift that unites us to one another.

This weekend, we also begin the Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) of our archdiocese. This is a means by which we contribute to various works of our archdiocese that are more appropriately supported through all the people through the archdiocese working together instead of individually or simply through each individual parish. We will have pamphlets in the pews describing some of the work of the ACA and having QR codes that can be scanned to help make a donation using your phone. Tables are also set up in the Narthex where there are cards for each parish family as a means to donate or find out more about the appeal. Please consider a donation to support all the work the diocese does all around us.

## FUN OPPORTUNITIES TO SERVE AT ASSUMPTION

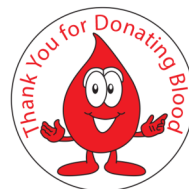

### CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (FORMERLY RCIA)

Last Sunday, we revisited the Easter Vigil and as always, the group was overwhelmed and full of the holy spirit. Those who were baptized still are filled with awe of the Vigil. They felt that coming out of the water brought them such peace and calm. They felt the darkness and then became clothed in the light of Christ. Those who were conformed were in tears as they spoke of their cleansing from the Sacrament of Reconciliation. They were happy that they finally could let go of the old stuff and rely on God now. There are so many wonderful stories of conversion. The sponsors were given letters of appreciation from their new friend and they all prayed.

What is next for those who entered the Catholic Church this Easter? We have reached the fourth period of the Christian Initiation process, which is the Mystagogy period. All who were baptized and received into full communion



are now called neophytes until the anniversary of their initiation next Easter. The final period of regular formation extends through the Easter season, the seven weeks from Easter to Pentecost. The post-baptismal catechesis, mystagogy, is a time for deepening the Christian experience, especially in appreciation for the sacramental life, for spiritual growth and for entering more fully into the life and unity of the Catholic community. One of the greatest things at the Catholic Church is the strong bond we share together as Catholics. Cherish it!
