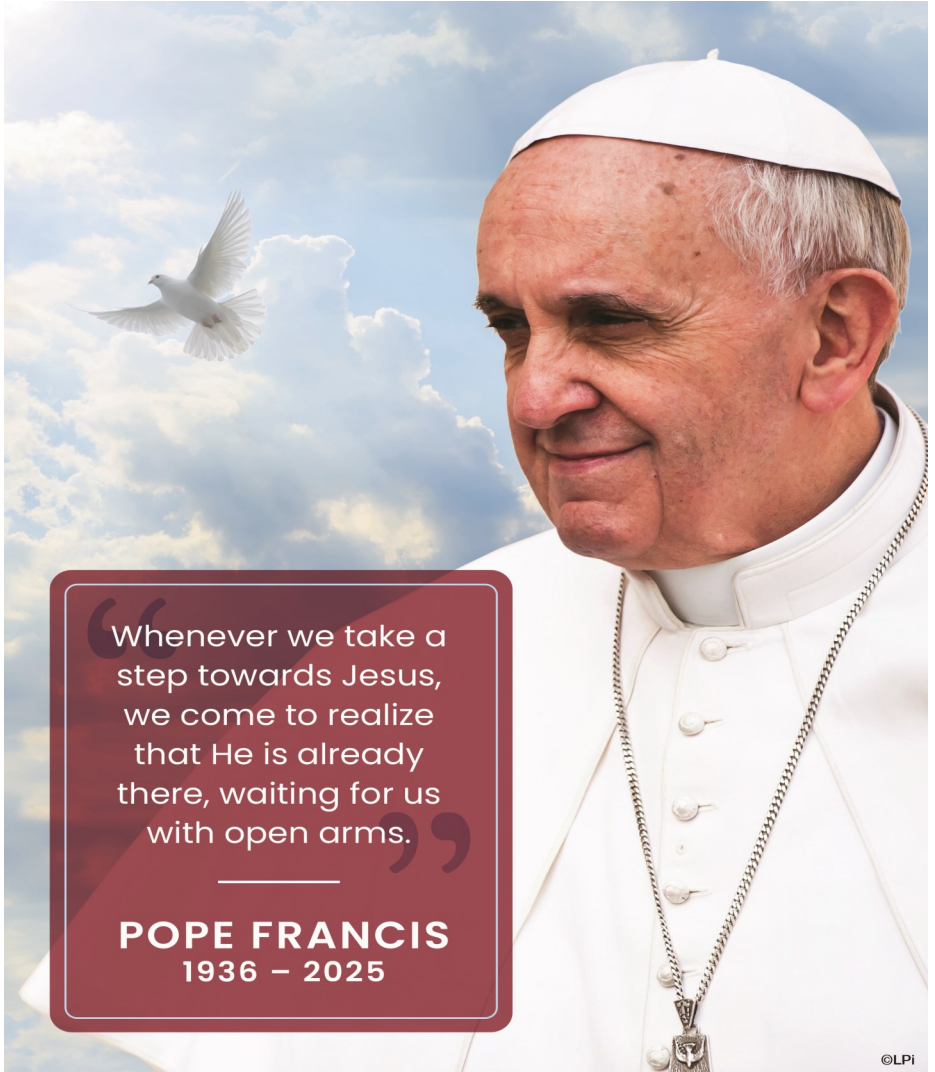

With the death of Pope Francis on Monday, I had many ideas in my head about what to write about him in the bulletin for this week and started compiling them. I'm sure I will use many of those in comments in the future, but I found in my files an article I wrote about him only nine months into his papacy (Dec. 29, 2013) that describes numerous characteristics of him that impressed and inspired me from the beginning, and he managed to continue doing. May he rest in Peace.



Hello,

We come to the end of another year, this week and often look back at the past year and we hear summaries of things that happened and the biggest and best things of the last year. One that caught my attention was Pope Francis being named Time Magazine Person of the Year 2013. Receiving this recognition can mean various things, but it always has to do with notoriety and what is at least a perceived impact that person is having on the world. Obviously, the position of pope always has international attention, but this is only the third pope to be named their Person of the Year. In this case, it clearly demonstrates the attention he has attracted in such a short time for how he is living out his role as pope, and the one word that appears to be used the most is humbly.

What has caught people's attention is how simply he lives: from going to the hotel desk to pay his bill for where he was staying before the elections, to just kindly treating a young boy who walks up to him on a stage when he is giving an address. The things that have been getting him on the nightly news are not big policy changes, but rather the way he lives out his position in a very humble, caring, Christian manner. This is the kind of recognition that I know and I believe most Catholics are very proud to have the leader of our Church recognized for doing. And while he makes some statements that have received attention, because they were misinterpreted or taken out of context by the press and others, (which even happened to Jesus), even those seem to be getting reasonable clarifications that are actually being heard at times. It is generally understood that he hasn't been changing or going against any of the past theological teachings of the Church, but rather bringing a little more focus and attention on the poor and recognition and acknowledgment on how individual people's lives are affected.

In addition to giving Catholics a good image though, I think his actions also give us a good challenge. I know for myself I have been challenged when I realize how simply and directly he has addressed some issues by simply doing what he thought was right and also being himself instead of making a big issue out of something or using an excuse that his position prohibits him from doing something. From whose feet he washed at the Holy Thursday services, to what apartment he was going to live in. It is easy to let a position, or other's expectations, determine what we do, or to use them as an excuse for what we do, instead of just doing what we should or even want to at times. I feel his living out his position as pope in the humble, caring, and transparent manner that he has is a good model for all of us, whether as a priest, or a parent, or a child, or a sibling, or a spouse.

So many of the things he has done are not that extraordinary, they are what we consider the right thing to do, but we would also understand, especially with his position, his not doing them. Yet at the same time, with his position, the fact that he has done these things is what has caught so many people's attention. Maybe this coming year, in whatever our role is, our relationship, our responsibilities, it might be good to consider what some of those ordinary things I can do are?

### CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (FORMERLY RCIA)

What is next for those who entered the Catholic Church this Easter? We have reached the 4th period of the Christian Initiation process, which is the neophyte year. All who were baptized and received into full communion are called neophytes in this next period until the anniversary of their initiation next Easter. The final period of regular formation extends through the Easter season, the seven weeks from Easter to Pentecost. The post-baptismal catechesis is called mystagogy. It is a time for deepening the Christian experience, especially in appreciation for the sacramental life, for spiritual growth and for entering more fully into the life and unity of the Catholic community. At the Assumption Easter Vigil, 4 adults, 1 teen, and 5 children were baptized; and 18 men and women were received into the Church on this holy night. Welcome our dear brothers and sisters! 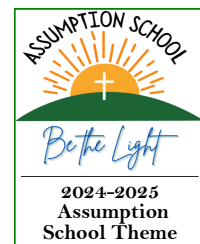

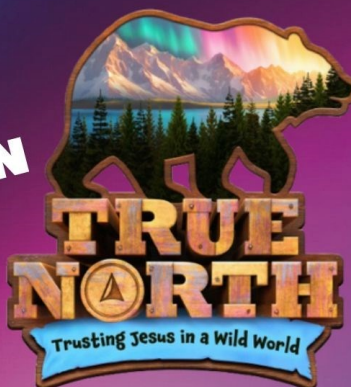
