Hello,

Today, we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, and one of the aspects of it I always note is the gift of tongues that the Holy Spirit allowed the disciples to speak in a variety of tongues so that all of those gathered from many lands could understand them. I guess because I've always been challenged with languages is one reason this impresses me so much. I know that I can translate certain words that can simply be memorized in a language, or look them up in a dictionary, but there are always grammatical structures and more subtle aspects or even multiple meanings for the same word that aren't so easy. I know I've had to translate a few things in tests where they were long phrases with negatives in them and it was always a challenge to be sure what the negative was modifying, and it changed the entire meaning of the phrase if you got it wrong. Needless to say, I respect an informed translator.

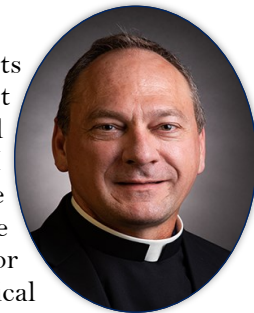
I mention this because there is not just one, but there are two levels of communication I think we need to be concerned with for our faith. The first is of communicating with God. Being able to hear Him clearly and being able to speak to Him about what matters to us. Fortunately, we are talking about God, and He is really good at this stuff and manages to help us a lot from His end. But we still need to not only take the time to listen, but also the effort to recognize the context He is doing this in, with the whole history of His relationship with man, and also with us specifically. Even the Apostles didn't get some of the parables Jesus said without his explaining them, so we need to consider it might take us a little effort to understand God's messages at times, whether through Scripture or some other means of revelation. And we also need the practice of expressing ourselves to God. Of recognizing what matters and being able to voice that. Communicating a feeling or relationship can be as difficult as describing the color green if we don't know the word for it.

And the other level of communicating we need to be concerned with is with each other. Talking about our faith can be challenging if we are not used to doing so, and even more so, when we may not share the same history or beliefs as the other person. In the different Gospels and letters of the New Testament, they were speaking to different groups of people, and so they would use different examples that were familiar. Different Christians can have slightly different understandings, as can Jews, or Muslims, or even consider agnostics or atheists, but are we making the effort to hear and speak to them that is needed, or does it just come across as completely unintelligible?

As we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, let us be aware of how important, and challenging, it can be to communicate about what really matters, but also know the Holy Spirit wants to help us.

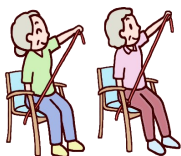

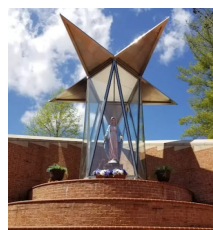
When: We meet on Tuesday/Thursday from 8:45am-9:45am in the Parish Center. If you can't make the first couple of classes, no problem—join when you can!

Assumption and St. Juan Diego Parishes are called to come together on Sunday, June 22, to celebrate The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as the Feast of Corpus Christi. Parishioners of all ages, please join us for the same one-mile procession as last year, as we celebrate the importance of the Real Presence in the Eucharist, while publicly affirming our faith.

Those interested should meet about noon (following their 11am Mass) at St. Juan Diego Parish (formerly St. Barnabas), and be prepared to process as a group down Main Street towards Assumption, while singing Eucharistic songs and hymns before stopping twice to pray. CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (FORMERLY RCIA)

As the Catholic Church prepares to celebrate Pentecost, which marks the establishment of the Catholic Church, many new converts to the faith at Assumption are marking their 50th day as Catholics. Some were drawn to the Church by the quiet example of others and some have had more dramatic encounters. Pentecost is a fitting time to welcome new members into the Church, as scripture records that “about three thousand people were baptized on that day.” (Acts 2:41). It is also an occasion for those of us who are already members of Christ’s body to commit ourselves anew to life in the Spirit. The feast of Pentecost is a day of thanksgiving for the coming of the Holy Spirit and for the establishment of the sacrament of confirmation. It is a day on which we place a joyful and grateful trust in the operation of the Holy Spirit within us, and thank him for His inspiration and guidance. On this day, we again place ourselves in the hands of the Holy Spirit with complete confidence.

Today marks the close of the final phase of RCIA but the beginning of a lifelong journey. At the 8am Mass, the neophytes (a new convert) and their families, will be sent out as disciples to share the light of Christ. The symbolism of the light of Christ began in their first meeting when a candle was lit and continued to be lit at each meeting. A thank you to our men's group for providing breakfast after mass.

Christians are continually called upon to consider what it will cost them to live according to the mystery of Christ's death and resurrection, into which they have been initiated through Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This sacramental union with Christ also beckons all of us to go into the world "to carry out the mission of the entire people of God in the Church and in the world."

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of the Faithful; and enkindle in them the fire of Thy love. Send forth Thy Spirit and they shall be created and thou shalt renew the face of the earth.
