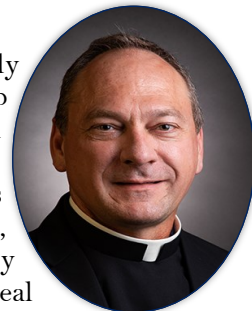

Hello,

Today, we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. A big question that usually comes up with Catholics is about what percentage of Catholics believe in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. The answers to this can vary greatly depending upon how the question was asked and who was asked (those who go to Mass weekly, 95%, monthly, 80%, or all who are Catholic, 64%). There is one study from 2019 that says only one third of Catholics believe in the Real Presence in the Eucharist, but this study and its methodology have been questioned. I thought I would expand this question a little more and consider which faiths we believe have the Real Presence in the Eucharist, and in which faiths do they teach that they have the Real Presence in the Eucharist.



If we are just going by Wikipedia, they give a long list of faiths that believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist: Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, Oriental Orthodox and Assyrian, Lutheran, Moravian, Reformed and Baptists, Anglican, Methodist, Irvingian, Anabaptist, and Zwinglian. However, even with this list, there are plenty of qualifiers on what the different faiths believe Real Presence to mean that varies greatly from what the Catholic Church teaches.

From my experiences, I would have probably given a more limited list, which includes: Catholic, Orthodox, Anglican and Lutheran (or at least some Lutherans), even within that I know the Lutheran understanding is different from that of the Catholic Church. One way we can grow in our understanding of what others believe about the Eucharist, is how they treat the Eucharist in their own practices. This cannot only give us an understanding of what they believe, but hopefully will also help us to consider how we treat the Eucharist and what it shows about what we believe.

I mentioned earlier about the difference between which faiths believe in the Real Presence in the Eucharist and the faiths that the Catholic Church teaches have the Real Presence in the Eucharist. This not only has to do with how the words, the Real Presence, are understood, but also our belief on what is necessary for the Eucharist. For a church to have valid sacraments of the Eucharist, they need to have kept the substance of Eucharistic teaching, the sacrament of orders, and apostolic succession. That means to have what we consider a valid Eucharist with the Real Presence, they need to have valid priests.

So why does it have to be so complicated? Because it isn't just what we believe that matters, but also what is the truth. What we believe should lead our actions, and if what we believe is true, those actions lead us to where we are meant to go. Being open to discuss our understanding of the Eucharist in comparison with that of others will hopefully help us, and others, to grow in our understanding of the truth and strengthen our faith, making us more open to be united to God and receive him fully into our lives.

JOIN OUR CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION SUNDAY, JUNE 22

Assumption and St. Juan Diego Parishes are called to **come together on the afternoon of Sunday, June 22, to celebrate The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as the Feast of Corpus Christi.** Parishioners of all ages are invited to participate in a one-mile procession to celebrate the importance of the Real Presence in the Eucharist, while publicly affirming their faith.

Participants should meet at noon at the front doors of St. Juan Diego Parish (formerly St. Barnabas Church). We will join their parishioners as they begin the procession at the end of their 11am Mass. Together as a group, we will process down Main St. towards Assumption, singing Eucharistic songs and hymns before stopping twice to pray. Altars will be set up at the Jehling's Hardware parking lot and Len's Auto Repair, as we proclaim the Word of God and give a Eucharistic blessing. The procession ends with benediction in our Chapel, where the Blessed Sacrament is reposed and placed in the tabernacle. At the end of Assumption's noon Mass, those present can process over to the Chapel as the procession from St. Juan Diego arrives.

After the procession, everyone is encouraged to stay and enjoy light refreshments in the Assumption Parish Center located below the Church.

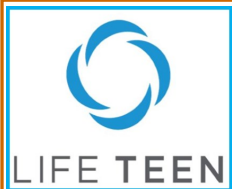
