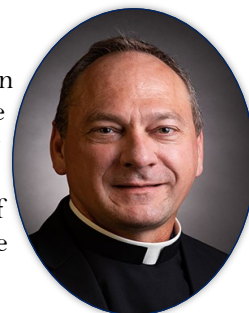

Hello,

Today, we are finally back to a Sunday of Ordinary Time, even though the Easter Season ended with Pentecost on June 8. Since then, we have had The Most Holy Trinity, The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), and The Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul last weekend. Nothing against any of those feasts, but sometimes you need to get back to ordinary life without the special celebrations each week.



When we have the special feasts, we can ignore some of the day-to-day things at times. I realized that today, as I put on a pair of pants that I had just been avoiding because I knew I had a hole in a pocket and hadn't gotten to sewing it – in our lives that can be the kind of things that we put off when we have excuses of other things that take priority. But, when we are on a regular schedule those are the type of things we just have to take care of.

In our spiritual lives, we need to take care of such things too. Most of us have a fairly regular Sunday Mass routine; the Mass we go to, even the spot we sit (I know I do), and then often what we might do after Mass. Some might consider that being stuck in a rut. But hopefully it can be a way in which we are especially open to pray at these times, to receive the Eucharist, maybe to reflect on our last week or coming week and to see how God is going to be with us and might direct us in what we do.

That might be Sunday, but hopefully we also have other good daily practices as far as when we pray and how. Anything from meal prayers, maybe when we first get up or go to bed, or specific times in the day. Many people stop by our chapel regularly, pray a rosary daily, or maybe have some daily reflections or Bible passages they read. This can be ordinary stuff for us.

But the hole in the pocket type can be regular spiritual upkeep too. Instead of a hole, there might be some temptations in our life we need to address; changing habits to avoid them, praying to God for help and forgiveness, maybe going to Confession if it is serious enough – that doesn't have to be saved for just Easter or Christmas.

Times of celebration and feasts are great, but we need God most importantly in our lives every day. God isn't meant just for Christmas and Easter, or even just for Sunday, but like family that we celebrate the big things in our lives with, one of the reasons we celebrate with them then is because they are with us through all the ordinary parts too.

OUR LADY QUEEN OF PEACE SHRINE MASS WEDNESDAY, JULY 9, 7PM

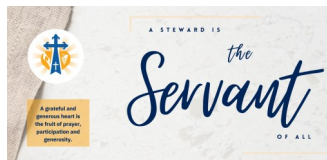

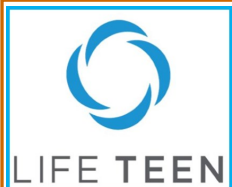
