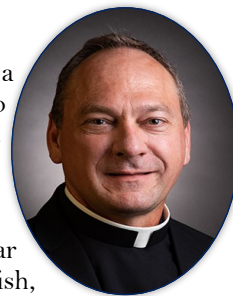

Hello,

Last week, we celebrated the feast of St. Maximilian Kolbe. He was a Franciscan priest in Poland who is known for volunteering his life so that another man may live in the concentration camp at Auschwitz during World War II. I have always known that about him, but I must admit, not much more.



He was born Raimund Kolbe in what was called Russian Poland near the town of Lodz on January 7, 1894. His mother is described as Polish, but his father German and they were likely members of the Franciscan Third Order that was widespread in that area at that time. At the age of 10, he had a vision of Mary who appeared to him with two crowns, or garlands, one that was white and the other red. Mary asked him to choose, the white one meaning that he would remain pure, and the red one that he would die a martyr, and he chose both. From childhood on, he was very smart, and in 1907, when he was 13, he and his older brother, Frank, were accepted into a junior seminary. After joining the Franciscans and taking the name Maximilian, he was sent to Rome in 1912 to study at the Gregorian University. While he was there, he became more devoted to Mary. When he had a thumb that was infected and was at the point of being amputated and he used Lourdes water in a dressing, he put on it and it started healing. He attributed this healing to Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception, or in Latin, the *Immaculata*, or in Polish *Niepokalana*. He would also grow in his interest in communication or publishing while in Rome as well as witnessing the Catholic Church under attack by different groups.

When he went back to Poland, he would start printing a magazine called *The Knights of the Immaculata*. He would both write and preach in a manner that was easy for people to understand and while his friary was starting to attract many to the Order, he would become sick with tuberculosis. After a year and a half of medical care, he would return and soon be publishing numerous magazines and papers and continually looking to expand.

In 1930, he would go with four other Franciscan brothers to Nagasaki, Japan to establish another *Niepokalanow*, and within a month were printing a magazine there for the Japanese and had established a settlement. Before returning to Poland in 1936, he would also go to India to found another *Niepokalanow*.

In Poland, his community would continue to grow in numbers and publications until 1939. At that time they would tell most of the Franciscan brothers to go back to their families out of fear of what the SS was doing, and the remaining were imprisoned in a camp. After months, they were released but he would then again be imprisoned in an effort to suppress Polish inteligencia in May of 1941 and be taken to the German concentration camp at Auschwitz. His poor health would not help him in the harsh conditions of the camp. In July, a prisoner from his block of the camp would escape and as a punishment, 10 men from the camp were chosen to be executed by starvation. When Maximilian offered to die in place of one of the 10 men, it was expected that he would just be shot and the 10 men would all still die, but instead the guard allowed him to take the place of Franz Gajowniczek who had a wife and two children outside of the camp. The 10 men were locked in a bunker to die. After two weeks, the camp was in need to use the bunker and found that four of them men were still alive but unconscious, and Maximilian was alive and conscious. They put him to death by an injection into his arm on August 14, 1941. Maximilian was beatified in 1971 by Pope Paul VI and then would be canonized a saint in 1982 by Pope John Paul II with Franz Gajowniczek present.

It is good to know not only the final act of a saint that they might be mostly recognized for, but also the life that led them to that point so we may also live in a way preparing ourselves to selflessly choose to follow Christ.

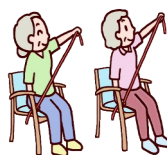

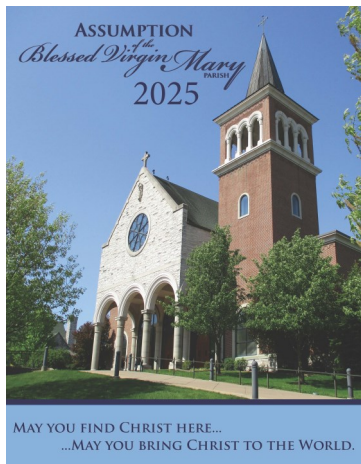

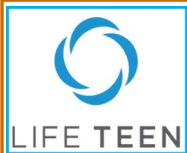
As we begin this year's journey together, let us turn to the Lord:
