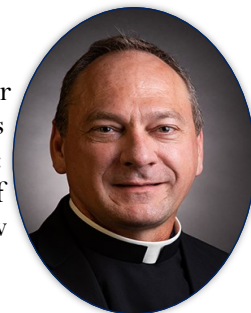

Hello,

Over the past week, I have had a variety of questions or comments come up regarding 'how do you know if a Bible is a Catholic Bible?' This can mean a few different things: What books are included in the Bible? What translations of the Bible should I use? or What should I look for to know that a Bible is approved by the Catholic Church?



What Books are included in the Bible? This goes back to the Council of Rome in 382 when the 73 books that comprise the Bible, 46 books in the Old Testament and 27 in the New Testament, was set and then affirmed as having been inspired by God at subsequent councils. The Catholic Old Testament includes seven books that are not included in Protestant Bibles: Tobit, Judith, Wisdom, Sirach, Baruch, 1 Maccabees, and 2 Maccabees. Various reasons are given for why these books were not included in the Protestant Bible, such as theological teachings that may be inconsistent with their beliefs and whether those books were quoted in the New Testament. A major concern for the books of the Old Testament was what were considered to be part of Hebrew Scriptures. The Septuagint was an ancient Greek translation of the Hebrew Scriptures that served as a foundation for the Old Testament, but the Protestants instead used a Hebrew translation that did not contain the books listed above. It should be noted that there are also additional verses in the Books of Esther and Daniel in Catholic Bibles that are not found in Protestant Bibles.

Without looking at the list of the books in the Bible you can also identify a Catholic Bible because it will have two signs of approval in it, an *Imprimatur* and a *Nihil Obstat*. The *Nihil Obstat* means that there is nothing objectionable or nothing stands in the way of this book being read and is given after a theological review. The *Imprimatur* means 'let it be printed' and is given by a bishop. These can also be found in other books of religious teachings.

A final difference between different Bibles is the translation. None of the original texts were written in English, and since my Greek, Hebrew and Aramaic should not be trusted, I rely on an English translation of the texts. Typical Catholic translations (that were given an *Imprimatur* and *Nihil Obstat*) are the New American Bible (NAB), the Revised Standard Version (RSV) and the New Revised Standard Version (NRSV). For centuries, the Latin translation known as the *Vulgate* was the standard version that was referenced. The King James Version (KJV) was completed in 1611 and made for Protestants. There are versions of the KJV that have all of the books contained in the Catholic Bible but I am not aware of any that have an *Imprimatur*.

If you thought that was more complicated than you expected, did you know that Protestants and Catholics have different versions of the 10 commandments? (Don't worry – basically the same text but just cut up differently, so watch out if you just refer to the number of a commandment or someone might blush, but that is for another week.)

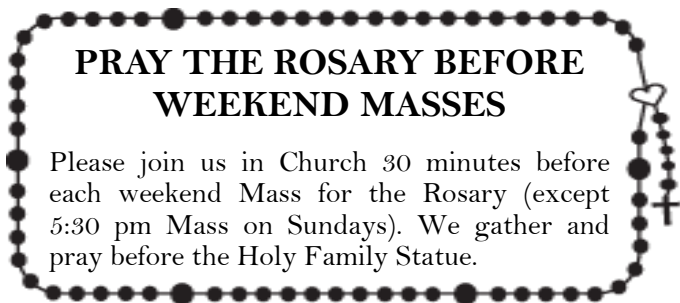
ASSUMPTION PRAYER CHAPEL

ASSUMPTION GRIEF SUPPORT GROUP BEGINS SEPTEMBER 4



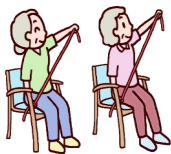
It is hard to imagine that there could be any life at the other end of our grief.

Congratulations to our own Debbie Gentry for being nominated for Catholic Women of the Year 2025 – Heart of the Church. One of only a handful of women from throughout the Archdiocese of St. Louis, Debbie will be recognized at the annual St. Joseph Evangelization Network Awards Dinner held at the Hilton St. Louis Frontenac, Sunday, September 14.

Debbie truly lives out the words of Mother Teresa, “You don't have to do great things, just little things with great love.” We both see her “always doing things with great love,” whether the task is big or small. Her life is a testament to this truth. From founding ministries like MOPS, now renamed MomCo, and Advent by Candlelight years ago to her more recent, tireless work, her impact is immense. She serves the youth group not just by showing up, but by taking on massive roles like organizing meals for 150 teens on retreat. After retiring from a long career as a physical therapist, she started her own business to serve the wellness of seniors in our community. She commits years to programs like Lay Formation to deepen her own faith. This, on top of serving on Parish

Council, the school board, helping with marriage prep, and countless other tasks, shows a woman who truly sees a need and does it because she feels it is what she is called to do.

So many people, in so many ways, have seen the face of Jesus through Debbie's eyes because she sees them as Jesus does. And, she not only sees them, she feels for them, and then acts to help. Jesus has taught us that both a priest and a Levite saw the need of the man who was beaten and striped and left for dead on the road to Jericho (Luke 10:29-37), but there was one who saw the need, and then took time, effort and resources to act upon the need. Debbie is the “neighbor” to all in need. She epitomizes the verse, “We love because he first loved us.” (1 John 4:19).

PRINCIPAL'S PEN

This week, our students in grades K–8 will be taking the Fall NWEA MAP Growth assessments in reading and math. The NWEA (Northwest Evaluation Association) tests are adaptive assessments, which means the difficulty of the questions adjusts based on each child's responses. This provides a more accurate picture of a student's current academic level and growth over time.

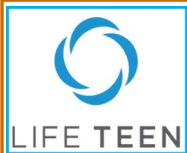
The results from these assessments are not about passing or failing. Instead, they help teachers identify areas where a child is excelling as well as areas where extra support may be needed. This information guides instruction in the classroom and allows us to tailor learning experiences to meet the needs of each individual student. Most importantly, we remind our students that these tests do not measure their worth, talents, or faith. They are one tool among many that helps us nurture both their minds and their hearts.

We ask for your prayers this week that our students may feel calm and confident, doing their very best to show what they know. May God continue to bless them with a love of learning and the knowledge that they are deeply valued as children of God.

On behalf of our teachers and students, thank you to our parish community for your continued prayers, encouragement, and support of Catholic education. Together, we are helping our children grow in both faith and knowledge.
