Hello,

Christmas season officially ends tomorrow when we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, so we can now ask ourselves, how was this Christmas season? I guess that leads to the question, how do you measure it, how do you determine if it was a good or bad Christmas? I guess most of us will go back to a childhood criteria of what did I get? Was it the gifts I had asked for? The ones I was hoping for? Or sometimes, even more than I had ever hoped for? (A very good Christmas) That



can sound like a pretty shallow criteria, and yet, depending on what "the gifts we were hoping for" it might be a pretty good criteria.

A good way to think about what the "gift" we should be hoping for, is what is Christmas about? The gift of Jesus Christ, God born as man among us. But like we see this Sunday on the feast of the Epiphany when the three wise men came and found this gift, found Christ laying in the manger (a pretty good Christmas), but others didn't. Herod didn't, his chief priests and scribes didn't. But along with the three kings, we also heard of shepherd's who found Christ at the message of an angel, Simeon and Anna who were waiting and were there in the temple the day Jesus was brought to be presented to the Lord. All of these had a very easy way to measure that it was a good Christmas, as they recognized, realized, and gave thanks for the blessing of having witnessed that Christ had come and was now with them. For us, over 2000 years later, celebrating that day is a little different, hopefully we are giving thanks for that great blessing we were given, but we were also hopefully preparing throughout Advent for how we can be more open to recognize, realize, and give thanks for Christ in our lives today.

Hopefully we are open to Christ in the sacraments. Most obviously in the Eucharist and the Masses that we have celebrated together through this season. But also in the sacrament of Reconciliation in which we are open to God in His forgiveness. Open to Christ in Scripture, not only when we celebrate the sacraments, but even in our popular culture, evident in Christmas carols, Christmas pageants, even things from cartoons (Charlie Brown Christmas special) to lawn decorations can reinforce God's words to us. Another special way we can be open to Christ is how He comes to us in one another, in family and friends, even some strangers we may have been with. And going back to what we started with, in gifts that we received or gave to one another. Not ranking them by a monetary or selfish value, but rather ones where we know they were given out of true love and care for another, and received with a recognition of this great blessing we have.

I would like to take this opportunity for a final wish of a Merry Christmas to all this season and a thank you for the many different ways you have been able to bring Christ to me and others this year, I hope you got even more than you hoped for this Christmas season.


## **DONUT SUNDAY IS BACK IN 2024!**

## **EPIPHANY HOME BLESSING**



One interesting custom for Epiphany is for families to ask God's blessing on our own homes. The ritual calls for parents to mark, with blessed chalk, the main entrance door with the initials of the Magi and a code of the current year. This year's mark will be 20 + C + M + B + 24

The numbers stand for the year in which the blessing is inscribed (2024). The letters stand for the names traditionally given the Magi who found the Christ

Child: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They are also an abbreviation for the Latin blessing: Christus mansionem benedicat, or "Christ bless this dwelling." Blessed chalk will be available after masses this weekend.

Before the blessing, gather your family at the main entrance to your home. All make the sign of the cross.

Parent: "Let us praise God, who fills our hearts and homes with peace. Blessed be God forever."

Family: "Blessed be God forever"

Parent or reader: (reading from Sacred Scripture) "And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage." Matt 2:10-11

Parent imparts the blessing: "Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill them with the light of Christ, that their concern for others may reflect Your love. We ask this though Christ, our Lord."

Family: "Amen"

Then the parent sprinkles holy water on those gathered and sprinkles it about the home.



## Assumption— School Improvement Process (SIP)

Three years ago, we were suppose to go through a process known as the School Improvement Process (SIP), which was delayed due to COVID. We are now entering the improvement phase again through the Archdiocese of St. Louis and the State of Missouri. This process, outlined below, provides certification from the State. The process follows a seven year cycle and will initially involve faculty, staff, parents, Board members. Once the initial phase is completed, a team of educators will visit from other schools

(both public and private) to review our plan for improvement and make commendations as well as recommendations. Most importantly, this allows our community to determine our path forward in areas of Catholic Identify, Educational Areas (Curriculum), and Institutional Areas (Safe and Secure Environment).

Here is the process: The Office of Catholic Education and Formation has developed an instrument to assist schools in a systematic process of school improvement. The process covers a seven year cycle and involves five phases:

## 1. Preparation Phase

The purpose of the preparation phase is to give the school the opportunity to review and revise as needed their philosophy, mission and school-wide curriculum goals prior to engaging in the needs assessment process. It also provides time for developing the school profile, surveying various constituencies, and collecting additional data that is needed for other phases of the process.

#### 2. Needs Assessment

The purpose of the needs assessment is to serve as an evaluation and planning vehicle for school improvement. It enables the school to measure existing quality, to demonstrate compliance with standards and to identify growth opportunities for attaining even higher levels of performance. As a result of the mutual effort and cooperation necessary for the needs assessment, all members of the school community will have a better understanding of the total program of the school.

Students must live in St. Charles County, St. Louis City, St. Louis County or Jefferson County to qualify. And Meet One of the Following

> Have a Certified IEP or ISP Attend a Private School

## 100% Free & Reduced Lunch Eligible

Attended a public or charter public school for one semester within the year prior to applying

Entering Kindergarten or 1st Grade

## 3. Plan for Improvement

The purpose of the Plan for Improvement is to consolidate all the work from the needs assessment and develop a five year plan for improving the Catholic Identity, educational and organizational effectiveness of the school. The plan consists of:

- Identification of the target areas needing improvement
- A clearly defined goal statement for each of the target areas
- ♦ Specific strategies to address the target area
- Plan for assessing achievement of the improvement goal
- Assignment of responsibility
- ♦ Evidence of implementation

The purpose of the Team visit is to provide an objective evaluation of the Plan for Improvement from a group of professional educators.

## 5. Implementation and Monitoring of the Plan

The purpose of implementing the plan is to improve the overall quality of the school by putting into operation the action plans for each growth opportunity. Regular monitoring of the plan will measure progress toward goal attainment and provide evaluative information on reasons for success or non-success, afford opportunity for revisions if necessary and facilitate communication of progress on the Plan to the entire school community.

Monitoring will occur through year seven (7), at which time, the next cycle begins.

With this being the year Pope Francis has dedicated to prayer, please know my prayers are for our Assumption parish, and our day and PSR school communities!
