

Hello,

This Sunday, the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, was designated by Pope Francis in 2019 as **Sunday of the Word of God**. A special day in which we are to give special attention and reverence to the Bible. It goes on to say you really should do this all year, but every now and then we need some emphasis to give some focus, so we have today.



How do we read the Bible? As Catholics, I know one of the ways in which we hear the Bible is at Mass. The Church has managed to establish different passages from the Old Testament, the New Testament, and the Gospel that we hear at Mass on a rotating basis that exposes us to much of the Bible. This also gives emphasis on the passages that are repeated every year or even more than once a year (the Transfiguration is a big one) that we can recall readily. And it is good to read in shorter sections so we can pause and reflect on what is being said, but sometimes we need to read longer passages too, to understand the context and the flow of the passage, the book of the Bible, and even the entire Bible itself.

A popular podcast over the last few years has been Fr. Mike Schmitz's **Bible in a Year**' where instead of reading, you could actually listen to him read the passages, then also provide some commentary about the passages. For many, this is a good way to help them stay disciplined to actually continue through the entire Bible. If you are listening to the podcast or reading through on your own in a similar manner, having the commentary that can also be found in footnotes or other sections of many Bibles can be very helpful to not misinterpret what is meant. But this can be a little too structured at times and we can miss the way God is speaking to us personally and individually in Scriptures.

Lectio Divina, or literally divine reading, is another means to read the Bible that recognizes that this is not just a novel, but God's words and a means by which He is speaking to us. By slowly reading small passages and being willing to allow God to tell us when to stop and pause on various words or phrases we can truly make this reading become a prayer, allowing God to speak to us and responding to his words.

A final way in which some are open to Scripture in a daily discipline is through devotional booklets. There are a wide variety of these that often take just a short passage from one of the daily readings and have a short quote or reflection on them. Some of the Lenten or Advent pamphlets we put out help us with some daily prayer in these seasons.

No one of these ways is best, nor is any one way complete, but all are means to be open to the fullness of how God is speaking to us in the Bible. Whatever means you use to read or listen to the Word of God remember that this Sunday is a special day to remind you about it, but that it is meant for every day.

You CAN Afford Catholic Education

There are many avenues for families to have Assumption School tuition completely funded or to receive tuition assistance for the year. Whether you are wanting to attend Assumption, currently attending Assumption, or currently have children in the public school system, I would ask that you consider reading the following information, and then going to the TODAY and TOMORROW Education Foundation (TTEF) website, ttef-stl.org. TTEF supports families in need of financial assistance to attend Catholic schools. The website provides information on all of the scholarships identified below, except the Assumption Parish Tuition Assistance Fund. The Assumption Parish offers tuition assistance to families after they have applied to the TTEF application. Once the family has applied and received information from TTEF, they may submit a request to Mark Vogt, Business Manager at the Parish Office. Even if a family received nothing from TTEF, they may still be eligible to receive parish funding. Today & Tomorrow Educational Foundation (TTEF) Parish Scholarships

The application process opens at 8 a.m., January 22 on a FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED basis and also is the same application used by our parish financial aid committee. Don't delay! Many families will qualify! Scan the QR Code and go to "Apply for Scholarships" on the webpage. We encourage ALL FAMILIES to

MO Scholars is the most recent addition to the TTEF scholarships. This program does have pre-qualifications that must be met, but if qualified, the amount provided is full tuition plus books and fees (\$6,300). If you attend Assumption and have an IEP or ISP, you are eligible! Eligibility info and the pre-qualification QR code is noted below.



MOScholars Scholarships

The application process begins at 8 a.m., February 1. All interested families should apply! Scan the QR Code and then take the prequalification survey. Last year, we had 10 recipients and this year we expect many Scan me more in 2024!



The following general scholarships are accessible through one TTEF application:

Alive! In Christ: In an effort to increase and retain enrollment of children in Catholic elementary schools, the "Alive! in Christ" Scholarship Program seeks to provide financial assistance to those families (both Catholic and Non-Catholic) who wish to offer their children an education at a Catholic elementary school in the archdiocese. Scholarship awards are based upon financial need of the applicant and will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.

Beyond Sunday: Funded through contributions to the Beyond Sunday campaign, the Beyond Sunday Education Fund Scholarship Program provides tuition assistance to middle-income families seeking a Catholic education for their children. Awards are available to students attending most Catholic elementary and high schools in the Archdiocese of St. Louis. Beyond Sunday is open to students of all faiths, with preference given to Catholic students. Elementary school awards renew through the eighth grade, and high school awards renew through the twelfth grade. Annual income requalification is required for all awards.

Catholic Family Tuition Assistance: The people of the Archdiocese of St. Louis established this endowed fund through their contributions to the Returning God's Gifts campaign. This ten million dollar endowment was established in May, 1999. Grants are made on the basis of financial need as determined by the application process. Grants may be used for Catholic children to attend an archdiocesan or parochial elementary school or an archdiocesan or parochial high school.

Early registration for current school families begins Friday, January 19. During this time, only returning families may start the registration process online. This will ensure Assumption students retain their seat in the classroom before open enrollment begins on Sunday, January 28, from 11am-12:30pm during the annual Open House. Along with current families attending Assumption Open House, potential students in Pre-K-8th grade and their families are invited to tour our school and meet our certified teachers, professional staff, and outstanding administration. 
