Hello,

This week we look at the second episode in 'the Search' series. The first episode focused on very basic questions we have about what motivates us in life, what fulfills or satisfies us, 'What do you Seek?' The second episode asks and starts a discussion of the question, 'Who Are You?' (log onto 'Formed.org', **Sign In** if you have been on this site before, **Sign Up** if this is your first time – then go to the Program 'the Search')



"To find clues as to the meaning of life, we first look at ourselves. Who am I? Is there more to me than matter? Is there more to us than meets the eye? We talk with neuroscientists, psychologists, composers, and artists to examine the mystery of you. If you're just a body, then satisfaction in life should come from tending to simple bodily needs. Fill your stomach, be comfortable. But there's more to you than that. You are material and immaterial. And that unseen part of you craves for so much more. As C.S. Lewis once said, "If we find ourselves with a desire that nothing in this world can satisfy, the most probable explanation is that we were made for another world."" (Formed's introduction to the episode)

Just looking at each human being in a merely physical way it is amazing how unbelievably complex our physical bodies are, and yet we are even more than that. From ancient time philosophers have talked about the soul, a part of each person that is not material, and not limited by our physical life. This episode addresses some of the evidence of the soul, the connection and distinction between our soul and body. If we didn't have a soul, would we just be an intelligent animal? And if that was the case what would that say about how we should treat people, and how we should treat animals, and why? What we believe about our bodies and souls dictates how we should treat one another and how we should act. But sometimes we might want to consider what it says when we look at how we do treat one another and how we act, and if that is consistent with what we believe?

'ALL THINGS NEW' UPDATE APPEAL OF ASSUMPTION SUBSUMING ST. BARNABAS PARISH

On the decree issued on May 24, 2023, Archbishop Rozanski stated that Assumption Parish would *subsume* St. Barnabas Parish effective August 1, 2023.

This week, the Dicastery for the Clergy notified the Archdiocese of St. Louis that they had accepted for study petitions for recourse (an appeal) against decrees related to St. Barnabas in O'Fallon. In accepting this petition, the Vatican does not reverse the archbishop's decision, but it has agreed to review the decision at the request of the petitioner. While there had only been rumors, and no official knowledge, of such an appeal up until now, all financials and records from St. Barnabas have been kept segregated and no decisions have been or will be made regarding the parish that would be difficult to reverse until the Dicastery makes the final decision.

The decision to study the acts of decrees of St. Barnabas Parish being subsumed by Assumption Parish in O'Fallon does not call into question the lawful existence of the personal parish of St. Juan Diego, which was established by a separate decree.

I will continue to keep you updated on any developments as I become aware of them.

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (February 14, 2024), all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (March 29, 2024) are days of *abstinence* (refraining from meat) for all Catholics *from age 14 onwards*. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, *fast*, as well as *abstinence*, is also obligatory for those *from the ages of 18-59*. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

If you have dried-out palms from last year folded behind a crucifix or some other religious picture in your home, please DO NOT THROW THEM AWAY.

According to the Code of Cannon Law, blessed items must be treated with respect and reverence and not thrown in the trash. Instead, drop them in the baskets, located in the Narthex of

the church. before Ash Wednesday, Feb. 14. Another option is to burn the ashes and then bury them. This type of disposal honors the blessed palms sacred purpose by returning them to the Earth in a dignified way.



RCIA: THE RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

RCA This weekend the RCIA team met with each individual to explore the direction in which their faith journey is leading them. God is definitely in charge of these individuals. We have witnessed there conversion and pray that you too will continue praying for us. Starting with Ash Wednesday, we begin our Lenten journey and The Purification and Enlightenment period. Next weekend, we celebrate the Rite of Sending at the 8am Mass and Rite of Election in the afternoon. So what does this mean? The Rite of Election formally concludes this part of their journey and begins a new period. In the afternoon, these men, women and sponsors celebrate the Rite of Election at the Cathedral with the Bishop. God is choosing those, who are able, to be disciples of Jesus. Those chosen are expected to be initiated into a life in Christ, The godparents' present their testimony to the Bishop that these men and women are ready to continue their journey to receive sacraments at the Easter Vigil. Their names are presented and accepted by the bishop.

As a family, have your children draw pictures for them. Write prayers and welcome on the back of these cards. We need these returned by March 17. There will be a box in the Narthex marked RCIA Prayer Cards. The cards are returned to them on our spiritual retreat day on March 24.

Those not baptized will now be called The Elect. In the coming weeks we will spend more time on spiritual reflection. This is a time that we invite the whole community to walk our journey with us. We will focus on those things that we need to "fix" in our life. This is a time of spiritual renewal, conversion and inner reflections. During this period the Catechumens (The Elect) and the Candidates undertake a number of Rites, including the Scrutiny's and Presentations. They look to the Church to help them deepen their commitments and purify their hearts.



SPECIAL COLLECTIONS DURING FEBRUARY

- Debt Reduction: Donations to this collection will pay down the balance of Assumption's loan from the Archdiocese, which we borrowed in 2013 to fund the expansion of the school building.
- Education Fund: Contributions to the Education Fund are used to provide tuition assistance to parents that want a Catholic education for their children but can't afford it.
- St. Vincent de Paul: Your contribution provides direct help to the poor in our local community. Since 1845, Vincentians have met face-to-face with individuals and families in poverty to provide support and help them through the most desperate times. Through your generosity, you help people struggling to survive, providing: clothing, shelter, food, medicine and more.
