Hello.

Lent starts again this Wednesday, and with it another set of days of fasting and abstinence. Traditionally Lent is known as 40 days of fasting before Easter, but there are some problems if you get out a calendar and start counting the number of days from Ash Wednesday to Easter. Not that I don't trust this, but most liturgists didn't get the best grades in math class, and also it is always good to know the reason why something may be different than we expect.

First, if you count from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday you will get 4 days for Ash Wednesday up to the First Sunday of Lent, and then 42 days for the 6 weeks of lent, totaling 46 days, so we know that is wrong. But Sunday's are not counted as days of Lent since they, like Easter, are celebrating the resurrection of Christ. It wouldn't be a day that was proper for fasting or penance since we are celebrating Christ's Resurrection. So 46 - 6 = 40, that wasn't so hard. But it also brings up arguments I have heard in many households, if you gave something up (your fast) or are doing something daily for Lent should you also maintain that practice on Sunday? As Sunday's are not meant to be days of penance or fasting it would make sense that you do not. But at the same time, depending on what you have chosen it may be appropriate. An example a friend gave me was that if you know you have the habit of swearing and were going to make a special effort by giving that up for Lent, that would seem like a good thing to also give up on Sundays. But if you gave up ice cream, maybe having some on Sunday is a way of appropriately celebrating that day, just don't think you have to clean out the whole container.

Talking about Sundays though can also bring up another topic, what about special feast days? Then it depends on how high a feast it is. St. Patrick's Day is a feast day, but it doesn't take precedence over our Lenten practices (see the Lenten regulations for particulars about that this year). But two days that normally fall during Lent that are Solemnities, days when we even override the Sunday Lenten practice and we recite the Gloria at Mass. These are the Feast of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary (March 19th) and the Feast of the Annunciation (March 25th). These are some of the things you learn in the seminary. But this year, since the Feast of St. Joseph falls on Sunday it doesn't' get skipped but actually gets transferred to that Monday, March 20th, instead of just letting the Sunday replace it.

One other conflict that comes up at times is the Sacred Triduum, which begins on Holy Thursday with the celebration of the Lord's Supper and ends the evening of Easter Sunday. Officially, Lent ends when we start the Triduum, but we realize that up to the Easter Vigil itself we are still in preparation for Easter, so those days still count in our 40 days of Lenten preparation. Hopefully that may answer a few questions, but don't get too legalistic and always remember that whatever our Lenten practices, we should be trying to grow closer to Christ.



The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (February 22, 2023), all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (April 7, 2023) are days of abstinence (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onwards. On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

Feast of Saint Patrick (March 17, 2023) falls on a Friday during Lent this year. Feasts of the Church are meant to be a day of celebration and rejoicing, so on this Friday, March 17, 2023, the faithful of the Archdiocese of St. Louis are dispensed from abstaining from meat should they choose to celebrate the Feast of Saint Patrick.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance

This weekend we conclude our study of the Sunday Liturgy in order to prepare for the final period in our program, The Period of Purification and Enlightenment. The readings this weekend calls us to love as God loves. We are called not only to love as God loves, but to love with God's love. It is in the community of the Church that we find our strength. No one can live Christianity all alone. It is a gradual process through which the Spirit of God "perfects" us. Is there anyone for whom you bear hatred in your heart? In what ways do you live by the rule "An eye for an eye"? Now is the time that we prepare for Rite of Sending/Election, to be held next weekend, taking stock and individual discernment with team.

"The period of purification and enlightenment, which the rite of election begins, customarily coincides with Lent. In the liturgy and liturgical catechesis of Lent the reminder of baptism already received or the preparation for its reception, as well as the theme of repentance, renew the entire community along with those being prepared to celebrate the paschal mystery in which each of the elect will share through the sacraments of initiation. For both the elect and the local community, therefore, the Lenten season is a time for spiritual recollection in preparation for the celebration of the paschal mystery" (RCIA 138).

"This is a period of more intense spiritual preparation, consisting more in interior reflection than catechetical instruction, and is intended to purify the hearts and minds of the elect" and to enlighten their minds and hearts "with a deeper knowledge of Christ the Savior" (RCIA 139).





Did You Know? The first Catholic school that opened in the

United State was called St. Mary's School in Philadelphia, in 1783. After some time, the enthusiasm and curiosity for Catholic education grew and the nation noticed a massive inflow of Catholics from all over the world. By the 1920s, more than 6,000 Catholic elementary schools accepted and enrolled almost two million students and employed 42,000 teachers. By the latter half of that century, enrollment grew, even more, reaching double the number of students. Ever since Catholic schools have been widely perceived and established as a viable means of education. Catholic Schools Week is the observance of catholic masses, assemblies, special luncheons, open houses, collecting donations, contests to raise money for charity and activities for students, parents, religious, teachers/staff, and community. 


MORE NEWS ABOUT OUR SCHOOL... MATH Comparison from Quarter 1 and Quarter 2:

The graph below represents student scores in math by grade level. In order to read the results, you first select a grade level, then see that there are 2 bars for that grade. **The first bar represents Quarter 1 of this year.**

Looking at the first bar, check the percentage of GREEN (which are students that are **BEYOND** the knowledge expected in reading for that grade), then BLUE (which represents the students that are **AT** where they are expected to be), YELLOW (which represents students who are **VERY CLOSE** to where they are expected), or RED (which represents students that are **NOT** where they are expected to be).

NOW... Take the 1st bar and compare it to the 2nd bar (showing Quarter 2): Are there more students in GREEN? If so, then, students moved up from the BLUE into the GREEN. Where is the BLUE? If this shows more then, students from YELLOW improved and moved to BLUE. Are there more students in Yellow? The students who were in RED, moved into the YELLOW. Where is RED? If the RED is less in Quarter 2, then some students improved and moved into YELLOW.

In reviewing all grade levels, our students are growing steadily and are moving into the GREEN (knowing beyond what is expected at that grade level) or into other higher levels of understanding and knowledge. For those who are having difficulty (in the RED), we continue to provide 1-1 and small group sessions with our Learning Consultants. Being in the RED group doesn't mean these students aren't capable – it means they learn differently and once shown other methods of learning and understanding, learn what is needed.


