Hello,

Today I wanted to update you on some of the finances for the parish, how we have done in the first 6 months of the fiscal year (July 2022-Dec 2022), and what we are looking towards for the future. Our primary sources of income are our offertory for the parish and tuition for the school. For the first three months, the offertory was about 13% below our budget, but has since improved and as of the end of the year was within about 1% (\$9,000) of the cumulative budget, due to higher contributions in November and December and a bequest and a large IRA distribution.

Our school tuition income has been down a little. While the number of students was at our projected number, there were a few more multi-child families (who re-

ceive a discount) than expected. Fortunately our Fall Festival fundraising exceeded our expectations by \$15,000 and has made up most of the shortfall in our budgeted income.

Our expenses fortunately have had few surprises. Our health insurance costs have been a little higher than budgeted due to more employees taking advantage of this benefit, but our total numbers are within 1% of our budget. One unexpected expense last Fall was the repair of a waterline break going to our concession stand with a total cost of \$21,000. Fortunately, we did not have any big surprises with our HVAC or other areas, so the waterline break was within our budget for unexpected expenses.

Looking to the future, one of the goals of All Things New is to strengthen our schools. It is recognized that this will require some consolidations and schools closing, hopefully increasing the number of students in the remaining schools to a more financially sustainable level and also allowing us to provide a more equitable salary for our teachers. While the consolidations have not yet occurred, a step is being taken to increase our teacher salaries by giving them a \$5,000 raise for the coming year. (Note: The 2022-2023 starting yearly salary at Archdiocese schools was \$12,000 below our local public school starting salary.)

The primary revenue for our school come from tuition and registration fees (66%), and then our parish support of the school (27%). Our school families responded to a survey that they (77%) were willing to accept higher tuitions to increase the salaries of our teachers. To address the increase in salaries, the tuition is being raised just over 10% for next year. But to balance the budget, the parish will also have to increase our contributions, from a projected support this year of \$624,000 to \$760,000 next year.

We are working to increase the number of students in our school (the primary means to keep tuition and required parish support down) and have been seeing some success, but this takes time. Meanwhile, as we have asked the school families to increase their support through the increased tuition, we are also asking all of our parishioners to increase their support. Our school is a vital part of our parish, a means to give our children the opportunity to be formed in our faith by the instruction and culture they experience each day not only in their families, but also in their school. Our teachers make a conscious sacrifice in foregoing greater salaries to teach in our Catholic schools, I hope we are willing to also support the future of our school, our parish, our Church, and our children.

Our Lenten journey begins! Lent begins the RCIA period of Purification and Enlightenment.

During this time, we join the rest of the church in prayer and sacrifice as we await the joy of Easter.

This weekend we celebrate the Rite of Sending at 8am mass. This ritual affirms the readiness of our Catechumens for the sacraments of initiation, and our Candidates for full reception into the Catholic church. At this rite, those chosen by God for baptism will be called forward by name to inscribe their name in the Book of the Elect. Our candidates, who were previously baptized, are called forward in recognition of their spiritual growth and preparation to be fully received into the Catholic church. The church affirms their readiness through testimony from their godparents, sponsors, and the entire community and then "sends" these chosen ones to be brought before Archbishop Rozanski at the Cathedral in the afternoon at the Rite of Election.

At the cathedral they are called by name and presented to Archbishop Rozanski. The archbishop confirms the names enrolled in the Book of the Elect as "The Elect", those chosen by God to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation & Eucharist at the Easter vigil. The bishop then recognizes the candidate's desire for full reception and participation in the sacramental life of the Church. He encourages their final preparation for the sacraments of Confirmation & Eucharist. To see the bigger picture...this ritual takes place not only in our area but in every diocese in the world! How powerful!

During Lent, the focus of the RCIA group becomes a stronger emphasis on prayer, inner reflection, and a spirit of repentance to bring us closer to Christ and his church.

In next Sunday's bulletin you will find prayer cards for each of our Elect and Candidates. We ask every man, woman, and child to please choose one person (or more) to journey with through prayer during Lent. More details to come next week!
