Hello,

This week is our last of seven episodes of 'the Search' series, and this episode is titled "Why a Church?" (log onto 'Formed.org', **Sign In** if you have been on this site before, **Sign Up** if this is your first time, then go to the Program 'the Search')



How do I access this man who lived 2000 years ago? How do I live this call of love? We uniquely encounter the love of God in His Church. But really? The Church? There are so many negative views of the Church. It's out of touch. It's full of bad people. It's just too boring. Maybe when we say "The Church" we mean a little more. The Church is the family of God that's been lovingly gathered through our entire story. It's the place we were meant to encounter His grace that prepares us for every step of life. The God that is love knows how we're made—material and spiritual—we need tangible ways to live our faith. We can't be spiritual but not religious. This is where we'll find ultimate happiness in life. This is where the God that has been seeking humanity, who wrote the deepest desires onto our human hearts, encounters us. Jesus' first words to humanity in the Gospel of John are "what do you seek?" The one that asked the question not only knows the answer, He is the answer. The answers to everything. And you find him most profoundly here in His Church. (Formed's introduction to this episode.)

This episode starts with a bit of a summary of the past episodes. Recognizing how many people consider themselves to be 'nones,' that is, they might be spiritual, but they don't consider themselves religious. If they do consider themselves spiritual, that is good, at least they recognize that they are more than just a physical body, and hopefully also realize there is a God. While God cares for each of us individually, that doesn't mean that we are to just be individuals, but rather that we are meant to be in community, the community of the Church. The challenge of community with others though is that people can mess things up, we sin.

Scandal in the Church is something that we shouldn't ignore or deny, but hopefully when we identify it, we recognize the need for forgiveness and change. It can be a temptation to not be a part of the Church, especially if we were harmed by a member or official of the Church, but we shouldn't easily dismiss this community that Christ founded, and the means by which he is present to us in the sacraments. Jesus was born as a man to be a means of our salvation. We continue that tie to Him through the sacraments and the Church. The question is about what we are searching for, what do we seek? I hope this series has helped us recognize that what we seek is a union with God, and with one another, that is to be found here, in the Catholic Church. And once we have found it, we should not only want to keep it, but also to share it with all others.

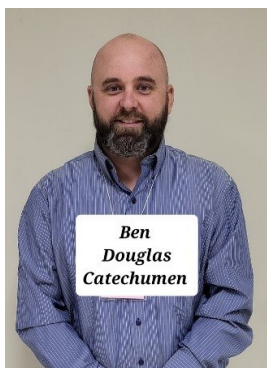


RCIA: THE RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

RCIA

Each week that we celebrate the Rite of Scrutiny, as we have for the past two Sundays during Lent, we are invited deeper and deeper into a great mystery that affects all people. Our world is thirsting, we are thirsting, and Jesus brings us living water. Our world is blind, we are blind, and Jesus opens our eyes. This weekend at the 8am Mass we hear the story of the raising of Lazarus. We will name what keeps us, our communities, and our society from life and the true freedom of the children of God. Our Lenten preparation calls us to name what keeps us enmeshed in death and to bring it to prayer. Each reflection and celebration of the Scrutinies is designed to draw forth a progressively deeper awareness of the mystery of sin and grace, week by week. They not only open up what is sinful in our lives, but also what is good in our lives. As we celebrate the last of the Scrutinies and Cycle A readings we look forward to our Spiritual Retreat Day scheduled for next Sunday.

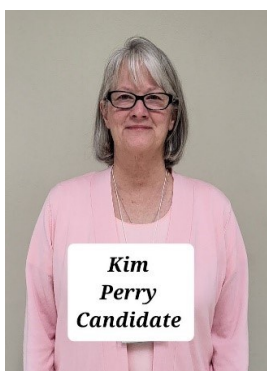

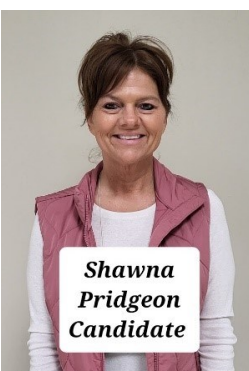

FUNERAL LUNCHEON VOLUNTEERS NEEDED



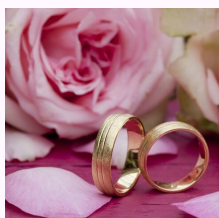
