Hello,

This week we celebrate Palm Sunday and begin Holy Week. I invite and encourage all of you to come to participate in our Triduum Services on Holy Thursday at 7pm, Good Friday at 7pm and on Holy Saturday at 8pm. Both today and on Good Friday, we will hear the Gospels of the Passion and crucifixion of Christ. A prayer and hymn that is often associated with this, and in particular with the Stations of the Cross, is the Stabat Mater.



First written in the 13th century it is believed to be authored by either a Franciscan named Jacopone da Todi, or Pope Innocent III, or possibly various others. Through the centuries it has been given numerous musical settings by various composers and numerous translations of the Latin text also exist. The first line, "Stabat Mater dolorosa," translates "the sorrowful mother stood," is the name and theme of the prayer of Mary standing at the foot of the cross. As it has been for many for centuries, maybe just reflecting on the prayer will help us realize both Mary and Christ's love for us, and how we may unite our sorrow and love with theirs. Stabat Mater

Mother bowed with grief appalling must thou watch, with tears slow falling, on the cross Thy dying son! Through my heart, thus sorrow riven, must that cruel sword be driven, as foretold—O Holy One! Oh, how mournful and oppressed was that Mother ever-blessed, Mother of the Spotless One: She, whose grieving was perceiving, contemplating, unabating, all the anguish of her Son! Is there any, tears withholding, Christ's dear Mother thus beholding, in woe—like no other woe! Who that would not grief be feeling for that Holy Mother kneeling—what suffering was ever so? For the sins of every nation she beheld his tribulation, given to scourgers for a prey: Saw her Jesus foully taken, languishing, by all forsaken, when his spirit passed away. Love's sweet fountain, Mother tender, haste this hard heart, soft to render, make me sharer in Thy pain. Fire me now with zeal so glowing, love so rich to Jesus, flowing, that I favor may obtain. Holy Mother, I implore Thee, crucify this heart before Thee, guilty it is verily! Hate, misprision, scorn, derision, thirst assailing, failing vision, railing, ailing, deal to me. In Thy keeping, watching, weeping, by the cross may I unsleeping live and sorrow for his sake. Close to Jesus, with Thee kneeling, all Thy dolours with Thee feeling, oh grant this—the prayer I make. Maid immaculate, excelling, peerless one, in heaven high dwelling, make me truly mourn with Thee. Make me sighing hear Him dying, ever newly vivifying the anguish He bore for me. With the same scar lacerated, by the cross enfired, elated, wrought by love to ecstasy! Thus inspired and affected let me, Virgin, be protected when sounds forth the call for me! May his sacred cross defend me, he who died there so befriend me, that His pardon shall suffice. When this earthly frame is riven, grant that to my soul is given all the joys of Paradise!

Holy Week happens on the last week of the season of Lent and is the most important week of the year. It begins on Palm Sunday and is a time for prayer and preparation for Easter. It marks the final stretch before Easter Sunday, the celebration of Jesus' Resurrection. Join us!

March 24: Palm Sunday – Mass at 8am, 10am, noon and 5:30pm

Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified. During Palm Sunday Mass, palms are distributed to parishioners as they enter Church before they are blessed. The Passion, the gospel passage that describes the suffering and death of Jesus in his last days, is read and we celebrate the Eucharist.

After 8am, 10am and noon Masses, children 12 and under, bring your Easter basket to the soccer field to help the Easter Bunny hunt for the plastic eggs filled with candy, toys, and prize slips.



March 28, 29 & 30: Morning Prayer at 8AM in the Chapel

Join us as we gather together for a special time of adoration in the Chapel on the morning of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.

March 28: Holy Thursday – Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7pm in the Church

The Triduum (Latin for "the Great Three Days") begins on Holy Thursday with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7pm in the Church. During Mass, we celebrate the institution of the Holy Eucharist and Christ's example of humility and charity as we reenact Jesus washing the feet of his apostles. At the end of Mass, the Eucharist is taken in solemn procession to the Altar of Repose in the Chapel. At the Altar of Repose, parishioners keep vigil in silent prayer and Eucharistic Adoration in our Chapel until midnight.

March 29: Good Friday – Life Teen Walk the Way Stations of the Cross at 3pm and Good Friday Service at 7pm in the Church

Good Friday reflects on Jesus' death by crucifixion. Remember with us the sacrifice Jesus made as we have the reading of the Passion and the veneration of the cross at this Communion service at 7pm in the Church.

Earlier in the day at 3pm, experience the Stations of the Cross from the perspective of Jesus through this experiential prayer service put on by our Life Teen Ministry. Sit in the Church and observe or be blindfolded while going through the motions.

March 30: Holy Saturday Easter Vigil – Mass at 8pm in the Church

On this holy night, the Church keeps watch, celebrating the resurrection of Christ in the sacraments and awaiting his return in glory. The celebration begins with the Easter fire outside, and makes its way back inside as the faithful light candles to illuminate the Church. This evening we renew our baptismal promises and celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation with those who have been preparing as we witness their Baptisms, entry into the Church, Confirmations and their First Communions.

March 31: Easter Sunday – Mass at 8am, 10am and noon in the Church, and 8:15am and 10:15am in the Chapel

The season of Easter is the most important of all liturgical times, which Catholics celebrate as the Lord's resurrection from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. The Mass celebrates the most important teaching in Catholic faith that Jesus died for our sins and rose from the dead so that we could share eternal life with him in heaven.

The RCIA team offer our thanks to all those present for the 8am Masses for the past four Sundays, and our parish community as a whole, who prayed for and with our candidates and our elect during the RCIA Scrutinies. Please continue to pray for our elect and candidates as they enter their final week of preparation for the sacraments of initiation.

As we near the end of the period of Purification and Enlightenment, we see the candidates developing a positive awareness of the baptism they have already received. The baptized candidates participate in the reflections on the Lenten Scriptures with the elect and share in all the spiritual preparations for and reflections on the Scrutinies. 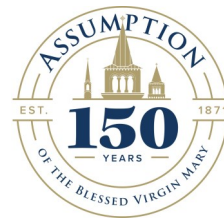

New Principal of Assumption Named

Jamie has served as our Early Childhood Division Leader for the last six years and has been a lead teacher for our pre-K programs. She possesses a Master's degree in Administration and has several years of teaching "under her belt." Her enthusiasm, faith, insight, openness to learning, and love of Assumption are a testament to her readiness for a Catholic leadership.



In the next few months, Jamie and I will work together to make sure the transition is not only as seamless as possible, but provides experiences necessary to know the behind the scene processes of the Archdiocese and those that are internal to Assumption.

One of the most important aspects of Jamie's administration will be working with varying committees, throughout the 24-25 school year, to develop our School Improvement Plan, which will outline the goals for Assumption over the next several years.

Please welcome Jamie, in her new role, as she paves the way to great success. Personally, I believe the future of Assumption School is on the path to continued success!

School Improvement Plan Process (Spring 2024–Spring 2025)



Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary School (pre-K–8) has been accredited through the State of Missouri Nonpublic School Accrediting Association without violation for the last six years.

Every seven years, our three committees are developed using faculty, staff, Board members, and parents who work to review data from surveys, data from standardized testing (ITBS and NWEA), and curriculum advances and programs, to develop goals for the next six years. These three committees then take the goals and create a "Plan of action for 2025-2031" that will be implemented over the next six years. This "Plan of Action" must be presented to the State of Missouri and the Archdiocese of St. Louis by January 2025. Finally, the culmination involves a team of educators from the metropolitan area, who serve as administrators and teachers, to visit Assumption, review our plan, speak with committee members, interview students and parents, provide feedback on their findings, and determine the accreditation status of Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary School.

As you might know, our advances in curriculum development have been strong and the academic gains of students are notable. Assumption piloted the curriculum design process for the Archdiocese of St. Louis using a platform known as CHALK. Faculty use this platform to design curriculum, using State and Archdiocesan standards. In addition, we piloted the new NWEA testing for students. This testing (NWEA) allows teachers to help each student increase learning "growth" in Math and Reading. Growth in Math has been significant over the last several years, due to the modifications in curriculum, the focus on student improvement goals and implementation of methodology in teaching. Assumption is actively using the curriculum as a model to be used by all Catholic elementary schools throughout the diocese.

Assumption teachers and staff are so excited to kick off our 7th Annual Kids Summer Camps! Our Kids Summer Camps are week-long interest-based camps geared towards the children of Assumption Parish entering preschool through eighth grade for the 2024–2025 school year. We provide half-day camps in both the morning and afternoon, as well as several full-day options to help your child find or grow in their God given talents. Our hope is that this site offers all the information you may need to plan a balanced summer with fun and relaxation for everyone in the family.
