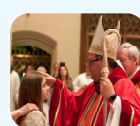

Hello,

It is Palm Sunday and as we hear of Christ entering Jerusalem we are entering into Holy Week. As the pinnacle of our liturgical year, I hope it is also one that has deep memories for each of you that help us enter into the solemnity and the celebration of the Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday to bring us to Easter. Here's a little promotion for each of the services if it has been a little while since you have participated in them. If you have never participated in them it may be something you would consider this year.

Holy Thursday – 7 pm – The Mass of the Lord's Supper – This Mass commemorates the institution of the Holy Eucharist, of the priestly Order, and the commandment of the Lord concerning fraternal charity. In the Gospel reading we will hear how Jesus washed his disciples' feet and instructed them "as I have done for you, you should also do." The presider will wash the feet of representatives of the parish to remind all of us that we are asked to carry on Christ's tradition towards one another. We celebrate the liturgy of the Eucharist and receive Christ fully as he offered Himself for us. The service ends after a procession to the altar of repose, in the chapel, where we can stay in silent prayer and adoration of Christ in the incredible gift He gives us of Himself in the Eucharist.

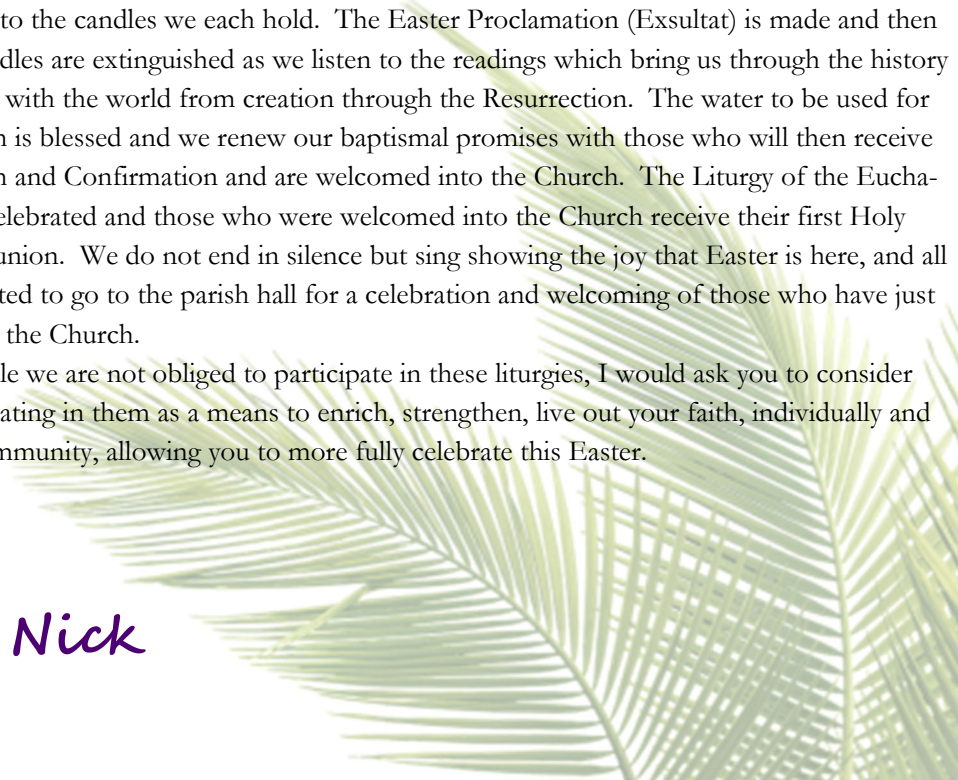
Good Friday – 7pm – The Passion of the Lord – In the liturgy of the Word we read the Lord's Passion and reflect upon the suffering and death He suffered for us. Adoration of the Cross is done by all gathered in gratitude and recognition for all Christ did for us that we may have eternal life. While Mass is not celebrated on Good Friday the Eucharist that was consecrated on Holy Thursday is received. After a final blessing people will again leave in silence.

Holy Saturday – 8 pm – The Easter Vigil – The Vigil begins with the lighting of the Easter fire, the blessing and lighting of the Easter Candle, and then (weather permitting) the procession into the church as the fire from the Easter Candle spreads through all of church to the candles we each hold. The Easter Proclamation (Exsultat) is made and then our candles are extinguished as we listen to the readings which bring us through the history of God with the world from creation through the Resurrection. The water to be used for Baptism is blessed and we renew our baptismal promises with those who will then receive Baptism and Confirmation and are welcomed into the Church. The Liturgy of the Eucharist is celebrated and those who were welcomed into the Church receive their first Holy Communion. We do not end in silence but sing showing the joy that Easter is here, and all are invited to go to the parish hall for a celebration and welcoming of those who have just entered the Church.

While we are not obliged to participate in these liturgies, I would ask you to consider participating in them as a means to enrich, strengthen, live out your faith, individually and as a community, allowing you to more fully celebrate this Easter.

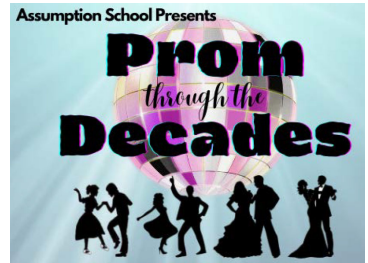
Assumption Celebrates Prom through the Decades (Parish Auction) Saturday, April 22!!

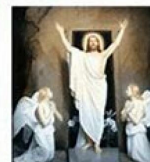

From the Principal's Pen

6th grade studies Mesopotamia and the 1st Written Language

Our 6th graders were completing their unit on Mesopotamia where the 1st writing system – cuneiform was developed. After talking about the importance of a writing system for communication and about scribes and their importance in society. Students decided on a phrase they liked and used the cuneiform alphabet (and clay as their form of paper) to write their message the Mesopotamian way.

A bit about Cuneiform: referred to as a logo-syllabic script, it was used to write several languages of the Ancient Middle East. The script was in active use from the early Bronze Age until the beginning of the Common Era. It is named for the characteristic wedge-shaped impressions (Latin: *cuneus*) which form its signs. Cuneiform was originally developed to write the Sumerian language of southern Mesopotamia (modern Iraq). Cuneiform is the earliest known writing system.



Etiquette St. Louis and the Cotillion Class of 2023

Marilyn Broyles of Etiquette St. Louis says, "Etiquette is not about impressing people, it is about using kindness, courtesy, and respect in every part of our daily lives."

Etiquette Saint Louis partnered with Assumption School to teach manners, courtesy, common etiquette, groom-

ing, and table manners to our 8th graders again this year. This 6 week program has each meeting themed with topics of importance. Students are also introduced to dancing, with professional dance instructors teaching traditional and current dances including the waltz, the salsa, swing dancing, and current line dances.

The graduation "exam" is attending the final Cotillion, where students are judged on their ability to attend a formal evening with dinner and dance.

Week I:	First Impressions, Introductions, Small Talk, Body Language
Week II:	Telephone Etiquette, Cell Phone Etiquette, Email, Social Media and Other Technology
Week III:	Good Grooming, Attire, Party Manners
Week IV:	Table Manners
Week V:	Table Manners
Week VI:	Formal Dinner and Dance. A formal dinner and dance serves at the conclusion of our cotillion program. Dinners are held at an area club or restaurant and features a multi course meal, dance contests and fantastic prizes.

After participation receives a graduation certificate upon successful completion of the Cotillion.

Congratulations to David Smith, Assumption 5th grader, who was selected to participate in the St. Louis Regional Qualifier SCRIPP's Spelling Bee on March 11, 2023. David, as an Assumption School-level bee winner was invited to join SCRIPP's at **Morrissey Hall on SLU's campus** to participate in a writing-based competition. David, and others, will be tasked with writing down a set of **25 words as called by a pronouncer** (no vocabulary), and the top 30 spellers from this portion of the competition will be invited to participate in the St. Louis Regional Spelling Bee.

Help the Parish save \$20,000! Many of our parishioners appreciate the convenience of online giving. On average, about 1/3 of our contributions are received through the online giving platform. We're very thankful for the support of our online givers! Online giving is helpful and convenient, but it's not free. Each online gift has a 3% processing fee withheld from it. If you contribute \$100, for example, only \$97 actually winds up in the parish's bank account. For a full year, those fees cost the parish about \$20,000. Here's an alternative that avoids those fees: Why not use online banking? Just set up Assumption Church as a recurring vendor on your bank's bill payment page. Most banks don't charge a fee to send your check to the parish, and the full 100% of your gift will support the good work of the church.

RCIA participants reflect during Holy Week on the journey of faith they have made toward Christ and the Sacraments as they prepare for initiation into the Church this Saturday.

Today we attended the 8:00am Mass and then held our spiritual retreat day. We gave individual wooden cross necklaces to wear for the day. A reflection was done on the cross in our lives.

We talked about the Triduum and how important it was for all to attend Holy Week. Sponsors bought a cup for their person as a surprise and the sponsors were given cups by the Team. A moving reflection on filling your "cup" was received with joy. The highlight of our day was the quiet time that was spent in reading all of the notes from our parish community, Sisters of the Precious blood, school, team and oh so many who were praying for them. The day ended with Stations of the cross held at St Joseph Chapel.

We invite you to listen to your own heart and allow it to land in a specific place this week—an event or one aspect of an event that takes place in Jesus' life during Holy Week. St. Ignatius encourages us to have conversational prayer with Jesus, walking alongside Jesus as a friend while he goes through his great Passion. Imagine watching something horrific happening to a person you know and

love. Some of us don't have to imagine—we have experienced this. Allow Jesus' experience of the Passion to be as close and human as the suffering you have witnessed

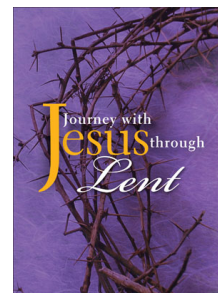
in your life or another's. Grace to you, as you meditate on suffering, compassion, and love.

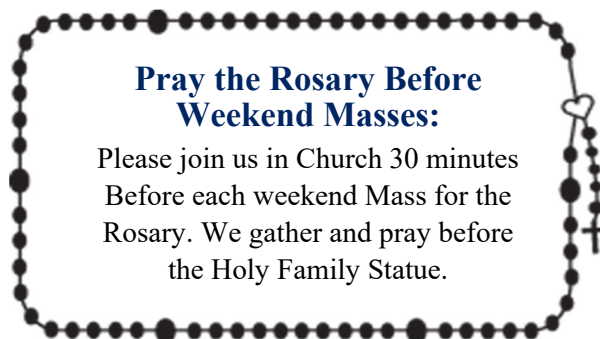
