Hello,

Well, we had a solar eclipse again last week. And while we were not in the 'zone of totality' here in O'Fallon, I managed to drive to Mt. Vernon, Illinois with a friend to watch it with a brother and sister—in—law of mine to see it. I don't think we got quite as much hype about it here, as we did in 2017, because we had to drive a little way to get the total eclipse, but it was still something that everyone had to at least choose to step outside and watch or not, an event we all shared. It used to be many more events that we shared with everyone we knew and encountered, now it seems to be that we simply choose to encounter people who we share our interests and views with.

Not only is an eclipse a shared event, no matter who you are, but also a pretty non-controversial one. Some people definitely got more excited about the eclipse than others, but it isn't something that people are for or against, and even more so, it isn't something that we can really do something to change, one way or another. It was going to happen no matter what we did, we could choose not to look at it, or in some places they had clouds and even rain, and couldn't see it, but the moon still passed directly between the earth and the sun, perfectly blocking out the sun over some areas of the earth, no matter what.

I think that is valuable to us today, to recognize that we can't vote, or force, or even will that certain things change and just make them happen. Some things will happen no matter what, and some things are true and other's false, no matter what. There is a phrase that has grown in popularity over the last few years that often bothers me that can appear to contradict this. When people start a phrase or make statements regarding 'my truth' or 'your truth' I usually cringe. I realize they are referring to the situation or the reality of what that individual's lived experience is, but when we say 'my truth,' it appears to indicate that there can be more than one truth, and that the truth can be different for different people.

We are in the Season of Easter, when we are celebrating because Jesus Christ suffered and died for us, and then rose from the dead, conquering death not only for himself but for all of us. Especially when we talk about things that not everyone agrees about, people feel more comfortable using that phrase 'my truth,' thinking they are being respectful of other's opinions, experiences, and views. But that would imply that my opinions, experiences, and views mattered as to whether this really happened or not, and they don't. I can respect that someone has different beliefs, and even identify reasons for them, but that doesn't mean that there are different truths. If this was the case then there would be no reason to seek the truth, since we could have it be whatever we want.

I see this in a way compared to people who will say that they are 'spiritual' but not 'religious.' I'm glad if they are at least spiritual, taking that to mean that they recognize that there is more to them and others than just physical bodies. But I think a reason they avoid being religious is that religions assert that there are certain truths about us spiritually, and they aren't willing to accept this, or maybe not willing to assert this. While we can respect other's beliefs, that doesn't mean we don't consider that there are things that are true, and others that are false. I hope that we all seek the truth to guide how we live our lives, and hopefully how we would hope others will live theirs. So how does Easter affect how we live our lives?



What is next for those who entered the Catholic Church this Easter? We have reached the fourth period of the RCIA process, which is the neophyte year. All who were baptized and received into full communion are called neophytes in this period, until the anniversary of their initiation next Easter. The final period of regular weekly formation extends through the Easter season, the seven weeks from Easter to Pentecost. This post—baptismal catechesis is called Mystagogia. It is a time for deepening the Christian experience, especially in appreciation for the sacramental life, for spiritual growth, and for entering more fully into the life and unity of the Catholic community. We attend the 8am Mass on Sunday and afterwards spend time in understanding what the sacraments mean in their lives. The sponsors job is now complete but they will leave us with a new appreciation of their Catholic faith. The neophytes now share with Christ, and his Body in the parish community, the intimate communion of the Eucharist. Now they have access to all the means of sanctification. We as a parish community pledge to help them grow and mature in the Christian life and to develop a genuine Catholic world view.
