HAPPY EASTER!

Yes, last Sunday was Easter, but this Sunday we complete the Octave of Easter and we are just getting started in the Easter Season. St. Athanasius described it as follows, "The fifty days from the Sunday of the Resurrection to Pentecost Sunday are celebrated in joy and exultation as one feast day, indeed as one "great Sunday."

The Octave of Easter is the first eight days, or Easter Sunday (the first Sunday) through the Second Sunday of Easter. Liturgically these are classified as solemnities. Each of the days at Mass we also pray the Gloria and what would normally be optional saints' days are not celebrated. Through this period and throughout the rest of the Easter season the priest's vestments will be white. White is used for all celebrations that especially focus on Christ and represents joy, exuberance, celebration, resurrection, victory, purity, and innocence.


You will also notice that the Easter candle is a bit more prominent which is intentional for the Easter season. First, and most obvious, it is taller since it is a new candle that was blessed and first lit at the Easter Vigil to be used throughout this year. Second, it is in the sanctuary on top of the steps instead of next to the baptismal font, which even further emphasizes the height of the new candle. And third, it is lit for Masses throughout the Easter season to remind us of the season we are in now.

We will also be doing a Sprinkling Rite in place of the Penitential Rite at Mass today. A reminder of our baptisms during this Easter Season.

All of the sacraments of initiation, (Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation), are especially appropriate during the Easter season. The children from our parish and PSR are celebrating their First Communion this weekend at all of our Sunday Masses. The eighth graders will be going to the Cathedral to be Confirmed on Saturday April 29th. Please keep them, those who received the sacraments at our Easter Vigil, and all of our parish in your prayers, especially throughout this Easter Season.

Please join us in Church 30 minutes Before each weekend Mass for the Rosary. We gather and pray before the Holy Family Statue.



8th grade "Pin and Thread" Art

Often referred to as pin-and-thread art, string art is an addicting art form that our 8th graders undertook during this quarter of Art. Through the creation of intricate designs, students turned a plank of wood into a work of art.

String art is not a new fad; its origins go back to the 19th century. It is the brainchild of Mary Everest Boole who was in search of a way to introduce children to mathematical ideals. String art came back in the late

1960s as a decorative craft in the form of books and kits.

The entire concept revolves around a few simple tools and materials:

- Wood board
- Embroidery floss
- **Nails**

Add to that a mind full of creative ideas and you have string art! The nails are hammered into the wood board in a distinct pattern. The embroidery floss is then used to follow the pattern and bring the design to life. The floss will crisscross and wrap around the nails to fill in the blank space which results in a seemingly complex creation. Congrats to our 8th graders who mastered this art form.



If you contribute \$100, for example, only \$97 actually winds up in the parish's bank account. For a full year, those fees cost the parish about \$20,000.
