

## Hello,



I remember a few years ago, I was living in a parish in Washington DC and there was an optional feast we could celebrate that day for the martyr St.

George. I was thinking about it and thought, I don't know any George's, I don't have any particular devotion to St. George, I will just go with the standard Mass for the day instead of the prayers and the Red vestments for St. George. And just as I begin walking down the aisle of the church I look up and see two George's I knew in the parish, and then I remember my one grandfather's name is also George (although I never called him that), so I usually celebrate the feast of St. George now.

So what do we know about St. George. He was a fairly high member of the Roman Army and is believed to have been a victim of the Roman Emperor Diocletian and his declaration that the army should arrest all Christians and that all soldiers needed to make a sacrifice to the Roman gods. While George would not denounce his faith nor make a sacrifice to the Roman gods, some histories states that Diocletian gave George numerous opportunities to fulfill this requirement due to his close friendship with George's father. However, other writings talk about the many years that George was tortured to renounce his Christianity. Before he would be put to death, George is also known for having donated all of his wealth to the poor. All of the histories have him ultimately being tortured and then put to death for his faith with the date given as April 23, 303 or as late as the year 307.

Within the first two centuries after his death the stories of his torture, his faithfulness, and the conversions that resulted became numerous. While many are not considered to be factual, the great extent of them clearly demonstrated his popularity and the devotion to him as a martyr at that time. He was honored as a saint in both Eastern and Western churches and is even given the title of "prophet" in Islamic hagiography.

He is probably most commonly known to us today as the patron saint of England and is usually pictured slaying a dragon. This tie to England came during the crusades when he was a favored saint by many going on the crusades. The story about St. George that began around the 11<sup>th</sup> century was that a princess had been offered to appease a dragon but St. George came and slew the dragon before the dragon could kill the princess. In response to this act the entire kingdom then converted to Christianity. Undoubtedly some of this was founded in the stories of conversions that occurred when George was being tortured, along with the efforts of the crusades and the hope that these efforts would convert entire kingdoms to Christianity, and the dragon is accepted as representing the enemies of Christianity. This story gained great popularity when it was written into a work called the *Golden Legend*, written around 1260, that spread this story throughout England.

This year I actually can't celebrate the feast of St. George at Mass because it is today, April 23<sup>rd</sup>, a Sunday. The day I'm writing this is actually the birthday of my grandfather George, back in 1897. And in case you need another reason to remember St. George, Pope Francis' name just happens to be Jorge Mario Bergoglio, or in English, George.



But soon I found that I have something to share with everyone. Every Sunday morning we learn about the word of God. We share our own experience with God. He was always there with us and guided us. We grow closer and closer each week. There was no hate but pure love. One soul and one body. We experienced that over a nine month journey as part of this new family at church. I am joyful for new Catholics and I keep praying they will grow in their faith and spread God's love to the world. Thank you for letting me join the best part of your spiritual journey. #### What makes a good sponsor?

Sponsors are essentially those people who love being Catholic. These persons provide a gift of faith and presence to seekers as they get to know the living God through word, worship, witness and community (cf. RCIA 75). Sponsors need to constantly give to their seekers by being examples of the kind of Christian described by Saint Francis: "Who a person is before God is who they are meant to be—nothing more, nothing less." (cf. Writings of Saint Francis, Admonition 19). Seekers need to know that they are loved by God.

Being a Community Sponsor is like being a trusted friend. You share what you can about your own faith journey. You offer counsel and support as you are able and to the extent that it is needed or desired. You serve as a bridge to the larger Assumption community. You listen and you pray. Each relationship between a Sponsor and a Candidate or Catechumen is unique. As a Sponsor, you walk with a Candidate or Catechumen through a formation process that culminates with initiation into the Catholic Church. Most importantly, they provide a listening ear, an encouraging heart, and a prayerful presence.

Being an RCIA sponsor is both an opportunity to share your faith with others and an opportunity to deepen your own experience of faith. Sponsors do not have to be "teachers" of the Catholic faith. They do have to be fully-initiated Catholics (received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) who would like to be a companion to someone who is becoming Catholic. Please prayerfully consider this invitation to become an RCIA sponsor.
