Hello,

Just yesterday our eighth graders received the sacrament of Confirmation at the Cathedral Basilica, the last of the three sacraments of initiation, (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation). We recognize they are growing older, and need the grace and gifts of the Holy Spirit as they grow more independent and strive to live faithful lives. From our baptism we are all called to be saints, and the hope is the reception of this sacrament will help them on that journey.



One of the things most of us remember from our Confirmation is

what saints name we took. The purpose for choosing a specific saint is usually someone who exhibits characteristics that we would like to have or also a saint that we would like a special link with and ask for their intercession. St. Sebastian has been a popular one at times as the patron saint of athletes, and lately St. Luigi Scrosoppi has become known as the patron saint of soccer (or football for non-Americans). Francis of Assisi is known for animals and ecology, but also for his humility and the simplicity of life he would follow, and Cecilia for musicians and many others.

Just this week we have numerous saints that one might consider for their Confirmation name: St. George the dragon slayer, he didn't slay real dragons but suffered martyrdom for his faith to the point where many became Christian because of his example; St. Mark the Evangelist who wrote the Gospel of Mark and was known to be close to both St. Peter and St. Paul; St. Catherine of Siena, known for her care of the poor and the sick but also as an advisor to the pope who would convince him to move back to Rome from Avignon.

We have plenty of saints we can look to for examples and their prayers, but I did what some do, in choosing their Confirmation name, I kept my baptismal name, Nicholas. I think most of us have heard of him and he seemed to have some good characteristics like caring for the poor and children and fighting against heresies in the Church. What saint did you choose for your Confirmation name?

RCIA: THE RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Let's begin with a summary of the theology of baptism as it appears in *The General Introduction to the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*: "Baptism incorporates us into Christ and forms us into God's people. This first sacrament pardons all our sins, rescues us from the power of darkness, and brings us to the dignity of adopted children, a new creation through water and the Holy Spirit. Hence we are called and are indeed the children of God" (RCIA, 2).

In his Passover Christ opened to all men the fountain of Baptism. He had already spoken of his Passion, which he was about to suffer in Jerusalem, as a "Baptism" with which he had to be baptized. The **blood and water** that flowed from the pierced side of the crucified Jesus are types of Baptism and the Eucharist, the sacraments of new life. From then on, it is possible "to be born of water and the Spirit" in order to enter the Kingdom of God. See where you are baptized, see where Baptism comes from, if not from the cross of Christ, from his death. There is the whole mystery: he died for you. In him you are redeemed, in him you are saved. (CCC 1225)

During the RCIA Mystagogia session on April 21, Fr. Nick administered the Sacrament of the Sick to RCIA Catechist Sister Theresa Jezl. Please pray for Sister Theresa who will have hip surgery on April 30.


