### Hello,

Yesterday, April 29th, the 8th graders from our parish and PSR received the sacrament of Confirmation at the Cathedral Basilica at 10am. For most of us Confirmation is the last and final of the sacraments of initiation that we will receive. We started with Baptism as an infant and then received our First Communion (coming up in three weeks here) in 2nd grade and then Confirmation sometime after that. It is interesting if you talk to people of different ages and from different areas of the country they may have received the sacrament at different ages.

The most common time to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in the United States is in 8th grade or a freshman or sophomore in high school. One reason for this, is that at this age they are starting to make more decisions for themselves and becoming more independent. It is recognized that they might be open to and benefit from the gifts of the Holy Spirit they received at Baptism which are strengthened in the sacrament of Confirmation. Canon law states that they are required to have reached the age of reason (the age at which they are to receive their First Communion) but goes on to state that they should have reached the age of discretion. This has resulted in some dioceses deciding to confirm children as early as 2nd grade, and in danger of death, a child can even be confirmed as an infant when they are baptized.

It is good to consider this when we are really in need of the graces of a sacrament as well as when we may be more properly disposed to receive them. Additionally, we also have to be aware that we are not earning them or using them as a reward for having completed certain courses or requirements. We strive to prepare confirmands (those to receive Confirmation) so that they may be more open to the gifts of the Holy Spirit and also to live out the responsibilities of a Christian life. By waiting until 8th grade or high school, the confirmand will not only be more mature but also they will have had more time to prepare for the sacrament.

Originally the sacrament was given to infants immediately after baptism, as it is done for adults who are first receiving baptism. It was separated partially in recognition that the bishop is the ordinary minister for the sacrament and the bishop couldn't get to every parish as frequently as was desired for baptisms. In the Eastern Rites of the Catholic Church the priest who baptizes an infant normally confirms them in the same celebration.


Just a little information about Confirmation that will hopefully make us more aware and supportive of those recently confirmed and also help us consider our own Confirmation.

If we are doing mystagogy with inquirers, instead of other Catholics, the inquirers set the agenda. We ask them, in various ways, how they have encountered God in their lives.

It is primarily a liturgical experience that takes place in the midst of the Sunday assembly. The neophytes might be gathered once or twice in the Easter season specifically to remember and explore the experience of their initiation at the Vigil. Now, we would hope, the neophytes would enter into the ongoing adult faith formation process of the rest of the baptized. And that process is, of course, mystagogical. Team RCIA, so now what? As we gathered this weekend our focus continues on the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Now that they have experienced the Sacrament we wanted them to tell us their stories.

What do you know now that you didn't know before? And what does that mean to you? I get that God loves me and is always with me; I thought I never could be forgiven of things in my life but I know now that I can.

Who are we now...in light of our sacramental initiation into Christ?

What is your "job" with Eucharist? (Talk about strength for the mission and struggles - the suffering side...)

Meeting Jesus in the mass – Where do I find Him?

Am I at mass to Get - or - to Give?

What am I saying "YES/AMEN" to? A commitment to live our lives with a closeness to God. He becomes one with us when we take and receive the body of Christ.

We ask you, the community, to reflect on these same questions this week. You can journey with us as we look into what Eucharist means to us as well.
