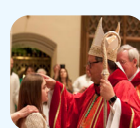

Happy Mother's Day,

From Ancient Greece and Rome the remote origins of Mother's Day are found in celebrations honoring mother goddesses. Christian Europe used it to honor Mary, mother of Christ, and also to honor a person's "Mother Church", the church in which they were baptized. It was then expanded to honor all mothers and would be a particular time when people traveled home to visit their mothers.

In North America Mother's Day was first promoted by Julia Ward Howe as a response to the Civil War. Seeking peace and an end of sons killing the sons of other mothers, she wrote a proclamation in 1870 that began as follows:

Arise, then, women of this day!

Arise all women who have hearts,

Whether your baptism be that of water or of tears

Say firmly:

"We will not have great questions decided by irrelevant agencies,

Our husbands shall not come to us reeking of carnage,

For caresses and applause.

Our sons shall not be taken from us to unlearn

All that we have been able to teach them of

charity, mercy and patience.

"We women of one country

Will be too tender of those of another country

To allow our sons to be trained to injure theirs."

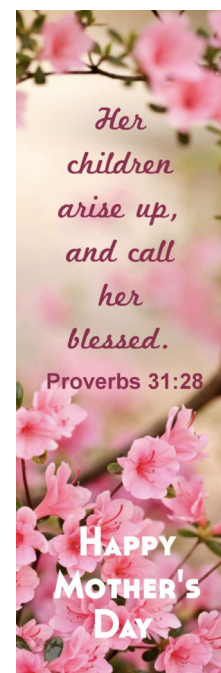

Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist are called the sacraments of initiation. When these three sacraments are received at the same liturgy, their connection is highlighted. People are completely initiated into the Church and adopted as God's own as they receive the Holy Spirit in Baptism and Confirmation, and are drawn closer to the Father through Christ in the Eucharist.

At our RCIA Mystagoga session last Sunday, we remembered the Easter Vigil when the neophytes were confirmed. We revisited how they were anointed with the oil of Chrism and sealed with the Holy Spirit. We spoke and shared thoughts about the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit. We also discussed how we can continue our journey of faith by participating in the various ministries at Assumption and how to keep the fire of faith burning in our hearts through deeper personal prayer, attending Mass more often, and also by joining small faith groups.

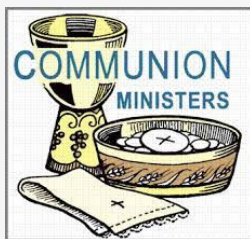
Altar Server Training Camp is Back this Summer!

3rd Graders' Wax Museum

When it comes to learning about Missouri history, third-grade students at Assumption know how to bring history to life through the art of storytelling in a very unique setting. The student's "Famous Missouri Wax Museum," an annual living history outdoor walk, has been a part of the school's curriculum for decades. This year's event consisted of 36 students and took place on Thursday, April 20th. The history assignment: research a famous Missourian of your choice, and on the day of the wax museum event, highlight the celebrity through a short, third-person presentation while dressed in costume and using props.

This hands-on activity challenges each student to share a piece of Missouri history in creative and entertaining ways. Visitors press the button drawn on the paper notes that each student holds, then step back to watch their performance unfold!

You never know who you are going to meet! This year's celebrities consisted of a variety of famous people, including singers, an outlaw, actors, a president and CEO, and even a saint. Stories depicting the late greats, including Army General and Commander of WWI John J. Pershing, and Yankees Major League Baseball legend Lawrence Peter "Yogi" Berra, to those Missouri celebrities who are still alive. A few of those recognizable names included Assumption's very own alum and Major League Soccer star Josh Sargent, professional basketball player Jason Tatum, and pop and country singers Cheryl Crow and Sarah Evans.

A few of the most popular Missourians at the event included doubles of the Titanic survivor Margaret "Molly" Brown; actress Elizabeth Ruth "Betty" Grable; sports commentator Jack Buck; entertainer Walt Disney; baseball great Stan Musial; and Sacagawea who accompanied the Lewis and Clark Expedition.

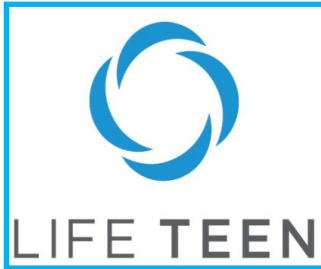

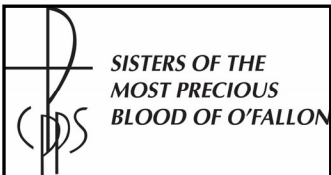
