Hello,

It is the time of year when we have high school graduations. A tradition I had for my nieces and nephews was that one of the things I gave them for their high school graduation was a road atlas. Now for my oldest nieces and nephews when they were graduating from high school, in a time not that long ago, paper maps were still being used, so it isn't as strange of a gift as it was for the last of them (5 years ago now—I'm getting old). But in some ways, I think it was even more important for the later ones.



As opposed to the little area of a map that people look at today on a phone or a GPS device, a paper map shows a much larger area and gives you a different perspective than a 7" screen will. You see areas off of the narrow path that you are traveling and recognize that there may be other options, places you might want to stop or see along the way. They open us up from the tunnel vision we might be living in. And I think that is good for someone getting out of high school to be aware of, to think about, to be challenged with, and not just for a road atlas but with our lives.

We celebrate the Feast of Pentecost this weekend and it seems like a good time to consider how open we are to recognizing and going out to the world around us. Jesus sent out his disciples before he ascended to go out to all the world, to bring them His word and now they have been given the gifts of the Holy Spirit to help. But sometimes we seem to just be staying put in our same spot, or even when we venture out, it is on a very narrow path that doesn't even recognize anything that might be off of it. As with the Apostles, and with high school students, there is a time that you need to be clearly and fairly strictly directed, but eventually we are expected to put what we have been taught to use, keeping it as our firm foundation but taking it out to others to share it with them, so that they and we can grow in seeing how it didn't just apply to the more isolated life we lived in, but how it applies to the whole world. Not only is this for the good of others but it is also how we can continue to grow in our understanding and knowledge of what we were taught. To realize the broadness of the world, and the depth of what we have been taught that applies to all of this. The Apostles had a lot of questions when faced with sharing their faith with the Gentiles, what rules are required and which are not, and we face that ourselves when going out into the world, even when we aren't moving, and the world is just changing around us.

So as we celebrate Pentecost, and consider how we are going to go out to the whole world, consider looking at a broader map of the world sometime. It should at least give us an appreciation for the variety of people and cultures out there, and it might let God suggest a few different turns from the path we may have had in mind.

RCIA: THE RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS



As the Catholic Church prepares to celebrate Pentecost, which marks the establishment of the Catholic Church, many new converts to the

faith at Assumption are marking their 50th day as Catholics. Some were drawn to the Church by the quiet example of others; some have had more dramatic encounters. Pentecost is a fitting time to welcome new members into the Church, as scripture records that “about three thousand people” were baptized on that day (Acts 2:41). It also is an occasion for those of us who are already members of Christ’s body to commit ourselves anew to life in the Spirit. The feast of Pentecost is a day of thanksgiving for the coming of the Holy Spirit and for the establishment of the sacrament of confirmation. It is a day on which we place a joyful and grateful trust in the operation of the Holy Spirit within us, and thank him for His inspiration and guidance. On this day, we again place ourselves in the hands of the Holy Spirit with complete confidence.

Today marks the close of the final phase of RCIA but the beginning of a lifelong journey. At the 8am Mass, the neophytes (a new convert) and their families will be sent out as disciples to share the light of Christ. The symbolism of the light of Christ began in their first meeting when a candle was lit and continues to be lit at each meeting.

Christians are continually called upon to consider what it will cost them to live according to the mystery of Christ’s death and resurrection, into which they have been initiated through Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This sacramental union with Christ also beckons all of us to go into the world “to carry out the mission of the entire people of God in the Church and in the world.”

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of the Faithful; and enkindle in them the fire of Thy love. Send forth Thy Spirit and they shall be created and thou shalt renew the face of the earth.

As a treat, all students received either a popsicle or fudgesicle during the evening - and what a great night for all!

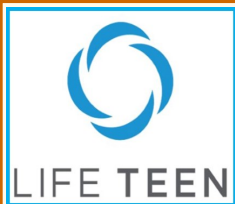


Field Day
