Hello,

This Sunday we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Since we are celebrating the Body and Blood of Christ, the Eucharist, I thought it would be a good opportunity to talk about Eucharistic Adoration. A booklet from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops titled **"Thirty-One Questions on Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament"** asks and answers the following question (along with many others):



## 5. Why is the Blessed Sacrament reserved in a tabernacle in every Catholic Church?

The tabernacle was first intended for the reservation of the Eucharist in a worthy place so that it could be brought to the sick and those absent, outside of Mass. As faith in the real presence of Christ in his Eucharist deepened, the Church became conscious of the meaning of silent adoration of the Lord present under the Eucharistic species.

As stated, the mere existence of a tabernacle in a church demonstrates an understanding of the Eucharist that is different from other faiths. In most Christian denominations, there would be no tabernacle since they do not have the same understanding of the Eucharist and the real presence of Christ that once He is present in the bread and wine remains.

With Christ present in the tabernacle, or exposed in a monstrance during Eucharistic Adoration, we realize we have the special opportunity to spend time with Him. We can pray anywhere and at any time (hopefully we do), but this is different. As an old phone commercial used to say, 'it's the next best thing to being there,'—but of course that makes us respond, then why not go for the best thing and be there? That is what Eucharistic Adoration gives us, to be there in the real presence of Christ. Like those we may phone, we realize we cannot be with them all the time, so this is another means of staying close and in touch, but it isn't the same as being there. Hopefully, like communicating with other people, we have developed numerous ways for when we can't be there—the phone, letters, e-mail, texts, Zoom, Facebook, messages through friends, ... and hopefully, have numerous ways we keep in touch with God with different prayers, formal, unstructured, communal, intercessory (asking for other's prayers), devotional, ... but when we get the opportunity, Eucharistic Adoration allows us to be there with Christ in a way we are not otherwise. We have our weekly Sunday meal together, but just as a parent might say "what a nice surprise that you stopped in during the week."

**CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION  
ST. JUAN DIEGO TO ASSUMPTION  
THIS SUNDAY, JUNE 2**

Assumption and St. Juan Diego Parishes are called to come together, Sunday, June 2, to celebrate The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as the Feast of Corpus Christi. Parishioners of all ages are invited to participate in a one-mile procession to celebrate the importance of the Real Presence in the Eucharist, while publicly affirming their faith.

Those interested should meet at noon at the front doors of St. Juan Diego Parish (St. Barnabas Church). We will join their parishioners as they begin the procession coming from their 11am Mass to process as a group down Main Street towards Assumption, singing Eucharistic songs and hymns before stopping twice to pray. Altars will be set up at the Jehling's Hardware parking lot and Len's Auto Repair, as we proclaim the Word of God and give a Eucharistic blessing. The procession ends with benediction in our Chapel, where the Blessed Sacrament is reposed and placed in the tabernacle.

To be in compliance, you must be registered in the Prevent and Protect system where you will submit an updated background check and sign and submit all the Mandatory Reports and Code of Conduct sections. Attending a Protecting God's Children Workshop is also needed to complete Compliance. If you have already completed a workshop, this information will roll over into the Prevent and Protect system and you will not have to redo the workshop for your Compliance.

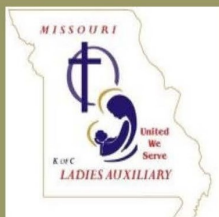

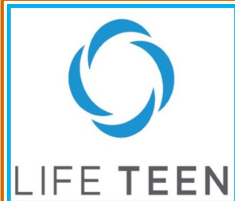
