Hello,

Yesterday, June 22, was the feast day of Saints John Fisher and Thomas More. Both died, or more precisely, were executed for refusing to take the Act Respecting the Oath to the Succession of Henry VIII. Saint John Fischer was a bishop and a scholar. When Henry VIII desired to have his marriage to Catherine of Aragon declared null so he could marry Anne Boleyn and none of their offspring could be recognized as successors to the throne. In addition to requiring the recognition of the legitimacy of this marriage was the fact that the oath would require the recognition of the king as the head of both all civil and religious loyalties, Fisher would refuse to take the oath and thus was imprisoned. While in prison, Pope Paul III named John Fisher a cardinal of the church, hoping this would influence Henry VIII to ease his treatment or possibly release him from prison. But instead, Henry tried Fisher for treason, had him condemned to death, and eventually beheaded on June 22, 1535.



But the clergy were not the only ones required to take this oath, or who were rejected. Thomas More was known for being a statesman and a very pious man. He was identified as a part of the humanist movement at the time and his book Utopia was seen as a great benefit to that movement. He was respected enough for his knowledge and work that he became the lord chancellor of England for Henry VIII. But in this position, he also would be required to support the king in his marriage and in his position as not only head of the kingdom but also the church. More tried to continue as he could without going against his faith but eventually would ask to resign. As a good lawyer he considered the ways in which he could stay true to his faith while not condemning himself to the king. But eventually, he was also required to take the Oath and brought to trial for his refusal. At trial More states:

“Ye must understand that, in things touching conscience, every true and good subject is more bound to have respect to his said conscience and to his soul than to any other thing in all the world beside”

He would be found guilty at the trial and, like Fisher, sentenced to death. He was beheaded on July 6, 1535.

I think the joint feast of John Fisher and Thomas More is a good example of how all of us, clerics and laity, are called to live out our faith in all parts of our life in the face of the challenges the world may present to us. Thomas More is even more widely known than John Fisher for his example and hopefully a model that we can all look to in staying faithful to God in all aspects of our lives.

HELP SUPPORT STUDENTS EDUCATION

Great news! Parishioners and supporters are able to make a BIG difference for low income and special needs students who desire catholic education with a 100% tax credit offsetting their contribution. Each of us can help children get the education they deserve and not be "out-of-pocket" any money! The Today and Tomorrow Educational Foundation (TTEF) is one of the non-profit organizations chosen by the State of Missouri to fundraise and administer these essential scholarships.

In 2021, legislation was passed to establish the Missouri Empowerment Scholarship Accounts Program, known as MOScholars. MOScholars provides Education Savings Accounts (ESAs) to eligible low-income and special needs students. ESAs can be used for parochial and private school tuition and other qualified educational expenses. ESAs are funded by individual donors and Missouri businesses who make eligible tax credit contributions. Each donor receives a 100% tax credit for up to 50% of their Missouri tax liability. As a dollar-for-dollar credit, these donations can supplement a company or individual's existing philanthropic giving, at no additional 'cost'.

What is TTEF's Role?

TTEF, as your Educational Assistance Organization, is responsible for accepting eligible donor contributions and submitting supporting documentation. In return, TTEF provides funding to eligible families for the scholarship and documents to donors to prove their tax credits.

Who is Eligible?

- An individual subject to Missouri state income tax.
- An individual, firm, partner in a firm, corporation or shareholder in an S-Corp doing business in the state and subject to state income tax.
- An express company that pays an annual tax on its gross receipts in Missouri under chapter 153.

Is There a Tax Credit Limit?

A MOScholars tax credit is equal to 100% of an eligible donation, not to exceed 50% of the donor's state tax liability for the tax year the credit is claimed. MOScholars tax credits may be carried forward for four subsequent tax years. The tax credit is not sellable, transferrable, or refundable.

About MOScholars

The Missouri Empowerment Scholarship Accounts Program (MOScholars) launched by the State of Missouri provides state tax credits in exchange for contributions to approved, non-profit Educational Assistance Organizations (EAOs). EAOs use the contributions to award scholarships to Missouri students living in low-income households or those on Individualized Education Programs.

How to Participate

1. Reserve Tax Credits

- Visit the Missouri State Treasurer's Office website at treasurer.mo.gov/MOScholars
- Select "Today and Tomorrow Educational Foundation" as your EAO.
- *This MUST be completed prior to donating.*

2. Complete Donation

3. Receive Credits

- TTEF will provide tax receipts within 30 days of processing your contribution.
- The receipt will be used when filing your Missouri taxes.

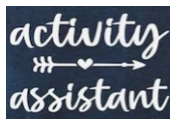

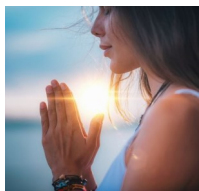
Curious about religious life? Spend a weekend with the Daughters of St. Paul, and participate in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage as it passes through St. Louis!

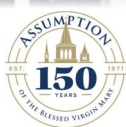

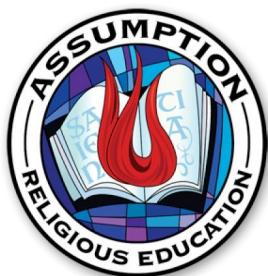

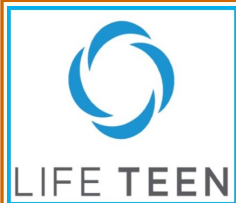
