








#### SAVE THE DATE: MEN'S WHITE HOUSE RETREAT JANUARY 23-26, 2025



#### A NOTE FROM THE BUSINESS MANAGER

As our church building nears its 20th anniversary next February, I want to share some observations on how well it is holding up. In many respects, this building has aged well, but a few areas need some attention.

**Pews:** After 19 years of use and nearly 2 years of COVID-19 disinfection spray, the finish on the top rails of many of our pews has worn away to the bare wood. Since Fr. Nick is a skillful carpenter, he is testing some wood stain and varnish products on the pews in the southeast corner of church. Once he finds the right combination, we will ask volunteers to join us for an afternoon or two of pew refinishing. Watch for an invitation soon.

Lighting in the ceiling: We have some light fixtures that are not working in church, including a few in the vaulted ceiling and several in the low ceiling on the north (right) side. Changing light bulbs in the church is not an easy task. Most of the fixtures cannot be reached with an ordinary ladder. Although we have a hydraulic lift, it is difficult to use when a light fixture is located over a row of pews. There are also a few fixtures with defective sockets that need to be repaired. I am in contact with a licensed electrician to repair the defective light fixtures and assist us with replacing our bulbs that are burned out. I expect to complete this project in August.

**Video projectors:** We use projectors to display the Scripture readings and hymn lyrics during Mass. The projector on the south (left) side of church is older than the one on the north (right) side. The south projector is a little dimmer, and the resolution is not as sharp as the north projector. We plan to replace the south projector before September.

**Roof:** The hailstorm on March 14, 2024, damaged all of the roof surfaces on our campus. Under the terms of our insurance policy, the asphalt shingles on our church roof will be replaced, and the flat roof sections will be resurfaced. After those repairs are completed, we will replace the ceiling tiles that have old water stains on them.

Thanks for your patience as we work on these challenges. Stay tuned for more observations in next week's bulletin.
